PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By TO WIT. F. A. NEWDEGATE, Governor.

- The Eastern Goldfields Licensed Victuallers' Association, S. F. Cook, Mrs. Bennett, Albany Bell, Lim-ited, and others, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with industrial dispute between the above-mentioned the parties :-

AWARD.

Hotel Schedule.

1. Hours .- Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work.

2. Spread of Shifts .-- Daily spread of shifts shall mean the time which elapses from the time when the worker first starts work and the time when he or she finishes work for the day. Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spread of shifts for a week. The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty-six hours. The longest spread of shifts in any one day shall not be more than twelve hours. In addition to breaks for meal hours there shall not be more than one break in any shift; such break to be not less than three hours. Where the spread of hours at present in operation is less than herein provided, such shift shall not be interfered with unless it can be shown that the general alterations now brought into force have made the continuance of such shifts difficult, in which case the employer and a duly accredited representative of the union shall confer with a view to arriving at a mutual arrangement.

Provided that in establishments whose usual custom is to serve breakfast before seven o'clock a.m. a daily spread of thirteen hours shall be permissible, or seventytwo hours per week.

4. Overtime.—Work done by workers after the completion of forty-eight hours in any one week or in excess of the rostered hours in any day, shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half; provided always that no employer shall employ any worker, and no worker shall work for any employer for a longer period of overtime than five hours in any one week, except during:—

- (1.) The two weeks from the 23rd of December to the 6th of January,
- (2.) The Racing Carnival week in which the Kalgoorlie and Boulder Cups are contested,

in any one of which weeks the maximum period of evertime permissible shall be ten hours.

5. Weekly Holidays.—All workers shall be entitled to and shall receive a full day off duty each week excepting in hotels where one cook is employed, in which case two half days in lieu of one full day shall be given, and in addition the wages paid by such hotels to all employees shall be increased by one-twelfth above the rates provided in the Award. Provided that the half day shall commence at two o'clock in the afternoon and terminate at the usual starting time the next day.

6. Waitresses Climbing Ladders, etc.—No waitress shall be permitted or compelled to elimb ladders in order to clean fans, fanlights, or windows, and no waitress shall be permitted or compelled to scrub walls, floors, or paint work.

7. Roster.—A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in the kitchen or pantry in such place as it may be conveniently seen by each worker at least one week ahead; such roster shall be open to inspection by the union official, who shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom.

8. Weekly Wages.--Wages shall be paid weekly. When no agreement in writing is made determining the period of notice, then a notice of not less than 24 hours shall be given by either party of intention to terminate the service.

9. Meal Hour.—At least one clear hour in every six shall be allowed off for each worker for meal time.

10. Payment for Public Holidays.—All work done on Good Friday, Christmas Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rates in all establishments.

11. Record Book.—The employer shall keep or eause to be kept at his business premises, or at each of them, if more than one, a time and wages book wherein shall be entered the name, occupation, and in the case of juniors, the age on his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day, and shall be initialed weekly if correct, by each worker. The employer and each worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting up of the book. The book shall be open to inspection on the employer's premises during working hours by a duly authorised representative of the union, who shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom. 12. Preference of Employment.—Preference of employment shall be given to members of the white races.

13. *Meals.*—Meals shall be supplied to workers as follows:—All meals as per menu used in the establishment.

14. Board and Lodging.—If board is not provided by the employer, the worker shall be entitled to seventeen shillings per week, and if lodging is not provided for he or she shall be entitled to seven shillings and sixpence per week in addition to the wage hereinbefore prescribed. The employer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall consider the accommodation unsuitable, then the union may request the health inspector to inspect and report upon the same, and his decision shall be final on the point.

15. Annual Holiday.—After the completion of twelve months' service three weeks' holiday on full pay, together with board and lodging allowance as provided in Clause 14, shall be granted to each worker. Such holiday shall be granted within three months of becoming due, failing which the employer shall pay double time for all work done after that date. This penalty shall not apply where it can be shown after consultation with the union secretary that it was impossible to find a substitute during that time. Provided also that any worker who shall have served one month or over and whose services shall be terminated by either party for any good cause before the annual holiday has become due under this clause shall be entitled to a proportionate allowance in respect of the time actually served.

16. Uniforms.—Employers shall pay for the laundering of all stiff white cuffs and collars where the same are demanded to be worn, and shall also pay one shilling per week extra to all workers who are required to wear white aprons.

