WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against

the use of fishing nets as from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government until the 31st day of December, 1922, inclusive.

Schedule.

- (1.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the Quarries, or Channel, near Cape Natural-
- (2.) All that portion of Western Australian waters known as Yallingup Bay, starting from the point of high-water mark at the Rocky Point half-a-chain South of the mouth of Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter of a mile; thence North-Easterly to a point a quarter of a mile from the North-West corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence Easterly to the point of high-water mark on the foreshore, and back to the point of commencement.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewcrage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 728/20. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sew-crage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas it is further provided Drainage Works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

Extension of Main in Riversdale Road, Belmont Park Road Board, and City of Perth (Victoria Park Ward).

A four-inch diameter cast-iron water main along Riversdale Road from Lot 48, South-Westerly to and across the South-Western Railway; thence Northerly for a distance of four and a half chains to the boundary of the W.A. Asbestos Slate and Sheet Company's property. Total length, about seventeen and a half chains,

The main to be provided with valves, hydrants, and all other necessary apparatus as indicated in red on Plan W.S., S., and D.D. No. 3748.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 8th day of October, 1920.

The Land Act. 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 4949/20. WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," within the Say Section 45 of The Land Act, 1895, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter bylaws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 17544 for "Camping" at Hamersley R. Estuary should be placed under the control of the Phillips River Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Phillips River Road Board as a Board of Management Phillips River Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
