Part I.—Sections 7, 8, 16, 22a, 30, and 46.

And whereas under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Fremantle Municipal Council, being the Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, doth hereby make the following By-law to stand as Section 35:-

(a) It shall not be at any less distance than 20 feet of any dwelling-house, nor nearer than 3 feet to any boundary fence unless built of brick or stone, nor less than 50 feet from the milking shed or milk room of any

(b) The walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick,

stone, wood, or galvanised iron.
(c) The roof shall be constructed of some impervious material.

(d) There shall be on all sides of the building between the wall and the roof a continuous clear space of at least six inches in height.

(e) The upper surface of the floor shall be raised and maintained at least three inches above the surface

of the surrounding ground.

(f) There shall be provided outside each such stable a receptacle for manure; such receptacle shall be con-

structed of brick faced with cement, or with other approved material; it shall be provided with a tight-fitting cover, and shall be emptied at least once weekly.

(g) All manure produced on the premises shall be collected daily and placed in the receptacle for manure.

(h) The stable shall be maintained in a cleanly condition, and shall be cleansed and disinfected when so ordered by an Inspector.