17. Change Rooms.—Employers shall consider complaints made by the union's representative with regard to adequacy or otherwise of change rooms, and where no agreement is arrived at the matter shall be referred to the health inspector for decision. Employers shall agree to make provision for suitable change and rest rooms in all new buildings.

Under-rate Workers .- Any worker who by reason 18. of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall if he so desires be heard by the magistrate upon such After having given notice to the secreapplication. tary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed, at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application.

19. *Higher Dutics.*—Any employee called upon to perform duties carrying a higher rate of pay than those for which he was engaged for two days or more in any one week, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole week. If for less than two days at work carrying a higher rate than that which he was earning, he shall be paid at his ordinary rate for the whole.

Restaurant and Tea-room Section.

20. Hours.-Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work.

21. Spread of Shifts.—Daily spread of shifts shall mean the time which clapses from the time when the worker first starts work and the time when he or she finishes work for the day. Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spread of shifts for a week. The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty hours in tearooms and sixty-six hours in coffee palaces, restaurants. and board and lodging houses. The longest spread of shift in any one day shall not be more than twelve hours. In addition to one break for meal hour there shall not be more than one break in any shift, such break to be not less than three hours, with the exception of one day in the week, either Friday or Saturday, when a ten hour working day is permissible with two breaks of at least one hour each for meals. Not more than three late nights shall be worked in any one week, or as an-alternative, day and night shifts alternate weeks. Where the spread of hours already in operation is less than herein provided, such shifts shall not be interfered with unless it can be shown that the general alteration now brought into force has made the continuance of such shifts difficult, in which case the acting representative of the union and the employer shall confer with a view to arriving at a mutual arrangement.

Provided that in establishments whose usual custom is to serve breakfast before 7 o'clock a.m., a maximum daily spread of 13 hours shall be permissible, or 70 hours per week,

Casual workers employed by the tea-room proprietors at their shops or at outside functions shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all time within the usual business hours. For all time outside those hours double time shall be paid. Casuals employed at the shops for late shopping nights shall be paid double time.

23. Overtime .- Work done by workers after the completion of forty-eight hours in any one week or outside the rostered shift shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half in coffee palaces, restaurants, and tea-rooms. Provided always that no employer shall employ any worker and no worker shall work for any employer for a longer period of overtime than five hours in one week except during:— (1.) The two weeks from the 23rd of December to

(1) The observed week in which the Boulder(2.) The Racing Carnival week in which the Boulder

and Kalgoorlie Cups are contested,

in any one of which weeks the maximum period of overtime permissible shall be ten hours.

24. Weekly Holiday .- All workers shall be entitled to and shall receive a full day off duty each week in establishments which open seven days per week, and half a day off duty in establishments which open six days per week. Provided that the half day shall commence at two o'clock in the afternoon and terminate at the usual starting time next day.

Waitresses Climbing Ladders, etc.-No waitress 25.shall be permitted or compelled to climb ladders for the purpose of cleaning electric fans, faulights, or windows.

26. Roster.—A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in the kitchen or pantry in such place as it may be conveni-ently seen by each worker. Such roster shall denote the hours to be worked by each worker at least one day ahead, and such roster shall be open to inspection by the duly accredited representative of the union who shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom.

27. Weekly Wage .-- Wages shall be paid weekly. When no agreement in writing is made determining the period of service, then a notice of not less than twentyfour hours shall be given by either party of intention to terminate the service. This clause shall not be deemed to apply to the casual workers provided for in Clause 24 of this Award,

28. Meal Hour.-At least one clear hour in every six shall be allowed off for each worker for meal time, and in tea-rooms the time may be divided by taking half for morning tea before noon and another half-hour before 2.30 o'clock p.m. for dinner.

29. Holiday Pay. All work done on Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rates in all establishments.

30. Record Book .- The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises, or at each one of them if more than one, a time and wages book wherein shall be entered the name, occupation, and in the case of juniors the age on his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day and shall be initialed weekly if correct by each worker. The employer and each worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily posting up of the book. The book shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the union. He shall be permitted to take extracts therefrom on a portion of employer's premises convenient to the employer the during all working hours.

31. Preference of Employment.-Preference of employment shall be given to members of the white races. 32. Meals.-Meals shall be supplied to workers as follows:-

- In restaurants, cafés, oyster saloons, boarding houses, coffee palaces, and other catering establish-ments:—All meals as per menu used in such -All meals as per menu used in such establishment.
- In tea-rooms :- Breakfast as per menu used in such establishment. Dinner:-Soup, roast joint, two vegetables, and sweets. Tea:--Cold meat, cake, scones and jam.

