WHEREAS by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 25th day of June, 1920, it is declared that Division 3 of Part IV. of "The Traffic Act, 1919" (relating to the width of tyres), shall apply to and be in force and effect in all districts within the State from and after the 1st day of July, 1920: And whereas it is desirable that as from such date the provisions of subsection (2) of section 36 of the said Act visions of subsection (2) of section 50 of the said Act shall apply: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 1st day of July, 1920, as the date from which no person shall sell or offer or exhibit for sale or import any new vehicle of the kinds specified in sub-

section (1) of section 36 of the said Act (that is to say, any cart, motor wagon, goods vehicle, or locomotive or traction engine) unless the correct weight of the vehicle is painted in some constituous part on the off-side thereof in white letters at least two inches in height on a black ground.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the 19th Janu-WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the 19th January, 1905, and 24th November, 1909, and made pursuant to Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor placed Reserves Nos. 8708 and 9576 (Williams Townsite) under the control of the Williams Road Board, as a Board of Management, with power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Williams District Road Board doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall have the meanings as stated :-

"District".—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Williams District Road Board.

"Chairman".—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
"Board"—The Williams District Road Board.

"Member" -A member of the Williams District Road Board. "Road"

-Any road as defined by "The Roads Act, 1911, " "Reserve" Any reserve or common under control

of the Board. shall include the plural, also a body corporate.

"Officer" shall mean any officer of the Board.
"Ranger" shall mean the Ranger appointed by the Board.

"Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of Board.

All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.

That with the exception of stock owned by bona fide travellers, travelling teamsters, or as packers, as hereinafter provided for, no person shall run or depas-ture stock of any description on the Common unless the owner of such stock is the holder of a license under these By-laws and prescribed fees are paid, except as hereinafter provided, and the following fees shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Williams Townsite and the Williams Road District only to have the right to a license to run stock upon the Common.

The scale of fees shall be as follows:-Steers over 6 menths-2s, 6d, per head per week. Heifers over 6 months—£1 per head per annum or portion of year. Dairy cows—10s. per head per annum or portion

of year.

Horses-3s. per head per week.

- Bona fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses and cattle on the Common for the space of three clear days free of charge. Should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 3s. per head per week or part of a week for all horses and cattle.
- 5. Travelling cattle and sheep waiting for railway trucks shall be allowed to run on the Common for two (2) clear days free of charge, and travelling cattle and sheep being unloaded from railway trucks shall be allowed to run on the Common two (2) days free of charge. If these times are exceeded a charge of five shillings per 100 for sheep and 6d. per head for cattle per day or part of a day will be made.
- 6. No license shall be granted to any person to depasture on the said Common at any one time a greater number of horses than five head, or cows a greater number than two head and two steers over the age of six months, two heifers and two calves under six months, the progeny of the above cows.
- 7. Any person or persons running stock on the Commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall pay commonage fees.
- 8. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the Common as heretofore provided to furnish the Secretary of the Board or Ranger of the Board with a list giving a correct description of all stock placed by them on the Common, within twelve hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 9. That all annual license fees shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July in each year, or on the date of issue of license, if applied for and issued during a current year, and the Secretary or Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 10. That no entire horse or bull over the age of six months (except by permission of the Board) shall be allowed on the Common, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these Bylaws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing and Impouding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

11. The Secretary of the Board shall decide upon which portion of the Common any licensed or travelling stock shall at any time depasture, and shall have power to travel such stock at any time from any portion of the Common to another portion of the same.

12. The Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any horse or cattle depasturing on the said Common under the provisions of these By-laws.

13. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, or packer within the meaning of these By-laws.

14. The Board prohibits the doing by unlicensed persons of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws; and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

15. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his license upon being required to do so by any constable or officer of the Board.

16. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £5, and £2 per day for each succeeding breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

17. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of Section 306 of 'The Mining Act, 1904,' His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend Regulation 200, by striking out all the words contained in the reading thereof and to substitute the following:—

200. The holder of any mining tenement shall not allow any of the detritus, dirt, sludge, refuse, garbage, or mine water from his tenement to become a nuisance or an inconvenience to the holder of any other mining.

Any water or sludge produced from or consequent on any mining operations and discharged from such mining tenement shall be deemed to be a nuisance or an inconvenience, if such water or sludge at the point of discharge holds in suspension or solution any earth or mineral or any earthy or mineral substance in the total proportion of more than eight hundred grains to one gallon. grains to one gallon.

Any breach of this Regulation shall render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### TRAFFIC ACT, 1919.

Amendment of and additional Regulations.

THE Regulations under "The Traffic Act, 1919," published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of

February, 1920, are hereby amended as follows:—
1. Paragraph (6) (b) of Regulation 22 is amended by omitting the word "motor."

(i) The instrument referred to in paragraph (g)

2. No person shall at any time by any disorderly or improper conduct disturb or interrupt any other person in the proper use of the premises or buildings, or any officer or person authorised by the Board in the execution of his duty.

# Dogs.

3. No person shall suffer or permit any dog to enter or remain on the premises.

### Indecency.

4. No person shall use any indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner on the premises.

#### Diseasc.

No person shall enter on the premises or use any of the buildings while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease.

# Defacing Walls, etc.

6. No person shall deface, by writing or otherwise, the wails or any other portion of the bath, sheds, or other buildings.

# Intoxication.

No person shall enter any of the bathing places while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

# Costume.

No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits of or abutting on the boundary of the Belmont Park Road Board District, without suitable bathing costume or clothing.

Horses.

9. No person shall bring or drive into or permit any horse to be in any public water adjoining any bathing place owned by or under the control of the Board.

Penalty.

10. Every person offending against the provisions of these By-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

# By-law No. 71.

Concession Fares.

If any person shall in any certificate for concession fares make any statement which is contrary to the fact, he shall, unless he proves that he has made such statement in ignorance and without any intention to defraud, be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

# By-law No. 72.

# Concession Season Tickets.

If any person shall in any application for a periodical ticket at less than the full rate make any statement which is contrary to the fact, he shall, unless he proves that he has made such statement in ignorance and without any intention to defraud, be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
