WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911," that the Governor may abolish any Health District constituted by the Governor under the said Act: And whereas it is desired to abolish the Health District which was so constituted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby abolish the Upper Blackwood Health District.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the cancellation of Regulation 29 of the State Trading Concerns Act, and in lieu thereof to approve of the following:—

- 29. (a) The Revenue Receipts of any Trading Concern for any financial year may be used for the Working Expenses of the said financial year, but shall not be used for Capital Expenditure.

(c) The Colonial Treasurer, if he approves of such Overdraft, shall state the rate of Interest to be charged to the Trading Concern, such Interest to be calculated on the daily debit Balance appearing in the Banking Account of such Trading Concern in the Treasury Books.

#### PILOTAGE CHARGES.

Ordinance 37 Victoria, No. 14.

is notified that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the amendment of Pilotage Charges under the Port Regulations, with

both inward and outward pilotage. The minimum charge shall be £4 and the maximum £16.

2. Vessels using the waters of King George Sound only shall pay a fixed sum of £5, to cover Pilotage both inward and outward.

Removals in Princess Royal Harbour, Bunbury, or Geraldton, shall be as follows

Vessels 1,000 tons and under net register, £2 each removal.

Vessels over 1,000 tons net register, £3 each removal.

Pilotage charges at Wyndham shall be at the rate of fourpence per ton on the net registered tonnage of each vessel, to cover both inward and outward pilotage. The minimum charge shall be £20 and the maximum £40.

The Pilotage Charges prescribed in the Order in Council dated the 8th January, 1919, are hereby repealed.
