UNIFORM REGULATIONS.

27. All attendants and nurses, when permanently engaged (that is after the expiration of the first six months) will be provided with uniform clothing, which is to be considered the property of the Hospital.

It is to be worn at all times when the attendants and nurses are on duty, and at entertainments, dances, etc., and it is to be given up at the time of leaving the Hospital service unless special permission is given by the Superintendent for it to be taken away. In such cases payment will have to be made by attendants and nurses, as follows:—

Male Attendants.

For one month from issue 80 per cent., two months 60 per cent., three months 40 per cent., four months 20 per cent. of the cost.

Exclusive of water-proof coat.

Female Attendants.

For one month from issue 80 per cent., two months 60 per cent., three months 40 per cent., four months 20 per cent. of the cost.

Exclusive of water-proof coat.

28. The attendants' clothing will be made up for them. Nurses, however, will be supplied with material as stipulated below, to be made up by themselves, the pattern being subject to the Matron's approval.

29. Scale of uniforms allowed:—

Male Staff.

Head Attendant and Deputy Head Attendant:

One serge uniform every six months.

One uniform cap every three years.

One helmet every two years.

Attendants:

One blue uniform every six months.

One cap every three years.

One helmet every two years.

Attendants working outside will be allowed, in addition, corduroy trousers, at the discretion of the Superintendent.

Servants:

Three drill tunics, one vest, and two pairs trousers, every year.

Two white suits every six months (bakers and cooks).

Lodge-keeper:

One serge coat and vest every 12 months.

One helmet every two years.

One cap every three years.

Two pairs serge trousers every 12 months.

Hall Porter:

One serge coat and vest every 12 months.

Two pairs serge trousers every 12 months.

One cap every three years.

Female Staff.

Matron:

Four uniforms with three pairs cuffs and three collars every year.

Three caps every year.

Nurses:

14 yards print every six months with four pairs cuffs and collars.

18 yards apron calico per annum.

Two caps every year.

 One cloth cape when necessary.
