WHEREAS by a Crown Grant under "The Land Act, 1898" (registered in the Office of Land Titles in Volume 710, Folio 73) dated the 23rd May, 1919, Swan Location 1624 was granted to the person therein named, subject to the reservations to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tramways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing-paths, harbour or river improvement works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any

compensation in respect thereof, so that the land so resumed from such location should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such buildings, without compensation: And whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of Drainage: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforesaid the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant, was on the 1st day of September, 1920, resumed on behalf of His Majesty for the purpose of Drainage.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

In accordance with the provision of Section 15 of the Public Service Act, your Excellency approved of the appointment of two Commissioners to assist the Public Service Commissioner, and charged them with the duty of reclassifying and grading the officers, and also with the reorganisation of the Public Service.

Mr. C. A. Munt, Under Secretary for Works and Trading Concerns, was so appointed on the 7th April, 1920.

Mr. J. L. S. Miller, Assistant to the Under Secretary for Education, was appointed on the 19th April to deal with the reorganisation and reclassification of the Clerical and General Divisions, exclusive of officers engaged on accounts.

3. Redivide the Greenough Road District as amended into Wards with the boundaries and names, also numbers of members allotted, as described in Schedule "C" hereto.
