WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Fisheries Act, 1905," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1911, the waters of the Normalup Inlet and the Franklin River with its tributaries were closed against fishing generally and by every means of capture, except by fishing lines, not being long lines or bultows: And whereas it is desirable to temporarily suspend the operation of the said Proclamation so far as it applies to those portions of the said waters hereinafter described: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers enabling me in this behalf, temporarily suspend until the 31st day of May, 1920, the operation of the said Proclamation as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1911, so far as it relates to the waters of the Normalup Inlet except the whole of the waters of the channel entrance to the Normalup Inlet within a radius of half a mile of the bar, and the whole of the waters of the Deep River, the Walpole River, and the Franklin River, which flow into the Normalup Inlet, all of which water so excepted shall continue subject to the said Proclamation: Provided that the set nets shall in no part have meshes of less than 2¼ inches measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact; and that it shall not be lawful to use in such waters so exempted temporarily from the operation of the said Proclamation any set net with meshes of a less measurement than 2¼ inches.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 (1) (xiii.) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter the boundary of any Road District or Ward and transfer portion thereof to another Road District or Ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the respective boundaries of the Murchison and Meekatharra Road Districts, by transferring from the former to the latter all that territory comprised and prescribed in the Schedule hereto: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards so concerned, in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator on behalf of His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 8 (1) (xiii.) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby alter the respective boundaries of the Murchison and Meekatharra Road Districts, by transferring from the Murchison to the Meekatharra Road District all that territory described and comprised in the Schedule hereto.

This Order shall come into force as from the 31st day of March, 1920.

The adjustment of rates from the territory in question to be that the rate for the current financial year as levied by the Murchison Road Board shall be collected and retained by them up to and including the 30th day of June, 1920.

*The Road Districts Act, 1919.*

*Building By-laws.*

THE Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the power conferred on them by Building Regulation No. 37 of the Second Schedule of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following additional By-laws to apply to those parts of the Perth Road Board District enumerated and described in a certain Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd day of June, 1917, page 990 (whereby the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act were extended to such parts of the said Perth Road District).

By-law No. 1a.

A sum of £5 (five pounds) is to accompany such notice (as per By-law No. 1), amount to be held by the Road Board as security for any damage that the building operations may cause to the footpaths or other property of the Road Board. The said sum (£5) five pounds will be returned to the builder on the certificate of the Building Surveyor that the footpaths or other property of the Board have been properly re-instated.

By-law No. 18.

*Standard Verandah.*

(1.) No person shall erect any verandah over any public footway within the limits of the Maylands, Lawley, or Peninsula Wards of the Perth Road District, without having first obtained the consent of the Road Board, to be signified by the issue of a license in the form of Schedule "A" hereto.

(2.) Any person desiring to obtain the consent of the Road Board to the erection of such verandah shall deposit with the Building Surveyor a plan, elevation, section, and specification, showing in detail the proposed construction of such verandah, and the manner in which it is proposed to secure it to the building to which it is proposed to be attached.

(3.) No such verandah shall hereafter be erected except in accordance with the standard plan settled and approved by the Road Board and deposited in the office of the Road Board. Provided that the strength of the materials to be used in the construction thereof may, subject to the approval of the Building Surveyor, be varied according to circumstances.

(4.) The minimum height of any verandah hereafter erected shall be eleven feet from the top of the kerb to the underside of the signboard. In the case of sloping ground the height shall be measured at the centre of the frontage. Provided that if the frontage shall exceed 20 feet a break shall be made if so directed by the Building Surveyor.

(5.) All verandahs in a street shall be erected of a uniform height and width, subject to the last preceding section. The standard height and width of verandahs in each street shall be fixed by the Road Board.

(6.) The roof of every such verandah shall be covered with:—

- (a) Corrugated galvanised iron or other approved materials.
- (b) Gutters shall be galvanised iron with sufficient capacity and proper fall to outlet.
- (c) Down pipes, elbows, bends, connections and other fittings shall be of galvanised iron to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.
- (d) The lower length of down pipes shall for the last six feet and the pipe under the footpath be of cast or wrought iron.
- (e) All galvanised iron shall be of 24" gauge unless otherwise specifically approved by the Board.

