WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation constitute and define the boundaries of any Water Reserve or Catchment Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may vest such Reserve or Catchment Area in the Minister: And whereas the Governor did by Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th day of August, 1915, constitute and define the area described in the Schedule annexed to the said Proclamation a Water Reserve and vested the said Reserve in the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage: And whereas it is desirable that the said Proclamation be repealed and a fresh Proclamation and Schedule be substituted therefor: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal the Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1915, and hereby constitute the area described in the Schedule hereto, with the boundaries as therein defined, a Water Reserve for the purposes of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," in substitution of the area proclaimed on the 28th day of July, 1915, and do hereby vest the said Water Reserve in the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.

The Schedule.

Commencing at the South-East corner of cancelled Pastoral Lease 877/93, and proceeding North-Westerly to the intersection of the North boundary of said cancelled lease and Road No. 1005; thence generally North-erly along the said road to its intersection with the North-East corner of Location 93; thence Easterly to the Perth-Albany Road; thence generally South-Easterly

along Perth-Albany Road to its intersection with the Western boundary of Canning Reservoir Watershed Reserve 5913, and along the said Western boundary of the Canning Watershed Reserve to the intersection with the surveyed boundary of the Serpentine River Water Reserve 16634, near Mt. Randall; thence generally South-Westerly and North-Westerly along the said surveyed boundary of the Serpentine River Water Reserve 16634 to a point situated about 68 chains South-West of the South-East corner of cancelled Pastoral Lease 877/93; thence North-Easterly to the point of commencement, as shown on Plan W.S., S., & D.D. No. 3626.

1. When demand shall have been duly made under Section 285 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Secretary shall forthwith prepare a special roll of the names of all persons who appear to be resident owners of rateable land within the meaning of Section 285.

2. The various forms mentioned in these By-laws shall be those approved of by Order in Council on the 8th July, and published in the *Government Gazette* 17th September, 1913.

3. The said roll shall be as prescribed by Form No. 40, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Road Board Office, within the usual office hours, not later than 10 days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll.

4. On or before the fifth day before the day appointed for the holding of the poll, any resident owner—

- (a) Whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered or sent through the post addressed to the Secretary, apply to have his name inserted therein, and shall give particulars of his claim.
- (b) Whose name has been inserted in the roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him may, in like manner, apply to the Secretary to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and shall give particulars of his claim.
- (c) Whose name appears in the roll, or who claims to have his name inserted in such roll, may, in like manner, object to the name of any other person appearing in such roll as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his name.

Any such claims or objections shall be as prescribed by Forms Nos. 4, 5, 6, and 7, or to the like effect, and any objection under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

5. (a) The Board shall hold an open Court to be called a Revision Court within the Road Board District, for the purpose of revising the Roll, and such revision shall take place before the day fixed for the holding of the poll at such time and place as the Chairman shall appoint, and the Chairman shall give notice of the holding of such court and the time and place thereof, by placing such notice on some building within the Road Board District, and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the District.

(b) The Court shall consist of the Chairman, or in his absence of a chairman appointed by the other members of the Court, and of not less than one-third of the members of the Board.

6. Every such Court may be adjourned, and if at

any time for half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding such Court, or adjourned Court, a sufficient number of members to form a Court is not present, the Chairman, or, in his absence, any member or the Secretary, shall adjourn the Court, but no such Court shall be adjourned beyond the day before the holding of the poll.

7. (a) The Secretary shall himself, or by some person on his behalf if he is prevented from so doing, attend the Revision Court, and produce to the Court the roll and lists of the persons who have sent in claims and who have been objected to.

(b) The Court may order, if required, that the valuer or valuers and all collectors of rates shall also attend the said Court, and produce all books, papers, and documents in their possession connected with their respective offices.

(c) The officers aforesaid shall answer, on oath or otherwise, all such questions as the Court may put to them touching any matters necessary to be ascertained for revising the roll.

8. (a) The Revision Court shall have authority to hear, receive, and examine evidence by summons under the hands of the Chairman, to require all persons as the Court may think fit to appear personally before such Court, at a time and place to be named in such summons, and to produce all books and papers in their possession or under their control as may appear necessary for the purpose of their examination.

(b) The Court shall have like powers for compelling the attendance of the witnesses summoned and their examination upon and taking of oaths and affirmations and their answering questions touching the premises as by any law in force for the time being is vested in justice exercising summary jurisdiction, and the Chairman may issue any summons at any time after he has appointed a time for holding the said Court.

9. The Revision Court shall in open Court determine as hereinafter provided upon the validity of all claims and objections, and every such determination shall be by the decision of the majority, and in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the Court.

10. (a) The Revision Court shall insert in the roll under the revision the name of every person who has claimed as aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Court to be entitled to be inserted therein for one or more votes according to the provision of the Act.

(b) Subject as hereinafter provided, the Court shall retain on the roll the names of all persons to whom no objection has been duly made with the number of votes unaltered.