Board and Lodging .- If board is not provided 33. by the employer the worker shall be entitled to seven-teen shillings per week, and if lodging is not provided for he or she shall be entitled to seven shillings and sixpence per week in addition to the wage hereinbefore prescribed. An employer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation. If the worker shall consider the accommodation unsuitable, then the union may request the health inspector to inspect and report upon the same, and his decision shall be final on the point. The lodging allowance shall not apply to tea-rooms except in respect to the holiday provision contained in the next succeeding clause.

Annual Holiday .--- After the completion of twelve months' service three weeks' holiday on full pay shall be granted to those workers working in establishments which open seven days per week, and two weeks holi-day on full pay to those workers working in establishday on this pay to mose workers working in contains, ments which open six days a week, together with board and lodging allowance in both cases as provided for by this Award. Provided further that a roster containing the names of the workers and the dates on which their holidays will be granted may be arranged between the employer and the secretary of the union. This clause shall not apply to any worker dismissed for wilful misconduct or other good cause.

35. Uniforms.—Employers shall pay for the laundering of all stiff white cuffs and collars where the same are required by the employer to be worn, and shall also pay one shilling per week extra to all workers who are required to wear white aprons.

36. Juniors in Tea-room Kitchens.—Juniors in tearoom kitchens shall mean girls under eighteen years of age, and they shall not be in a greater proportion than that of one junior to two, or part of two, seniors. Those at present in employment shall not be affected by this clause.

37. *Higher Duties.*—Any worker called upon to perform duties carrying a higher rate of pay than those for which they were engaged for two days or more in any week shall be paid the higher rate for the whole week. If for less than two days at work carrying a higher rate than that which the worker was earning he shall be paid at the ordinary rate for the whole week.

The following two clauses shall apply to the whole of this Award:---

38. Area.—This Award shall have effect and operate over the area comprised within a radius of six miles from the Post Office at Kalgoorlie.

39. Term of Award.—The currency of this Award shall be for three years from the twenty-seventh of December, One thousand uine hundred and twenty. Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months therefrom the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

2. Term.—This Award shall remain in force for a period of one year from the first of January, 1921.

The minimum wage shall be 96s. per week of fortyeight hours for men working on the surface, and 99s. per week of forty-four hours for those working underground.

4. Hours of Labour.—(a.) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface the forty-eight hours shall then be inclusive of crib time.

(b.) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work underground, including crib time.

(c.) On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight hours, including crib time, and on Saturdays four hours, excluding crib time, shall comprise the week's work for underground workers.

(d.) A day's work on the surface shall be deemed to be satisfied if time of duty be eight and three-quarter hours on five days in each week, and four and a quarter hours on one day.

(e.) Six hours shall constitute a shift's work in all rises, or in sinking specially wet shafts and winzes, and for men engaged as boiler cleaners or in cleaning dustbins or flues.

5. Overtime.—(a.) For work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b.) Duty on Sundays or holidays shall be paid at double time.

(c.) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the employees themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming ou at the appointed time.

6. Wet Places.—In all wet or hot places, eighteenpence extra per shift shall be paid in addition to the rates set out. This extra payment shall not apply to Subclause (e) of Clause 4. 7. Dry-crushing plants.—No dry-crushing plant shall be operated unless under such conditions as obviate dust, as far as is reasonably practicable. It shall be the duty of the Inspector of Mines to make an examination of all dry-crushing plants in his district once in each month, and at such other times as he may be requested so to do by the secretary of the union. He shall examine and report to the Court, and such report shall be prima facie evidence of the facts stated therein.

8. *Piece-workers.*—There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rates fixed by this Award the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, viz.:—

(a.) Where the engagement is for a period of time, such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof without the written consent of the worker.

(b.) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work the amount of the work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than 5 per cent.

(c.) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.

(d.) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages fixed by this Award for the work done.

(e.) The price of any article supplied by the employer for use by the worker during the period of his engagement shall not be increased during the period and shall in no case exceed the cost or price of the article to the employer at the place of supply.

(f.) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Award, or by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.

(g.) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wage renumeration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period of their several employment at the rate fixed by this Award or the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors.

A printed copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the Change Room on the mine.

9. Holidays.—The following days shall be holidays: —Christmas Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day fall on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

10. Casual Workers.—Men employed for less than one week shall be considered casual, and shall receive one shilling per shift above the rates specified for the work.

11. Drinking Water.—Good drinking water shall be supplied on all levels where men are working, and kept cool and free from dust.

