WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from-

- (a) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows :-

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of July, 1920, until the 30th day of September, 1920.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, constitute and define the boundaries of any Water Reserve or Catchment Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may vest such Reserve or Catchment Area in the Minister: Now thereof the Executive Council, do hereby constitute the area described in the Schedule hereto, with the boundaries as therein defined, a Water Reserve or Catchment Area for the purposes of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and do hereby vest the said Water Reserve or Catchment Area in the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Met. W.S. 431/20. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas the preliminary re-quirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely :-

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed Service Reservoir, Bickley Brook.

(a.) Arched reservoir wall constructed of concrete with by-wash, scour and outlet pipes, etc., complete.

(b.) About 2,730 feet of 21in. diameter water main, with valves, connections, and all necessary apparatus.

(c.) Post and wire fencing around site of reservoir. This Order in Council shall take effect from the 2nd day of June, 1920.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Coun-ell, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazby the Governor and published in the Government Gaz-ette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 13792, for Recreation at North Beach, should be placed under the control of the Perth Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-men-tioned Reserve under the control of the Perth Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower each Beard to make reneal or alter Walaws for the such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case \pounds 5 for any breach thereof, and \pounds 2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than \pounds 20 in the aggregate.

WHEREAS by "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, determine the maximum prices which may be charged for foodstuffs in any proclaimed area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, on the recommendation of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuff mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such foodstuff within the Metropolitan Area, in lieu of the price of such foodstuff stated in the Schedule to the Order in Council under the said Act published in the Government Gazette on the 14th day of May, 1920.

PORT REGULATIONS.

Pilotage Charges.

2854/19.HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the amendment of Pilotage Charges under the Port Regulations, with effect from the 1st August, 1920, as follows:-

1. Pilotage charges, except where otherwise pro-vided in the Regulations, shall be at the rate of Twopence per ton on the nett registered tonnage of each vessel, to cover both inward and outward pilotage. The minimum charge shall be £4 and the maximum £20.

Vessels using the waters of King George Sound 2 only shall pay a fixed sum of £5, to cover pilotage both inward and outward.

3. Removals in Princess Royal Harbour, Bunbury, or Geraldton, shall be as follows :-

Vessels 1,000 tons and under nett register-£2 each removal.

Vessels over 1,000 tons nett register-£3 each removal.

Pilotage charges at Wyndham shall be at the rate of Fourpence per ton on the nett registered tonnage of each vessel, to cover both inward and outward pilotage. The minimum charge shall be £20 and the maximum £50.

Jetty Regulations.

Colonial Secretary's Office,

2164/19. Perth, 2nd July, 1920. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following amended Regulations and the repeal of existing Regulations, with effect from the 1st August, 1920.

G. DIBDIN, Acting Under Secretary.

Berthing Dues, etc.

1. All vessels using the jetty shall pay berthing dues at the following rates, namely :-

For vessels exceeding 200 tons register, 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped; minimum 30s.

All vessels not exceeding 200 tons register, 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped; minimum 2s. 6d.

All lighters, 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped; minimum 2s. 6d.

Computation of Berthing Dues.

2. In the computation of berthing dues for cargo carrying vessels, the Wharfinger shall have the option of proceeding on a weight basis of 2,000 or 2,240 lbs. to the ton (according to trade usage) or a measurement basis of 40 cubic feet to the ton for the cargo in respect of which such dues are levied, except as follows :-

Timber, at per ton of 40 cubic feet.

1 bullock, cow, steer, heifer, or such like animal, 1 ton.

3 calves or foals, 1 ton.

15 sheep, pigs, goats, or such like, 1 ton.

Caneware-

Chairs, 8 to the ton.

Tables, 8 to the ton.

Lounges, 4 to the ton. Articles, N.O.E., 8 to the ton.

Hides (Raw), loose, 24 to the ton.

Hides (Raw), in bags, 8 bags to the ton. Skins, in bales, 4 bales to the ton.

Skins, in bundles, 8 bundles to the ton. Wool, in bales, 5 bales to the ton.

Wool, in pockets or bags, 10 pockets or bags to the ton.

Vessels after having discharged or taken in their cargo shall remove to any berth or anchorage pointed out by the Harbour Master or Officer in Charge.

All vessels lying alongside the jetty and transhipping cargo to or from lighters or other vessels shall pay the like berthing dues in respect thereof, as if the said cargo had been landed on or taken off the jetties in place of being taken from or placed in such lighters or vessels as aforesaid.

Payment of Wharfage Dues, etc.

3. All wharfage dues and handling or other charges incurred, payable in respect of cargo discharged or shipped, shall become payable to the Wharfinger on the discharge or shipment of the said cargo, and shall be paid to the Wharfinger on demand, and each bill of ading as shown on the manifest must be cleared by one payment. No inward cargo shall be delivered to the consignce or owner thereor, nor outward cargo to the vessel in which it is intended that same shall be shipped, until the written receipt of the Wharfinger shall have been presented to the consignee, or owner, or to the shipper or master of the vessel respectively, for the payment of all wharfage dues and charges as aforesaid in respect of such cargo; provided always, that it shall be competent, but not compulsory (in the case of outward cargo) for the Wharfinger to accept from the agent or the master a guarantee in writing that such dues shall be paid to him within 24 hours of the clearance of the vessel.

