AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 16th day of November, 1920, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

*The Road Districts Act, 1919.**Dumbleyung Road Board.**Alteration of Wards.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 332/19.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council re-divide a Road District into Wards: And whereas it is desirable to re-divide the Dumbleyung Road District into Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby re-divide the Dumbleyung Road District into six Wards, with the boundaries and names

defined and allocated in Schedule "A" hereto; and doth hereby re-determine the number of members to be allotted as shown in Schedule "B."

SCHEDULE "A."

North Ward.

Bounded on the North by that portion of North boundary of Road District to intersection of Rabbit-proof Fence.

Bounded on the East by a line extending along the Rabbit-proof Fence, from the intersection of North boundary of Road District to the South-East corner of Location 6745.

Bounded on the South by a line starting from the South-East corner of Location 6745, and extending along the South boundary of same, the East boundary of Location 6758, the East and South boundaries of Locations 6759 and 6763; thence Westward along railway to the South-East corner of Location 8135, along South boundary of same, part of the East, and part of the South boundaries of Location 5916 an East, the South and West boundaries of Location 7733, part of the South boundary of Location 5914, the South boundary of Location 7732, part of the East boundary of Location 6720, the East boundary of Location 6721, the East, South-East, and South boundary of Location 6292, part of the East and South boundaries of Location 6710, the East and South boundaries of Location 5887, part of the East, and the South boundaries of Reserve No. 9852, an East, the South, and the West boundary of Dumbleyung Townsite, part of the East and the North boundaries of Location 3839, the North boundaries of Locations 5611, 5610, 5634, and 5633, part of the East and a South boundary of Location 2941, an East and the North boundaries of Location 2806, the North boundary of Location 5910, the North boundaries of Reserve No. 6001 and Location 2912, part of the East and North boundaries of Nipperung Townsite, to the West boundary of Road District.

Bounded on the West by that portion of West boundary of Road District to starting point.

South Ward.

Bounded on the North by the South boundary of the North Ward.

Bounded on the East by the Rabbit-proof Fence, from the North-East corner of Location 6743 to South boundary of Road District.

Bounded on the South by that portion of South boundary of Road District.

Bounded on the West by that portion of West boundary of Road District.

Dumbleyung Ward.

The boundaries of this Ward comprise the whole of the Dumbleyung Townsite.

North-East Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by portion of the District boundary, from its intersection with the West boundary of Williams Location 8458 to the intersection of the production North of the East boundary of Location 10814.

Bounded on the Eastward by a line commencing at the aforesaid intersection and extending South to and along the East boundaries of Locations 10814, 10815, and 10797 to the Northern side of the Dumbleyung-Lake Grace Railway Reserve.

Bounded on the Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending Westerly along the Northern side of the said Railway Reserve to the East boundary of the Taran Roek Townsite Reserve, and along part of the East, the North, and part of the West boundaries of the said Townsite Reserve to the Northern side of the Railway Reserve, and along the said Railway Reserve, part of the Northern and Western boundaries of Location 10695; again along the Northern boundary of the Railway Reserve, an East, the North, and the West boundaries of the Duggan Townsite Reserve, part of the North, a North-East and North boundaries of Location 9648; East and South boundaries of Location 9647, the West boundary of Location 10750, the North-West boundaries of Locations 10751 and 10753, the North and part of the West boundaries of Location 10754, the North and West boundaries of Location 10756, the South boundaries of Locations 9970 and 9971, and the production West thereof to the Northern side of the Railway Reserve; thence along part of the Northern side of the Railway Reserve, part of the East and the North boundaries of Location 11917, the North and West boundaries of Location 8767, part of the North and part of the West boundaries of Location 8410, the North boundary of Location 8411, part of the East and North boundaries of Location 10519, the North boundary of Location 7793, part of the East boundary of Location 8285, the East and North boundaries of Location 10518, the North boundary of Location 8284, the East and North boundaries of Location 10518, the North boundary of Location 8284, part of the East and the North boundaries of Location 7113, the North and part of the West boundaries of Location 7108 and the North boundary of Location 6699 to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the North Ward.

Bounded on the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the North Ward from the last-mentioned point to the starting point.

South-East Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by the Southern boundary of the North-East Ward.

Bounded on the Eastward by the prolongation South of the East boundary of Location 10797 to the North boundary of Location 11072, part of the North and the West boundaries of Location 11072 and the latter's production Southward to the North boundary of Location 9738, part of the North and the West boundaries of Location 9738, part of the North and the West boundaries of Location 9737, and the production South of the latter boundary to the North boundary of Location 8871, part of the North boundary of Location 8871, the North, the West, and the South boundaries of Location 8374, part of the West and part of the South boundaries of Location 8871 to the production North of the West boundary of Location 8199, along said production and said West boundary, and the continuation South thereof to the North boundary of Location 11099, part of the North and the East boundaries of Location 11099, the East boundary of Location 11014, and its prolongation South to its intersection with the Southern boundary of the District.