12. Free Water.—In all districts where free water is supplied by the employer, single men shall get three gallons and married men six gallons per day.

13. No Reduction.—Any worker who may be at the date of issue of this Award in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed shall not suffer any reduction by reason of this Award.

14. Mixed Functions.—Any worker carrying out work elassified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift, provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

15. Change Rooms.—If more than four persons are employed underground in any mine in one shift suffi-

cient accommodation shall be provided above ground near the principal entrance to the mine, and not in the engine room or boiler house, for enabling the persons employed in the mine to conveniently dry and change their clothes, and in no case shall men change their clothes upon a boiler.

16. Union Official.—A duly accredited official of the union shall be allowed to collect union fees at the offices of the mine on pay days, and shall be allowed to inspect time sheets and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this Award, and make extracts therefrom.

17. Reduction of Hands.—Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed, the management, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and, all things being equal, shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the company.

18. Accident Pay.—In the event of an employee meeting with an accident during the shift, or being required to attend to one who has met with an accident, he shall be deemed to have rendered duty during the whole of the shift, and paid accordingly.

19. Full Payment for Shift.—After beginning a shift workers shall not be paid less than for a full shift unless they leave of their own accord or are dismissed for misconduct. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

20. Water Jets.—The provisions of the Regulations made under the Mines Regulation Act for the prevention of dust shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Award.

21. Payment of Wages,—Pay day shall be in accordance with Section 55 of the Mines Regulation Act. Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the mine office if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work.

22. Hours in Hot Places.—No person shall be allowed to work for a longer period than six hours in any part of the underground working of a mine when the temperature in that part, ascertained by the reading of the wet bulb thermometer, exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit for a period of four consecutive hours. The reading of the thermometer shall be ascertained at intervals of one-half hour over four hours, and the average of such readings shall be taken as the temperature during that period. The Inspector of Mines shall take readings when required so to do by any worker or by the secretary of the union. The manager of the mine shall provide the wet bulb thermometer.

23. Annual Holidays.—A fortnight's holiday on full pay shall be granted once in each year to every worker. Provided that, should the employment be terminated before the holiday is due, the worker shall, after the completion of one month's service, be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month and portion of month of service. Provided further that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause. A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid when on holiday the minimum rate for his grade.

24. Underground Workers .- All men who have to go underground to work, and the braceman, shall work the same hours as miners.

25. *Explosives.*—All men using explosives shall be classed as miners.

26. Lime.-Lime used in reduction of ore shall not be mixed in battery bins.

27. District Allowances.—In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 3 of this Award, the following allowances shall be paid for six days per week to workers employed in the districts of:—

- (1.) Westonia, Bullfinch, Marvel Loch, Southern Cross, and Burbidge, shall receive threepence per day extra.
- (2.) Norseman, ninepence per day extra.
- (3.) Comet Vale, Yuundaga, Menzies, Hampton Plains, Mount Monger, Ora Banda, one shilling per day extra.
 (4.) Murrin, Eulaminna, Morgans, Gwalia, Laverton,
- (4.) Murrin, Eulaminna, Morgans, Gwalia, Laverton, and St. Ives, one shilling and sixpence per day extra.
- (5.) Mulline, Riverina, Yundamindera, Lawlers, Linden, and Wiluna, one shilling and ninepence per day extra.

28. Definitions

"Wet Places."—Should any dispute arise as to whether any place is wet, or is specially wet within the meaning of Clause 4, Subclause (e), such dispute shall be referred to a board constituted of a representative appointed by the employer, a representative appointed by the Miners' Union of which the worker concerned is a member, with the Warden of the Goldfield in which such mine is situated as Chairman. The decision of a majority of the board shall be final.

such mine is situated as charman. The decision of a majority of the board shall be final. "Timberman (Ordinary).'-Timberman shall mean a worker engaged in underground timber work, but a miner timbering his own workings shall not be classed as a timberman.

as a timberman. "'Timberman (Shaft).''—A shaft timberman shall mean a worker engaged in shaft timbering or timber work, but a miner timbering his own shaft shall not be classed as a shaft timberman. "Braceman."—Braceman shall mean any worker in

"Braceman."-Braceman shall mean any worker in charge of a cage at mouth of shaft; if more than one cage each worker shall be classed as a braceman.

"'Platman.''---Platman shall meau the worker in charge of cage in a shaft.

"Hot Places."-Hot places shall mean places underground where the temperature exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit using the wet bulb.