Wharfage Dues, Handling and Haulage Charges.

4. All goods landed from or shipped into any vessel shall, except where otherwise provided, pay wharfage dues, handling and haulage charges, as prescribed from time to time. Such wharfage dues, handling and haulage charges shall, except where otherwise provided, be levied on the measurement or weight (at the option of the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge) of the goods as declared on the ship's manifest.

Cargo for transhipment if landed on jetty shall pay full wharlage dues one way only, but if passed overside from one vessel to another for conveyance to destination, or temporarily, the wharfage dues shall be 1s. per ton; in both cases handling and haulage charges shall be payable as per rates shown for other cargo, according to the services rendered in each case.

Inward cargo shall not for any purpose whatever be deemed to be in the custody of the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge until the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook, or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge to receive the same.

Outward cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane, or hoisting hook, is inserted in the sling.

Inward Manifests to be supplied and certified to.

5. The master of every vessel arriving shall deliver at the office of the Wharfinger, prior to commencing to at the onice of the wharinger, prior to commencing to discharge cargo, a true, legible, and complete copy of the manifest of the said vessel, certified to by himself as being true and complete, and shall also furnish, within 48 hours, a certified statement of all alterations (if any) which may be made in such manifest by reason of re-measurement of goods included therein or otherwise.

Outward Manifests, etc.

6. The master of every vessel shall deliver at the office of the Wharinger, prior to the clearance of the ship in which outward cargo is shipped, a certified copy of manifest, giving true, legible, and complete particulars of such goods as will enable the amount of outward wharfage dues payable thereon to be readily computed.

7. No person shall enter on any wharf with goods for shipment without first delivering to the Wharfinger an outward cargo advice note as required by the department, containing true and full account, with gross measurements or weights of such goods then under his immediate control.

8. All outward cargo must be delivered into the shed at least four working hours prior to ship's advertised time of sailing.

9. No goods shall be landed or placed on any jetties without the written authority of the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge. Cargo discharged without such authority having been first obtained shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the department, nor shall the department be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to any such cargo from any cause whatsoever.

10. If it appears that goods are being landed and cannot, in the opinion of the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge, be removed in time to prevent a "block," the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge may give notice in writing to the masters or persons in charge of vessels, or lighters, from which goods are being discharged, to stop discharging cargo, and upon such notice being given no further cargo shall be discharged until such time as the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge may direct.

Responsibilities of the Department.

11. No goods for which receipts have not been given by the department shall be deemed, for any purpose, to be in the custody of the department as Wharfingers, nor shall the department be responsible for the safe custody, or for any loss or damage that may accrue to same in any manner whatsoever.

The department and the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge shall not be liable for any loss, damage, or injury whatsoever or howsoever occasioned to any goods stacked on the jetty for the convenience of owners, consignors or consignees, unless such loss, damage, or injury is proved to have been occasioned by the wilful misconduct of some officer or servant of the department.

Goods to be checked before Delivery.

12. No person shall remove any goods or luggage from any wharf or shed without first satisfying the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge of his right to do so; and shall, before removing same, sign for such goods or luggage to the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge.

Delay in Delivery of Goods.

13. The department will not be responsible for any claim arising from delay in the delivery of goods from any cause whatsoever.

Wrong Delivery.

14. The department will not be responsible for the wrong or non-delivery of goods which are erroneously or deficiently marked, or which have numerous old or imperfectly erased marks thereon.

Goods not to be Removed.

15. No person shall remove from one vessel to another, or from any part of the wharf to any other part thereof, any goods or luggage without the authority of the Wharfinger.

Goods not to be Handled in Wet Weather.

16. No goods shall be landed or shipped in wet weather without the permission, in writing, of the Wharfinger at the request of the master or agent of the discharging or loading vessel, but the giving of such permission shall not throw on the department any liability for damage to such goods caused by being so landed or shipped or handled in wet weather. The determination of the Wharfinger that the weather is wet shall be conclusive.

Responsibility in case of Fire, etc.

17. The department shall not be responsible for loss or damage to goods while in their custody, by fire, water used in extinguishing fire, or vermin.

Extra Charges.

18. The Wharfinger may make extra charges for handling packages over one ton in weight, or of an exceptional shape, or where extra labour is required or unusual risk is involved.

Cargo deposited on Wharf.

19. No ballast, stone, coal, coke, timber, sand, or other goods or other materials in bulk shall be deposited on any wharf or jetty without special permission, in writing, of the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge.

Department not bound to find Storage Accommodation.

20. The department shall not be bound to find storage room for any goods, either in any shed or on any jetty. After notification to the owners, shippers, or consignees of any goods, or to the vessel's agent, that room is not available for the storage of such goods within a shed, or that such goods are, owing to their character, not permitted by some authority other than the department to be stored in a shed, the department shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to the goods, by the elements or otherwise, during the time they remain on the department's premises.