Bounded on the Southward by part of the Southern boundary of the District, from the last-mentioned point to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of the South Ward.

Bounded on the Westward by the Eastern boundary of the South Ward and portion of the Eastern boundary of the North Ward to the starting point.

Lake Grace Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the Northern boundary of the District, from the Eastern boundary of the North-East Ward to the Eastern boundary of the District.

Bounded on the Eastward by the Eastern boundary of the District.

Bounded on the Southward by part of the Southern boundary of the District to the Eastern boundary of the South-East Ward.

Bounded on the Westward by the Eastern boundaries of the South-East and North-East Wards.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," of the following amendments of the Regulations applying to survey fees as published in the *Government Gazette* of 27th August, 1920:—
Clause 5 to read:

The cost of survey of land selected under Part VIII. of "The Land Act, 1898" (Homestead Farm), with interest, shall be payable by instalments as set out in the fifth and sixth schedules hereto.

Schedule 2.—In the note under Schedule 2 the following words to be added:—

"In cases where the area of the Homestead Farm exceeds the area of the other holding, the survey fee for the whole block is charged against the Homestead Farm, in accordance with the scale set out in Schedule 6.

*By-law No. 41.**Advertising Hoardings, Posting Bills, Painting Advertisements.*

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Wagin doth hereby make the following By-law:—

Interpretation Clause.

1. In the construction of this By-law:—
 - (a.) The word "hoarding" shall mean a hoarding erected on private property for advertising purposes.
 - (b.) The word "occupier" shall mean the person having the use and control of a hoarding.
 - (c.) The word "owner" shall mean the owner of the land on which a hoarding is erected.
 - (d.) "Town Clerk" shall mean the Town Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of Wagin.
 - (e.) The word "Council" shall mean the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Wagin.
 - (f.) The word "Municipality" shall mean the Municipal District of the Municipality of Wagin.
 - (g.) The word "advertisement" shall mean and include papers, bills, or posters, and all other advertisements of any nature, stencilled, painted, or embossed and affixed or placed in any way on walls, fences, or windows.
2. No person shall erect or cause to be erected a hoarding unless and until a plan and specifications, showing clearly the position and size and the method of and the materials to be used in the construction of, and the manner of fixing same, shall have been deposited with and approved by the Town Clerk, and except in accordance with such plan and specifications, and a license in the form of Part 1 of the Schedule attached hereto has been issued by the Town Clerk.
3. No license shall be granted in respect of any hoarding erected either before or after the passing of this By-law, unless the distance from the face of the

hoarding to the alignment of the nearest street or way shall be at least equal to the distance from the level of such street or way to the highest point of such hoarding, provided that in no case shall the height of any hoarding exceed twenty-one feet. The top of the hoarding shall be finished level and, save as provided in the succeeding section, in a straight line. The name of the owner of the hoarding may, however, be fixed immediately on top of the hoarding near the centre of the length.

4. Every person erecting a hoarding, or the occupier or owner of a hoarding already erected at the corner of two streets, shall cause such hoarding to be rounded off or splayed off to its full height, as may be required by the Town Clerk.

5. No person shall make any alteration or addition to any hoarding unless and until the proposed alteration or addition shall have been approved in writing by the Town Clerk.

6. If any hoarding is at any time, in the opinion of the Town Clerk, in a dangerous or neglected condition, and the owner or occupier shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to forthwith remove or refix the same to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk, the Council may remove the same and recover the cost or so doing from the owner or occupier.

7. The occupier of a hoarding shall maintain such hoarding to the satisfaction in all things of the Town Clerk, and if any paper or other material affixed thereto becomes detached shall forthwith remove and clear away such paper or other material.

8. If in the opinion of the Council any bill, placard, or advertisement attached to or painted on any hoarding be objectionable, and the owner or occupier shall upon receipt of a written notice to that effect fail to at once remove or cause to be removed such bill, placard, or advertisement, the Town Clerk or other person or persons authorised by the Council may remove the same and recover the cost of such removal from the occupier or owner.

9. All notices required under this By-law to be served on the owner or occupier shall, in the first place, be given by the Council to the occupier but if he cannot be found, then any such notice may be served upon the owner.

10. If the occupier or owner of any hoarding fails to comply with a written order of the Council within the time named in such order, the Town Clerk or other person or persons authorised by the Council may carry out the requirements of the said order, and any costs incurred may be recovered by the Council from the occupier or from the owner.

