Rules of the Dental Board.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Dental Act, 1894" and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," 1894." and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," the Dental Board may make rules and may amend, repeal and add to any such rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth hereby amend the rules made under the said Act by deleting rules numbered 26 and 30, and making the following to stand in lieu thereof:— Rule 26. The Certificates, Diplomas, or Degrees pre-scribed by the Board under Section 10, patagraph (d) of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," are the following viz :—

or Diplomas by examination. Rule 30. (a.) A registered apprentice, upon present-ing himself for his final examination, shall be entitled to be examined under the syllabus in force at the time of the registration of his articles, provided he presents bimself within two wears of the completion of his himself within two years of the completion of his articles.

(b.) A registered apprentice shall be entitled to be examined in the subjects comprising Group 1 of the examination prescribed in Rule 25, after the expiry of eighteen months from the registration of his articles; in which case one-third of the examination fee, viz., £2 2s. shall be payable under the first Group, and the remaining two-thirds of the examination fee, viz., £4 4s., shall be payable under the second Group. Advertising Hoardings, etc.

Interpretation Clause.

- (1.) In the construction of this By-law—
 (a) The word "hoarding" shall mean a hoarding erected on private property for advertising purposes. (b) The word "occupier" shall mean the person

 - (b) The word "overaginal shart mean the person having the use and control of a hoarding.
 (c) The word "owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which a hoarding is erected.
 (d) "Building Surveyor" shall mean the Building Surveyor for the time being of the Perth Perth Road Board,
 - (e) The word "Advertisement" shall mean and include papers, bills, or posters and all other advertisements of any nature, stencilled, painted, or embossed and affixed or placed in any way on walls, fences, or windows.

(2.) No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding unless and until a plan and specification, showing clearly the position and size and the method of and the materials to be used in the construction of, and the manner of fixing same, shall have been deposited with and approved by the Building Surveyor, and except in accordance with such plan and specification, and a li-cense in the form of Part I. of the Schedule attached (3.) No license shall be granted in respect of any

hoarding erected either before or after the passage of this By-law, unless the distance from the face of the hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding (provided that in no case shall the height of such hoarding ing exceed twenty-one feet. The top of the hoarding shall be finished level and, save as provided in the suc-ceeding section, in a straight line. The name of the owner of the hoarding may, however, be fixed immedi-ately on top of the hoarding near the centre of the levelb) length).

(4.) Every person erecting a hoarding, or the occupier or owner of a hoarding already erected at the corner of two streets, shall cause such hoarding to be rounded off or splayed off to its full height, as may be required by the Building Surveyor.

(5.) No person shall make any alteration or addition to any hoarding, unless and until the proposed al-teration or addition shall have been approved in writing by the Building Surveyor.

(6.) If any hoarding is at any time, in the opinion of the Building Surveyor, in a dangerous or neglected con-dition, and the owner or occupier shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to remove or refix the same to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor, the Road Board may remove the same and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.

(7.) The occupier of a hoarding shall maintain such hoarding to the satisfaction in all things of the Building Surveyor, and if any paper or other material affixed thereto becomes detached shall forthwith remove and

(8.) If in the opinion of the Road Board any bill,placard, or advertisement attached to or painted on any hoarding be objectionable, and the occupier or owner shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to at once remove or cause to be removed such bill,

placard, or advertisement, the Building Surveyor or other person or persons authorised by the Road Board may remove the same and recover the cost of such removal from the occupier or owner.

(9.) All notices required under this By-law to be be given by the Road Board to the occupier, but if he cannot be found then any such notice may be served upon the owner.

(10.) If the occupier or owner of any hoarding fails to comply with a written order of the Road Board within the time named in such order, the Building Surveyor or other person or persons authorised by the Road Board may carry out the requirements of the said order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Road Board from the occupier or from the owner.

(11.) No person shall attach, paste, or paint any bill or other form of advertisement upon any hoarding in any part of the Road Board District without having a rou the Building Surveyor in the form of Part II. of the Schedule hereto attached.

(12.) Every license issued by the Surveyor under Sections 2 and 11 of this By-law shall terminate on the 30th day of June of each year.

(13.) The fee for a license under Section 2 shall be sixpence per superficial yard per annum. The fee pay-able for a monthly license under Section 11 of this Bylaw shall be seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.), and the fee payable for a yearly license under Section 11 shall be Four pounds (\pounds 4). Full fees shall be charged for all licenses issued before the 31st day of December in each year, but for all licenses, other than monthly licenses, issued between the first day of January and be charged, provided that in no case shall the charge

be less than ten shillings (10s.). (14.) Every hoarding shall at all times have the name of the occupier clearly shown in a conspicuous place on the front of the hoarding.

(15.) No person shall post, paint, stencil, place, or affix any advertisement on any fence, wall, footpath, or on any fence or wall, window or other portion of any building facing or abutting on any street or way or public place within the Road Board District.

(16.) The Road Board may permit the display of advertisements at theatres or other places of public amusement, and may permit the advertising of meetings or objects of national or general importance, under such terms and conditions as the Road Board may in each ease decide.

(17.) Applications for such permission shall be made in the form specified in Part III, of the Schedule hereto attached.

(18.) Any permission granted by the Road Board hereunder may be in the form specified in Part IV. of

the said Schedule. (19.) The provisions of Section 15 of this By-law shall not apply to bills or advertisements posted on or affixed to signboards to the erection or maintenance of which the Road Board has consented, or to the advertisement by the occupier of any shop or dwelling on the windows thereof in respect of the business carried on by him therein, or to advertisements as allowed for and provided by the standard verandah specifications. (20.) The use of any advertisement within the Road

Board District, otherwise than in accordance with this By-law, is hereby prohibited. (21.) The occupier or owner of any premises within

the Road Board District on the walls, windows, or fences of which any bills are posted or any advertisements are painted, stencilled, placed, or fixed contrary to the pro-visions of this By-law shall, on receiving written notice from the Road Board so to do, remove the same, and if the same are not removed within seven days from the giving of such notice then the Board may by its officers remove the same and recover from the owner or occupier in a court of summary jurisdiction the cost of so doing.

Penalties for breaches of By-laws.

(22.) Where anything in this By-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law; and every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence, besides any

costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such of fence, to a penalty of Ten shillings (10s.) for the first breach of this by-law and to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every succeeding breach of such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds $(\pounds 2)$ for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be biable to pay to the Road Board any expense incurred by the Road Board in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any by-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so executed.
