WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—

- (a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto, shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1921, and as from the First day of August, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive.

(2.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1921, and from the First day of November, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive.

(3.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality, Schedule attached hereto, shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of March, 1921, and from the First day of October, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive.

(4.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto, shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Twenty-third day of March, 1921, and from the Sixteenth day of May, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive.

(5.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule, shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive; provided that subject to certain provisions (*vide* separate Proclamation), it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday, and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.

(6.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch, by any method of capture, as from the First day of July, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of October, 1921, inclusive.

(7.) That all those waters mentioned in the Seventh Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the First day of January, 1921, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1921, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean of Rottmest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island), and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island), and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

(a.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a-half miles from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half-a-mile from the said pier or jetty and half-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

(a.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Roe" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a-quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a-quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet, bounded by the following lines:—

On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary Bunbury.

Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Seventh Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Storm-water Drainage Works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the

operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts for the management of the Quindanning Public Cemetery (Reserve 12341).

PUBLIC CEMETERY, QUINDANNING.

By-Laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Quindanning, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-digger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees commits an offence against these By-laws.

33. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d.) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

34. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office at Quindanning on the 12th of December, 1920.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make, amend, or repeal By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: the Kanowna Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

1. *Goats: Goats within a two-mile radius of the Kanowna Post Office.*—Every keeper of any goat or goats within a two-mile radius of the Kanowna Post Office shall register with the Road Board his or her name as a keeper of goats, and shall register each goat kept, and shall at the time of registration pay the sum of sixpence for each goat so owned and kept within the said radius, and shall place and keep on the neck of every goat so owned a collar bearing disc with registration number stamped thereon.

2. No person shall suffer any goat or goats in his or her charge or apparent ownership to run loose within the said radius, unless the owner thereof or keeper shall be in constant attendance thereof.

3. The Board may refuse to register any goat if in the opinion of the Board suitable accommodation has not been provided for keeping such goat.

4. *Goats within District generally.*—No person shall allow or cause any goat to be depastured or tethered upon or to loiter or stay upon any roads, streets, or reserves, or any vacant land adjacent thereto, without the permission of the Board.

5. Any goat found wandering upon any street, road, or reserve may be seized and impounded or destroyed.

6. Every person who shall offend against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, irrespective of and in addition to any other fine or damage for trespass to which the defendant shall be subject, and the Road Board may impound, sell, or destroy any such goat or goats which shall be permitted to run loose as aforesaid.

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