(7.) The signboard shall be constructed of such materials, sections, and workmanship as, in the opinion of the Surveyor, are of sufficient strength in the particular case, and shall be covered with 24 gauge galvanised flat iron, riveted and soldered at all joints, and properly secured to the framework, and surrounded with a suitable margin.

(8.) Whenever a proposed verandah will abut on to an existing verandah, it shall be so finished as to prevent rain from falling between such verandahs. Provided that when the existing verandah is shorter than the frontage of the building to which it is attached, the person erecting the new verandah shall make the necessary extension to the existing one.

(9.) Whenever the end of a verandah abuts on to a right-of-way, street, or public place, the signboard shall be returned along such end, and the space between the signboard and the roof of the verandah shall be filled to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

(10.) No writing, printing, or trade notice of any description shall be exhibited on any portion of the verandah except on the outer face of the signboard.

(11.) The footway under every verandah shall be kerbed and paved, and the owner shall pay to the Road Board one-half of the cost of such kerbing and paving, and the whole of the cost of paving any door approaches.

(2.) The whole of the work, including the underside of the roof iron and gutters, shall be painted with two coats of lead and oil colours, in tints approved by the Building Surveyor.

(3.) The writing on the signboard, and the colours used therein, must be approved by the Building Surveyor.

(4.) If any of the above conditions be not complied with, or if at any time the Road Board shall consider it necessary in the interests of the public that the verandah shall be removed, then this license may be cancelled, and the owner, upon receipt of notice to that effect under the hand of the Chairman or Secretary, shall, within the period mentioned in such notice, remove the verandah, and in default of his so doing the Road Board may cause the same to be removed at his risk and expense.

## THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

*General Regulations, Forms, etc.*

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that the Governor may make Regulations for giving effect to the said Act and prescribing the forms for use under the said Act: Now therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers him in this behalf enabling, make and re-enact the regulations as amended hereunder, and prescribe the forms as in the Schedule hereinafter set forth, and such shall apply to and be carried out by all Road Boards throughout the State of Western Australia.

## REGULATIONS.

## Part I.

(To be administered by the Minister for Lands, *vide* Section 157 of the Act.)

1. (1.) Whenever an owner of rateable land subdivides the same into allotments for sale, the plan or diagram to be submitted to the Board under Section 155 shall exhibit distinctly delineated all roads, ways, passages, open spaces, and reserves and all permanent drains, and also all allotments into which the said land is to be divided, marked with distinct numbers, and shall also show the dimensions and areas of such allotments, the name of the estate if so required by the Board, the names of the roads and the width of the roads and ways, also any public street or road adjoining the land under survey.

(2.) The plan or diagram submitted for approval to the Board shall be in accordance with Part V. of the Rules and Directions to be observed by Licensed Surveyors practising under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893."

One copy must be on strong paper of a recognised standard size of 40 inches by 27 inches for plans, and 16½ inches by 12 inches for diagrams, with sufficient space left for binding, to be marked "Original," with particulars of title, and place assigned for name of Road District, signature of Secretary, and the date of resolution approving of subdivision; such copy, if approved, will be returned to person submitting same for lodgment at Titles Office.

One copy must be on tracing cloth of similar size and description marked "Duplicate," to be retained by Board and preserved in their records in a book or file kept for that purpose by the Secretary.

Each plan shall contain the name (if any) proposed to be assigned to the Estate with particulars of Certificate of Title, also the names of roads.

Such names of estate, roads and other particulars shall be taken to be part of the plan of the subdivision and subject to these regulations.