Removal of Cargo.

21. The Wharfinger or Officer in Charge shall remove all cargo landed on the jetty to the goods shed or other convenient place as early as possible. Consignees shall take delivery of and remove their cargo from the goods shed or yard within three days of its being received in the goods shed or yard.

Storage Rates for Goods.

22. Should any goods be not removed from any jetty, shed, or yard within the time specified in these regulations, there shall (subject as hereinafter mentioned) be payable to the Wharfinger, as and by way of storage rent in respect thereof, the sum of one shilling (1s.) per ton for the first week, and for every subsequent week the sum of three-pence (3d.) per ton additional to the amount per ton payable for each immediately preceding week, *i.e.*, one shilling and three-pence (1s. 3d.) per ton for the second week, and one shilling and six-pence (1s. 6d.) per ton for the third week, and so on. For the purpose of this regulation a fraction of a ton shall be deemed to be a ton, and a part of a week shall be reckoned as one week. Provided that if the consignee or owner hands to the department an indemnity, in the form provided and approved by the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge, relieving the department from all liability, the storage charges on goods for which goodsshed accommodation is not provided, and which are not Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Wharfinger

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Wharfinger from removing or ordering the removal, as provided for in these Regulations, of any such goods at any time after the time hereinbefore appointed for their removal.

23. The Wharfinger shall (unless an agreement has been made by the consignee with him to the contrary) be at liberty to sell by public auction any goods which have been left on the premises of the department for a period exceeding six months, and out of the proceeds of such sale shall pay to the department all charges due, and the balance of such proceeds, after deducting any expenses incurred by such sale, shall be paid by the Wharfinger into the Trust Fund, and be refunded to the owner of the goods on demand.

Claims in respect of Cargo.

24. No claim will be entertained by the department in respect of goods landed, or alleged to be landed, unless such claim has been received by the Wharfinger, in writing, before the vessel (in case of sailing vessels) leaves the harbour, or in case of steamers, within four days of the steamer leaving the port, nor in respect of outward goods unless received by the Wharfinger within twenty-four (24) hours after the vessel in which it was intended to ship such goods leaves the port. Each claim must be rendered on the form recognised by the department, which form will be supplied on application.

Working Hours.

25. The working hours of the port shall be and include the hours from 8 a.m. till noon, and from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. on week-days other than Saturdays, and on Saturdays the hours from 8 a.m. till noon.

1235

26. The department will not be responsible for the condition of any goods received outside the working hours of the port.

27. The cost over and above the ordinary cost of day work, of all labour and supervision, etc., employed during any hours not being working hours as above defined, or on holidays, shall be paid for by the vessel in addition to the usual charges. The extra cost of lighting shed or berth to enable a vessel to work during any hours not being working hours, or on holidays as aforesaid, shall also be paid by the vessel.

28. A vessel desiring to work any hours, not being working hours as defined above, shall give to the Wharfinger or Officer in Charge two hours' notice, and on holidays twelve hours' notice, of her desire to do so.

29. The "department" means the Harbour and Light Department of the State Government, and all references to the department shall be taken to include the Crown.

Penalties.

30. When any person or persons, by the foregoing Regulations, or any of them, are required to do or perform any act or thing, and such act or thing remains undone, the Harbour Master or his representative may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expense against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

31. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these regulations shall, on conviction for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except where otherwise provided) the sum of £20 (42 Vict., No. 18).

By-Laws for the Registration of Temporary Habitations.

Interpretation:

- "Board," the Black Range Road Board.
- "District," the Black Range Road District.
- "Person" shall include the plural.
- "Owner," the person in occupation of any habitation.
- "Habitation," any house, room, shed, tent, boughshed or camp.
- No. 1.-These By-laws shall be known and cited as the Black Range District Habitation Bylaws
 - 2 The Board shall reserve the right to bring under these By-laws any habitation erected within the District, where the general system of annual rating is not deemed satisfactory.
 - 3. No person shall erect or continue to occupy any habitation under these By-laws, on any gold-mining, mineral, pastoral, or home-stead lease or any land to which he has no July, 1920, unless he obtain from the Board a registration certificate issued under these By-laws, setting out the number, location, and particulars of the habi-tation owned or occupied by him.
 - 4. All fees for annual registration of habitations under these By-laws shall commence on the 1st day of July in each financial year, and shall be paid at the office of the Board, or to the Board's authorised col-lector, between the 1st day of July and the 30th day of September in each financial year.

The annual registration fees, as set out under 5.these By-laws, shall be as follows:-

- That when any person shall erect a habitation between the 1st day of January and the 30th day of June in any year, he shall pay half-fees for that portion of the year.
- The Board shall have power to sell, remove, 6. or dispose of, in any way, any habitation upon which fees remain unpaid, but such setting out the intention of the Board, shall be attached for fourteen days to the entrance of the habitation.
- 7. Any person who fails to register any habitation occupied by him within the meaning of these By-laws shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than 5s. or more than £3.
