AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 8th day of September, 1920, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," it is provided that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, determine the maximum prices which may be charged for foodstuffs in any proclaimed area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, on the recommendation of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuff mentioned in the schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such foodstuff within the metropolitan area and other proclaimed areas.

THE SCHEDULE.

Butter, 1st Grade (Commerce Act), local and imported.

Within the Metropolitan Area and within all proclaimed Areas in which there is a Butter Factory:—

Wholesale, in bulk, 2s. 5d. per lb.; in pats, ½d. extra.

Cash or cash within seven days.

Retail, 2s. 9d. per pound, including pats; 1s. 4½d. per half-pound.

If not paid within seven days, a half-penny per lb. may be added.

Within all other proclaimed areas, the above-mentioned wholesale and retail prices, plus the actual cost of transportation from place of purchase to place of sale.