(3.) The Board may affix such conditions to the granting of the approval as it may think fit and particularly for any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Regulating the width and lay out of roads and ways so that they may be formed, graded, drained and used to the best advantage; to round off or truncate corners.
- (b) Regulating the frontage, depth, and area of allotments.
- (c) Providing drainage reserves.
- (d) Prohibiting the subdivision of swamps and low-lying land for residential purposes.
- (e) Altering the name of the estate.
- (f) Providing for open spaces, the total areas of which shall not, without the consent of the owner, exceed five per cent. of the whole area subdivided.
- (g) Securing any other alteration that the Board may consider necessary for public convenience and health, present and prospective.

(4.) Any person may, under and subject to Subsection (8) of Section 155, appeal to the Minister against a refusal of a Board to approve of a plan or diagram, or the conditions of approval thereof, or a refusal to approve of a transfer, conveyance, or lease of a portion of an allotment on any plan or diagram of subdivision registered in the Office of Titles, or portion of a Crown Grant certificate of title or conveyance containing less than half an acre in area.

(5.) An appeal to the Minister shall be accompanied by the original plan objected to by Board without any alteration or amendment, together with a third copy of plan in every way similar to duplicate and marked "Triplicate" for retention by Minister.

(6.) An approved plan or diagram, or any allotment thereon, shall not be further subdivided or altered without the consent of the Board, and no person shall, without such consent, sell, transfer, buy, or acquire a portion only of any allotment on the said plan or diagram.

(7.) Any person desirous of having any alteration whatsoever to any plan shall apply in writing to the Board, who will cause any alterations which they may approve of to be entered in their minutes and endorsed on the plan and signed by the Secretary.

## Part II.

(To be administered by the Minister for Public Works and Trading Concerns.)

2. The several forms in the Schedule to the Regulations made under "The Roads Act, 1911," with the direction therein contained as published in the *Gazette* of 17th September, 1913, may be used for the purposes for which they are respectively applicable under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," subject to such alterations as are specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.

3. The rate books and other books used in the prescribed form under "The Roads Act, 1911," may be continued for such time as may be necessary and consistently to meet the requirements of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and these regulations and forms or for such time and with such modifications (if any) as the Minister may direct.

4. The rate book may, for the purpose of convenience, be in one or more volumes, and may contain other rates which the Board is or may hereafter be authorised to levy by any other statutes.

5. After a rate book has been made up and completed, the Secretary shall make a note thereof in the book indicating the date of completion and the rates for which the book is to serve and be made use of.

6. When, after the making of the general rates, it is deemed necessary to make any additional rate, or by virtue of Section 239 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," to extend any rates to apply to any additional land acquired by transfer or otherwise, the Board shall further make up and complete the rate book and insert the particulars of all rateable properties in such additional area acquired, for the purposes of such rate or extension, making such alterations and additions (if any) as shall be judged necessary, but without obliterating existing entries.

7. The Secretary shall thereupon make a note in the rate book indicating:—

- (a) The date of such further completion.
- (b) The additional rate (if any) for which the book so further completed.
- (c) The additional rate (if any) to which any rates are extended; and
- (d) The date of transfer of any such area to the district (as published in *Gazette*).

Provided that when such entries are completed each page containing the additional entries shall be initialed by the Chairman, who shall also sign the book at the last alteration in the manner prescribed by Section 230 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

8. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the columns numbered 16 to 33 and 16 to 26 (both inclusive) in the Forms Nos. 62 and 69 respectively, shall not be deemed portion of "The Rate Book" for the purposes of the said Act, but entries shall be made therein by the Secretary or any other person authorised by the Board in that behalf.

9. The time to be allowed to any person wishing to appeal against any such alteration, addition, or amendment, as is mentioned in Section 230 of the Act, shall be one month from the receipt of the notice mentioned in Subsection (5) of the said section subject to the provisions of Section 344.

10. A notice of appeal under Division V. of Part VI. of the said Act may be a general notice of appeal, and need not specify the particular entries appealed against; but all such entries as are affected by the decision on the appeal shall be altered so as to accord with such decision in manner prescribed by the Act.

11. Care is to be taken that, as far as practicable, entries concerning lands in different wards, towns, prescribed areas, or lands rated at different figures are not intermingled in the rate book, but are kept in distinct parts or volumes thereof.

