Kojonup and Tambellup Road Districts.

Alteration of Boundaries by Transfer of Territory to Plantagenet District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1040/18.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section (8) (1) (xiii.) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom, and either constitute such portion a Road District or annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to alter the respective boundaries of the Kojonup, Tambellup, and Plantagenet Road Districts, by severing certain territory from the Kojonup and Tambellup Road Districts and annexing it to the Plantagenet Road District, in manner hereinafter appearing: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 8 (1) (xiii.) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of all other power enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby alter the respective boundaries of the Kojonup, Tambellup, and Plantagenet Road Districts, by severing from the Kojonup and Tambellup Road Districts and annexing to the Plantagenet Road Districts all that territory described and comprised in the Schedule hereto, and the territory so severed and annexed shall become and is hereby formed part of the North Ward of the Plantagenet Road District.

This Order in Council shall come into force as from the first day of July, 1920.

Dowerin and Ninghan Road Districts.

Alteration of Boundaries by Transfer of Territory to Constitute the Wyalcatchem Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2296/20.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 (1) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and either constitute such portion a Road District, or annex it to an existing Road District, and may divide a district into Wards: And whereas it is desirable to alter the respective boundaries of the Dowerin and Ninghan Road Districts by severing certain territory from the Dowerin and Ninghan Road Districts and constitute such territory a Road District under the name of the Wyalcatchem Road District and to divide the said Wyalcatchem Road District into five Wards in manner hereinafter appearing: And whereas due notice of the intention of the Governor in Executive Council to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned in the manner prescribed by the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 8 (1) of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of all other power enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby alter the respective boundaries of the Dowerin and Ninghan Road Districts by severing from the Dowerin and Ninghan Road Districts all that territory described and comprised in the Schedule A hereto, and the territory so severed shall constitute a new Road District under the name of the Wyalcatchem Road District: And doth hereby divide the said Wyalcatchem Road District into five Wards with the boundaries, the names, and the number of members described, assigned, and allotted in Schedule B hereto.

This Order in Council shall come into force as from the first day of July, 1920.
