### VETERINARY SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP.

Regulations.

1. A Veterinary Science Scholarship of the value of  $\pounds 175$  will, subject to the undermentioned conditions, be granted annually for at least four years, by the Government of Western Australia, and shall be payable in the following manner:—

(e) A special allowance of £15 in addition to the foregoing amounts will be made in the case of a student living away from home. The above-mentioned allowances will only be paid upon the candidate successfully passing each Annual Examination at the University he is attending for the Degree of Veterinary Science.

2. Subject to the approval of the Standing Committee of Agricultural Education, in conjunction with the Chief Inspector of Stock, Department of Agriculture, Perth, the Scholarship will be awarded to the candidate gaining the highest percentage of marks in the examinations for the Faculty of Science at the University of Western Australia; such examinations shall include the compulsory subjects necessary for admission to the Universities of the other States of the Commonwealth in the Faculty of Veterinary Science.

3. The selected candidate, immediately after obtaining his final degree, shall, if so required by the Public Service Commissioner, serve as a Veterinary Officer inthe Public Service of Western Australia for a period of at least two years, at a salary of £240 per annum, or any higher sum the Public Service Commissioner of the said State may, from time to time, determine. In the event of the candidate's services not being required in the aforesaid capacity, he shall actively and continuously practise his profession privately within the State of Western Australia for a period of not less than two years from the time of obtaining his Degree.

4. All candidates, when lodging their applications for permission to compete for the said Scholarship, shall furnish a certificate of having passed a satisfactory medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner.

5. The selected candidate shall enter into an agreement and bond with approved sureties, on a form to be prescribed, for the due performance of the conditions attached to the said Scholarship.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to appoint, under the provisions of the above Act, as trustees of the Ora Banda Cemetery— Reserve 14123—Messrs. H. Low, J. Gilliland, and F. Bathurst, vice Messrs. Wm. Bathurst, Wm. Reynolds, and S. Scotson, resigned, and also to approve of the following By-laws for the control and management of the said Cemetery.

### C. G. MORRIS. Under Secretary for Lands.

#### BY-LAWS.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Ora Banda, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:--

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule ''A,'' shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

All applications for interment shall be made at 3. least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

Before any interment is allowed the "Order for 5 burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or in-

accordan, or commuting any nuisance or trespass, or in-juring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any crection, commits an offence against these By-laws. 16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees;

than the renumeration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal. 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vanit, and in such case submitting plans and specifior vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifieations of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein. 19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall

exercise a general supervision and control over all mat-

exercise a general supervision and control over all mat-ters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery. 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and speci-fications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "B" in the Schedule. 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "B" in the Schedule. 22. Every "Grant" shall be achieved to "

B<sup>†,</sup> in the Schedule. 22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written ex-emption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent

of such grantee or assignee shall be produced. 25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monu-ment, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the ceme-tery must first obtain the written consent and approval

of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same. 29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall,

before commencing any work within the cemetery, de-posit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

satisfaction of the Trustees. 30. All materials reuired in the erection and com-pletion of any work shall, as far as possible, be pre-pared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemeterv.

No catacomb shall be allowed.

All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees 32.or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the super-vision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these Bylaws.

  33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

  (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately
  - (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
  - (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees. (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SURVEYORS.

Amendment of Regulations 168 to 172 inclusive. 228/11.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by His Deputy, in Executive Council, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to alter Regulations Nos. 168 and 172 for the Guidance of Surveyors to the following:---

168. (d) For the actual length of all new boundaries surveyed, and marked, 1s. 2d. per chain; also river boundaries, and 1s. 2d. for each tree referred to in Clause 107

(e) For the actual length of all old boundaries or portions of old boundaries ranged and chained, 9d. per chain, when in the opinion of the Surveyor General it is considered necessary to range and chain these lines. Where, in the opinion of the Surveyor General, it is necessary to completely re-mark old boundaries, they may be paid for at the same rate as new ones.

(g) For the lines, feature surveys, river, and all other traverses, 9d. per chain. For each marked tree on such surveys only, 2s. 9d., and for each post and cairn in lieu of a tree (see Clause 99), 6s.

(h) For trial lines run with theodolite and chain, 9d. per chain may be allowed when, in the opinion of the Surveyor General, it has been necessary to clear both the trial line and the permanent boundary; and 2d. per chain for the verification chainage referred to in Clause 50.

(i) For travelling from Perth, or the Surveyor's head-quarters, to the first block marked, and from block to block, if more than four miles apart, 3s. per mile. The distance in a direct line only will in each case be allowed. If a survey is in any way continuous or connected, no travelling allowance will be allowed.

(j) For roads, 1s. 3d. per chain when marked on one side only, and 2s. 4d. per chain when marked on both sides in the same manner as other boundaries. No charge will be allowed for secant or other distances necessary in setting off the posts and pegs on the opposite side of a road; payments for angle and mile posts will be made in accordance with subclause (f).

172. Town and suburban lots may be paid for by special arrangement, or at daily rates, but if no special terms are arranged, they will be paid for at the following rates:---

For each block not exceeding  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre—12s. 6d. For each block not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre—14s. 6d. For each block not exceeding 1 acre—£1 2s. 6d. For each block not exceeding 2 acres—£1 8s. 6d. For each block not exceeding 5 acres—£1 19s. 6d. Over 5 acres, 1s. 3d. per chain for the actual length of all new boundaries surveyed and marked. For each street corner truncated—5s.

All other rates to remain unaltered. New rates to operate from 1st April, 1920.