12. All notices of the making up of rate books and of assessment shall be machine numbered and made out in duplicate, and one copy shall be retained by the Secretary of the Board, who shall make a note thereon of the date of the posting or other service of the notice.

13. A special book must be kept by all Boards containing particulars of:—

- (a) All lands in the district which have been exempted from rating to be confirmed by the Board and checked at the annual audit. *Vide* Form 85.
- (b) All property, plant, stores, etc., owned by the Board and disposal of same. *Vide* Form 84.
- (c) All securities and legal documents. *Vide* Form 83.

- (d) All receipt books, etc. *Vide* Form 86. Also a separate book for:—
  - (e) All permits granted for the erection of gates across roads (Form 48), including the conditions under which such permits were granted (Form 49); also
  - (f) A book or file must also be kept of all subdivisional plans dealt with by the Board.
14. Non-compliance with these regulations (Nos. 2 to 12) shall not render any acts or proceedings of the Board or any officer or member thereof void, but if the same would, apart from these regulations be valid, it shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing regulations, be taken to be a good and valid act or proceeding.
15. No books or documents, being the property of the Board, or under the control of the Board, shall be destroyed except under the provisions of Section 353 and after the following procedure has been complied with:—
- (a) Notice shall be given to each member of the Board at least seven days prior to an ordinary meeting of the intention to destroy.
  - (b) At the meeting a certificate from the Government Inspector shall be produced and read containing a complete record of all documents and books to be destroyed which shall then be entered in the Minute Book, and a definite resolution to be passed at such meeting.
  - (c) An order, signed by the Chairman, to destroy such books and documents to be issued to the Secretary.
16. The procedure for dealing with absentee voting shall be strictly in accordance with the provisions of

Section 86 of the Act and Forms Nos. 12 and 13, including the instructions issued for the guidance of Returning Officers.

17. (1.) In proceedings for possession or sale of land on which rates are in arrear, the Magistrate shall, as far as practicable, include in his inquiries, made pursuant to the rules in the Third Schedule to the Act, an investigation as to the various matters mentioned in Section 264 or 270 (as the case may be), such investigation to be carried down to the date of the inquiry and shall embody the result in his order.

(2.) The petition, notices, and warrant of possession may be in the forms set out in the Schedule to these regulations. (Forms Nos. 88 to 92.)

(3.) Forms 32, 33, 34, 35, and 36 in the Schedule to these regulations published in the *Gazette* on 17th September, 1913, are repealed.

18. The regulations published in the *Gazette* of 17th September, 1913, of similar intent are hereby superseded by these regulations so soon as approved by Order in Council and published in the *Gazette*.

19. These regulations may be cited as "The Road Districts Act Regulations, 1920."

HIS Excellency the Administrator has been pleased, on the advice of the Advisory Committee, to make the following amendments of the Food and Drug Regulations, 1913-15, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-18":—

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-18.

*Food and Drug Regulations, 1913-15, Amendment.*

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-18," His Excellency the Governor may make regulations, and may repeal, alter, or amend any regulations so made: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the advice of the Advisory Committee, doth hereby make the following amendments of the Food and Drug Regulations, 1913-15:—

Regulation 24 is hereby amended by adding an additional paragraph as follows:—

(14.) The word "milk" or any expression containing the word "milk" shall not be used on any label on, nor used in any description of, nor shall be in any way applied to any article sold as a beverage which is not milk, as standardised in these regulations.

Provided that diluted concentrated or condensed milk may be sold under their respective names if so diluted as to produce "normal milk."

This paragraph shall not apply to beverages sold under a name clearly indicating a mixture, such as "soda and milk," and "egg and milk," provided that the milk used therein is milk, as standardised in these regulations.

Regulation 54, paragraph 5, sub-paragraph 111, is hereby amended by striking out the words "forty parts per centum of proof spirit" in the fifth and sixth lines thereof, and substituting in lieu thereof the words "thirty-five parts per centum of proof spirit."
