WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit (*inter alia*) all persons from

(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture,

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act, the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of

fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1921, inclusive: And further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto:—

*Schedule.*

That portion of the Swan River extending in a Westerly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—

- (a) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year: And whereas the "Crayfish" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of the hereinbefore recited provisions: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1921, until the 31st day of December, 1921.

*Locality Schedule.*

- (a) The whole of the waters of Rottnest Island within a radius of half a mile from the line of foreshore.
- (b) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries.
- (c) The waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury).

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17624 (Yilgarn A.A. Lot 78) should vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

*The Government Tramways Act, 1912.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," it is provided that the Minister for Railways may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads: And whereas it is desirable to construct a tramway along the route hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in pursuance of all powers him in this behalf enabling, authorise the construction of a tramway along the route following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the end of the present double line in Barrack Street, thirteen chains or thereabouts from the South alignment of Hay Street, and continuing in a Southerly direction to the intersection of Barrack Street and Barrack Square, a distance of eleven chains fifty links or thereabouts.

Thence along the Northern side of Barrack Square, in an Easterly direction, a distance of three chains seventy links or thereabouts.

Thence in a Southerly direction, along the Eastern side of Barrack Square, a distance of four chains seventy links or thereabouts.

Thence in a Westerly direction, along the Southern side of Barrack Square, a distance of two chains seventy links or thereabouts.

Thence in a Northerly direction to a point on the existing tramway in Barrack Street, a distance of one chain ten links or thereabouts: making a total distance of twenty-three chains seventy links or thereabouts and more particularly delineated and coloured red on Tramway Plan No. T. 201.

*Amendment of Regulations.*

Regulation No. 199 made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the 1st October, 1909, is hereby repealed, and the following Regulation enacted in place thereof:—

## Regulation No. 199.

*Cleaning of Wharf Berth.*—To cover the cost of cleaning up the berth or berths occupied by a vessel during its stay in port, a charge of £1 will be levied against every vessel of over 1,000 tons net register, and a charge of 10s. against every vessel of 1,000 tons net register or under. Provided that the amount of such charge may, in the discretion of the Board, be reduced. Such charge must be paid before clearance is granted.

This charge will only apply to cleaning up the rubbish, etc., which naturally collects on the wharf while a vessel is berthed, and does not include the removal of stages, planks, gangways, horse boxes, trams, or other gear used in the loading or unloading of a vessel, which removal must be done to the satisfaction of the Wharf Manager by the Master or Agents of the vessel.

In the event of such work not being done promptly and to the satisfaction of the Wharf Manager, the Board will do it at the expense of the owners of the vessel.

## PUBLIC CEMETERY, DOWERIN.

*By-Laws.*

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dowerin, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.:

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other

than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

- (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Dowerin on the 30th October, 1920.

*By-law.*

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make, alter, and repeal By-laws for any of the purposes cited in the said Act, under Section 196: Now, therefore, the Meekatharra Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in them under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby order as follow:—

## By-law VII.

By-law numbered VII. as published in the *Government Gazette* of 2nd October, 1914, is hereby amended, by adding the following words after the word "Act," in paragraph (a), viz.:—

"Provided that any rate, being the whole amount of rate due by any one person, being paid at the office of the Board within thirty days of the said date, a discount at the rate of five per centum will be allowed thereon."

## By-law XXVII.

*For regulating and providing for use, etc., of roads and public places, and prohibiting any misuse of any road and public places.*

No person shall place, drop, lay any poison or any substance containing any poison or deleterious matter upon or along any street, road, footpath, reserve, nor upon any vacant or occupied land within the townsite of Meekatharra.

Any person who offends against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

The Board may offer a reward not exceeding £10 for information which will lead to the conviction of any person or persons offending against the provisions of this By-law.

## By-law XXVIII.

*For reservation and protection of motor tracks.*

The Board may set apart any track or portions of any track for the sole use of motor vehicular traffic, and may clear and improve any track for the sole use of motor vehicular traffic. The Board shall give public notice defining the track or portions of track thereby reserved for motor vehicular traffic, and may in addition provide and erect, upon or along any track or portions of track so reserved, suitable notices indicating that such track or portions of track have been set

apart for motor traffic, and prohibiting the use of such track or portions of track otherwise than for motor traffic.

No person shall drive any cart or carriage upon or along any such motor track.

Any person who shall drive any cart or carriage upon or along such motor track shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

The terms "cart," "carriage," shall have the meanings assigned to them as in the Second Schedule of "The Traffic Act, 1919."

*Passing Dredges in the Fairway.*

*Notice to Mariners.*

MARINERS and all persons navigating the Entrance Channel into the Inner Harbour Basin and the Inner Harbour of Fremantle, Western Australia, are hereby notified that the signals exhibited by dredges in the fairway, and the directions for passing these dredges, are as follows:—

1. When dredge exhibits a Black Ball Shape by day or a Green Light under a White Light, four feet apart

by night—Vessels coming in must leave dredge on their own starboard hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own port hands.

2. When dredge exhibits a Black Diamond Shape by day or a Red Light under a White Light, four feet apart, by night—Vessels coming in must leave the dredge on their own port hands, and outgoing vessels must leave dredge on their own starboard hands.

3. When dredge exhibits a Red Flag by day or two Red Lights vertically four feet apart by night, this denotes that dredge cannot be moved from her position, and if sufficient room exists for vessels to pass the side on which they are to pass will be indicated by one of the signals detailed under Nos. 1 or 2 above being also shown. If, however, neither of these signals is shown, the dredge must not be passed till either daylight appears or definite orders have been received from the Harbour Master.

#### HEALTH ACT, 1911-1919.

##### Regulation to Public Buildings.

M.P.H. 2049/20; Ex. Co. 4079.

IN pursuance of the powers and authority conferred by "The Health Act, 1911-1919," His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. Every person submitting a plan and specification to the Commissioner of Public Health under the provisions of Section 139 of "The Health Act, 1911-1919," shall, at the time of submitting such plan and specification, pay a fee of 2s. for each 100 square feet, or part thereof, of floor area therein.

2. If a public building is to be mainly used as a place of worship, or as a benevolent asylum, then the fee to be paid shall be half of that specified in paragraph one hereof.

3. If the plan and specification submitted provide only for the alteration of an existing public building, then the fee to be paid shall be one-quarter of that specified in paragraph one hereof.

4. If the plan and specification submitted provide for an extension of an existing public building, then the fee shall be calculated in respect of the floor area of the proposed extension of such building.

5. The minimum fee payable under these Regulations shall be 5s.

6. The Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th July, 1911, are hereby cancelled.
