HIS Excellency the Governor, by His Deputy, in Executive Council, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to alter Regulations Nos. 168 and 172 for the Guidance of Surveyors to the following::

168. (d) For the actual length of all new boundaries surveyed, and marked, 1s. 2d. per chain; also river boundaries, and 1s. 2d. for each tree referred to in

Clause 107

(e) For the actual length of all old boundaries or portions of old boundaries ranged and chained, 9d. per chain, when in the opinion of the Surveyor General it is considered necessary to range and chain these lines. Where, in the opinion of the Surveyor General, it is necessary to completely re-mark old boundaries, they may be paid for at the same rate as new ones.

(g) For tie lines, feature surveys, river, and all other traverses, 9d. per chain. For each marked tree on such surveys only, 2s. 9d., and for each post and cairn in lieu

of a tree (see Clause 99), 6s.
(i) For travelling from Perth, or the Surveyor's head-quarters, to the first block marked, and from block to block, if more than four miles apart, 3s. per mile. The distance in a direct line only will in each case be allowed. If a survey is in any way continuous or connected, no travelling allowance will be allowed.

(j) For roads, 1s. 3d. per chain when marked on one

side only, and 2s. 4d. per chain when marked on both sides in the same manner as other boundaries. By-laws relating to Reserve 17271 (Larsen Park). By-law No. 1.

The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset throughout the year.

By-law No. 2.

No person shall ride or drive over or upon the said Park, or any part thereof other than a carriage way, without the permission of the Trustees first obtained.

By-law No. 3.

No passenger vehicle plying as an omnibus, nor any vehicle, team, cart, or wagon used for carrying any goods, timber, bricks, stone, wood, iron, or merchandise of any kind, whether laden or not, nor any camel, packhorses, cattle, sheep, dogs, goats, or pigs shall be allowed to enter or pass through the Park.

## By-law No. 4.

No person shall in any way injure or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower within the Park.

By-law No. 5.

No person shall damage or disfigure the soil, turf, or any part of the Park or the paths thereof, nor interfere with any part of the fences, buildings, monuments, etc., thereof, or any ornamental water therein, or any birds or animals therein.

### By-law No. 6.

No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisances in the said Park.

By-law No. 7.

No person shall camp over night, or sleep during the day on the said Park.

By-law No. 8.

No person shall stick or mark any bills, placards, advertisements, or any document whatsoever, or cause such to be stuck or marked on any fence, wall, tree, building, monument, or anything within the Park.

By-law No. 9.

No person shall discharge any firearms or fireworks, or throw any stones or other missiles, or make a fire within the Park, without the previous consent of the Trustees.

By-law No. 10.

No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, or anything within the Park, without the previous consent of the Trustees.

By-law No. 11,

No racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise, or any game such as polo, which may be considered dangerous by the Trustees, shall be allowed within the Park except on such portion as may be hereafter set apart for the purpose.

By-law No. 12.

All the waste litter of picnics within the Park, whether caused by clubs, parties, societies, or persons, shall be collected and removed by the person or persons by whom it was caused prior to leaving the Park.

By-law No. 13.

No game of football, cricket, baseball, or any game of a like nature shall be allowed on any part of the Park.

By-law No. 14.

The Trustees may fix the day or days for any games or gymnastics to be permitted to take place within the Park, or may prohibit such games or gymnastics from taking place within the Park.

By-law No. 15.

No person shall suffer any horses, cattle, or any animal whatsoever to stray or depasture on the Park lands, except with the consent of the Trustees in writing.

By-law No. 16.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

#### ROCKINGHAM CEMETERY.

Bu-laws.

BY virtue of the powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees make the following By-laws and Regulations:-

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, are to be paid at the time when

- the applications are made or orders given.

  2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefor on prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of, the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (see Schedule B).
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent or Caretaker at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application and order therefor be handed in at the office in time to allow of at least six (6) working hours'

ontice being given as above.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule D, shall be furnished at the time of

- giving the order.
  5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Superintendent, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining a written approval of the Trustees thereto, and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in writing.
- Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters there-
- 7. Every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than three feet from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.
- 8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule B, or other satis-factory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.

- 9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.
- 10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for Burial. Such certificate or order shall at the latest be handed to the Superintendent or Caretaker upon the funeral entering the Cemetery.
- 11. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—Week-days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- 12. No burial shall be allowed to take place at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- 13. The time fixed for any burial shall be at the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.
- 14. At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.
- 15. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Superintendent or Caretaker by the Trustees from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.
- 16. No headstone, footstone, kerbing, monument, or any other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed, until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.
- 17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees or their officers such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 18. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.
- 19. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.
- 20. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-laws not being so removed, the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.
- 21. All materials required in the erection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance to the Cemetery, and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Superintendent or Caretaker shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
- 22. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.
- 23. That before any such exceptional case, as referred to in the last By-law, be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Colonial Secretary, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
- 24. No wooden fences, railings, crosses, etc., shall be allowed.
- 25. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Superintendent or Caretaker.

- 26. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Superintendent.
- 27. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent or Caretaker, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these Régulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent or Caretaker, shall be removable from the Cemetery.
- 28. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
  - (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or any other materials removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
  - (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
  - (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
  - (d) Work in all classes to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- 29. Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery, unless in the charge of some responsible person.
- 30. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 31. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any Rule, Regulation, or By-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 32. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 33. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 34. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule E; such licenses to be renewed annually.
- 35. Subject to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent or Caretaker shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.

  16A. Every person who engages in the trade of itinerant vendor or of hawker or of stall-keeper shall comply with the following conditions:—

  (a) He shall cause all food in his possession for sale usually consumed in the condition in which it is sold, to be protected from contamination by flies and dust by means of causes composed of class or fine meshed screens composed of glass or fine meshed wire gauze or other material approved by an inspector.
  - (b) He shall not permit any other person to handle or touch any food in his possession for sale.
    (c) He shall maintain his clothing and his person
  - at all times in a clean condition.