11. No person shall attach, paste, or paint any bill or other form of advertisement upon any hoarding, in any part of the municipality, without having a valid and subsisting monthly or yearly license therefor from the Town Clerk, in the form of Part 2 of the Schedule hereto attached.

12. Every license issued by the Town Clerk under Sections 2 and 11 of this By-law shall terminate on the 31st day of October in each year.

13. The fee for a license under Section 2 shall be sixpence per superficial yard per annum. The fee payable for a monthly license under Section 11 of this By-law shall be seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.), and the fee payable for a yearly license under Section 11 shall be four pounds (£4). Full fees shall be charged for all licenses issued before the thirteenth day of April in each year, but for all licenses, other than monthly licenses, issued between the first day of May and the thirty-first day of October in each year, half fees shall be charged, provided that in no case shall the charge be less than ten shillings (10s.).

14. Every hoarding shall at all times have the name of the occupier clearly shown in a conspicuous place on the front of the hoarding.

15. No person shall post, paint, stencil, place, or affix any advertisement on any fence, wall, footpath, or on any fence or wall, window, or other portion of any building facing or abutting on any street or way or public place within the municipality.

16. The Council may permit the display of advertisements at theatres or other places of public amusement, and may permit the advertising of meetings or objects of national or general importance, under such terms and conditions as the Council may in each case decide.

17. Applications for such permission shall be made in the form specified in Part 3 of the Schedule hereto attached.

18. Any permission granted by the Council hereunder may be in the form specified in Part 4 of the said Schedule.

19. The provisions of Section 15 of this By-law shall not apply to bills or advertisements posted on or affixed to signboards to the erection or maintenance of which the Council has consented, or to the advertisement by the occupier of any shop or dwelling on the windows thereof in respect of the business carried on by him therein, or to advertisements as allowed for and provided by the standard verandah specifications.

20. The use of any advertisement within the municipality, otherwise than in accordance with this By-law, is hereby prohibited.

21. The occupier or owner of any premises within the municipality on the walls, windows, or fences of which any bills are posted or any advertisements are painted, stencilled, placed, or fixed contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall, on receiving written notice from the Council so to do, remove the same, and if the same are not removed within seven days from the giving of such notice, then the Council may by its officers remove the same and recover from the owner or occupier in a court of summary jurisdiction the cost of so doing.

Penalties for breaches of By-laws.

22. Where anything in this By-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done and such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this By-law; and every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable, for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty of Ten shillings (10s.) for the first breach of this By-law, and to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for every succeeding breach of such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the Council any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any By-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so executed. Provided that the minimum pecuniary penalty for any offence against this By-law other than the first offence shall be one-tenth of the maximum penalty hereby provided.

NORTHAM MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

By-law No. 43.

Bathing.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Northam hereby make the following By-law:—

1. No person shall bathe in any portion of the Avon River, within the Municipality of Northam, unless clothed in a neck-to-knee costume, and in the case of persons above the age of twelve years such costume shall consist of drawers and a tunic covering same to below the middle of the body.

2. No person shall bathe in any portion of the Avon River, within the said municipality, except within such area and from such bathing shed or sheds as the Council may from time to time set apart and appoint for that purpose.

3. No person shall bathe within 100 feet of any bridge within the said municipality.

4. No person shall bathe in any portion of the Avon River, within the said municipality, between the hours of 2 p.m. and 7 p.m. on Sundays.

5. The bathing shed erected on the West side of the Avon River near the weir shall be a general bathing shed, the part marked "Ladies" being reserved for the use of ladies and girls, and the remaining part of the shed being reserved for the use of men and boys, and the area within which bathing shall be permitted therefrom shall be the full width of the said river bounded on the North side by the weir and on the South side by an imaginary line drawn from the West end of Peel Terrace across the said river and parallel to the weir. The bathing shed erected on the Esplanade on the East side of the Avon River between the footbridge and the bridge at the foot of Gairdner Street shall be reserved for the use of men and boys, and the area within which bathing shall be permitted therefrom shall be the full width of the river for a distance of one chain to the North and six and a half chains to the South of the said bathing shed. The bathing shed erected on the Esplanade on the East side of the Avon River, near Nind Street, shall be reserved for the use of ladies and girls, and the area within which bathing shall be permitted therefrom shall be the full width of the river for a distance of one chain on each side of such bathing shed. Bathing shall be permitted at that portion of the Avon River known as Carter's Pool within the area defined by Poole Street on the East side and Dick Street on the West side and the full width of the river.

6. Every person using the bathing sheds of the said Municipality of Northam shall obey all directions of the officers of the Northam Municipal Council, with regard to the use of such bathing sheds.

7. No person shall obstruct, interfere with, or hinder any officer of the Northam Municipal Council in the performance of any duty in or about the bathing sheds of the said Council.

8. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