(c) The Revision Court shall retain on the roll the name of every person who has been objected to by any person and the number of votes unaltered, unless the person so objecting appears by himself, or by some person duly authorised in writing on his behalf, in support of the objection, and proves the service of the requisite notices.

(d) When the name of any person inserted in the roll or the number of votes set against his name has been duly objected to and the person objected to appears by himself or by some one on his behalf in support of such objection, the Court shall require proof of so much qualification of the person objected to as is embraced in the grounds of objection and no more.

(e) In case the qualification of such person is not proved to the satisfaction of the Court, the Court shall expunge the name of such person from the roll or shall alter and correct the number of votes set against his name, as the case may require.

(f) The Court shall expunge from the roll the name of every person who is proved to be dead.

(g) The Court shall, by means of the rate-book valuation and return, correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to such Court to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or trade or occupation of any person who is included therein, or in respect of the local description of the rateable property, or the situation thereof or the rateable value thereof.

(h) But no person's name shall be inserted by the Court in the roll, or be expunged therefrom, unless notice has been given as hereinbefore required.

11. (1) The Chairman shall in open Court—
- Write initials against every name struck out or inserted as aforesaid, and against any part of the roll in which any mistake has been corrected, or omission supplied.
 - Initial every page of the roll so settled.
 - Cause to be written, at the foot or end of the roll, a certificate that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.
- (2) The Chairman and not less than two other members of the Board shall severally sign such certificate.
12. Any resident owner whose name appears on the special roll and—
- who intends to be absent from the District on the day of the election; or
 - resides more than five miles from a polling place; or
 - is prevented by illness or infirmity from attending a polling place,
- may at any time before the day appointed for the holding of the poll, apply personally, or in writing, to the Returning Officer for a postal voting paper. The Returning Officer shall thereupon supply the same and shall make a mark against the name of the said owner on the said roll.
- 12a. Voting papers shall be as prescribed by Form No. 41, and postal voting papers shall be as prescribed by Form 13.
13. Any person who has applied for and received a postal voting paper for the purpose of voting shall not be entitled to vote otherwise.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator in Council has approved of the attached By-laws of the West Kimberley Road Board, in accordance with the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the West Kimberley Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

- No teamsters, travellers, or packers shall be permitted to camp within fifty yards of Nobby's well, tank, or gate entrance, nor be permitted to use the enclosure for yarding or agistment purposes.
- No camel owners, drivers, or persons in charge shall allow any camel or camels to remain longer than

half-an-hour at Nobby's Well, nor at any well or public watering place (natural surface water included) for the purpose of watering or for any other purpose, nor be permitted to camp within three hundred yards of said watering places, nor be permitted to camp within one hundred yards of any road, nor be permitted to camp within three hundred yards of any gate on any road in the District, and shall be subject to the whole of the Camel By-laws as published in the *Government Gazette* under date the 18th August, 1916, and any amendments thereof.

Goats:—

3. (a) Every keeper of any goat or goats within the Townsite of Derby shall register with the Road Board his or her name as a keeper of goats, and shall register each goat kept, and shall at the time of registration pay the sum of sixpence for each goat so owned or kept within the Townsite boundaries, and shall place and keep on the neck of every goat so owned or kept a collar bearing disc with the registration number stamped thereon.

(b) No person shall suffer any goat or goats in his or her charge or apparent ownership to run loose within the Townsite without a keeper in constant attendance or the person in whose charge such goat or goats shall be at the time.

(c) Every person who shall offend against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds irrespective of and in addition to any other fine or damages for trespass to which the defendant shall be subject, and the Road Board may impound, sell, or destroy any such goat or goats which shall be permitted to run loose as aforesaid.

4. No person shall be permitted to deposit bottles, packing cases, or any description of rubbish on the marsh.

5. No person or persons shall be permitted to camp with team or teams or stock of any description for grazing purposes at Deep Well or Native Well, with the intention, by their so doing, of drawing water from these wells for the purposes of watering such team or teams or stock aforesaid. No travelling stock shall be permitted to water at Deep Well, Native Well, or Nobby's Well, nor be permitted to yard stock in any enclosures around these wells.

6. (a) Every owner or owners of any land abutting any footway that has been made in whole or in part, shall fence or re-fence that frontage of his, her, or their land abutting on the footpaths of the Town of Derby.

(b) Should the aforesaid owner or owners refuse or neglect to erect such fence after written notice, duly given by the Board, within a specified time stated therein in which to erect such fence, then the Board may proceed to carry out the work and recover the cost of so doing from the aforesaid owner or owners by plaint before any one or more Justices of the Peace.

7. Every person or persons committing any breach of these By-laws or any of them shall, upon conviction by any one or more Justices of the Peace, be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds where no other fine or penalty is provided.

The above By-laws were passed at a meeting of the West Kimberley Road Board, at a meeting held on the 11th day of November, 1919.
