WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 10 of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, Governor of the said State, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said ordinance, do hereby proclaim that the existing boundaries of the Yilgarn Goldfield shall be amended by the exclusion of certain areas indicated "A," "B," and "C," and described hereunder:-

#### ((A))

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 575 chains West from Survey Mark HK11, and extending East 255 chains; thence South-Easterly to a point situate 400 chains North from the 5-mile post on the Old Goldfield Road; thence South to the Northern boundary of the Eastern Goldfield Railway Reserve; thence West-South-Westerly along the said Railway Reserve to a point situate South of the starting point, and thence North to the said starting point; containing approximately 197,000 acres.

#### "B."

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the Northern boundary of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area situate North of the North-Eastern corner of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area Lot 68, and extending North to a point situate East of Survey Mark HK11; thence West to a point situate North of the 12-mile post on the Southern Cross-Bullfinch Road; thence South to a line parallel to and three miles North-East from the said road; thence South-Easterly along the same line to a point situate North of the 6-mile post on the said road; thence South to the said mile post; thence South-Easterly along the North-Eastern side of road to a point situate West of the North-Western corner of Reserve 1362; thence East passing along the Northern boundary of Reserve 1362 to the Western boundary of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area Lot 58; thence North-North-Westerly and East-North-Easterly along the West-South-Western and North-Easterly along the West-South-Western and North-North-Western boundaries of the said Lot 58 to the South-Western corner of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area Lot 59; thence Northerly and Easterly along part of the Western and Northern boundaries of the Yilgarn Agricultural Area to the starting point; containing approximately 72,000 acres.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves Nos. 17630 (Sinclair's Soak), 17629 (Yardine Soak), and 17631 should vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of "Water": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct

Wickepin, Pingelly, and Corrigin Road Boards.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 4388/19.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a District and annex such portion to an existing District, and may abolish any Ward of a Road District and constitute new wards from the territory thereof: And whereas it is desirable to sever a portion of the Corrigin Road District and annex the same to the Pingelly Road District, and to sever a portion of the Wickepin Road District and annex the same to the Pingelly Road District, and further to abolish the East Ward of the Pingelly Road District and divide the territory thereof into two Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby sever a portion of the Corrigin Road District, as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex the same to the Pingelly Road District, and doth sever a portion of the Wickepin Road District, as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex same to the Pingelly Road District: And doth hereby abolish the East Ward of the Pingelly Road District, and divide the territory thereof into two Wards with the boundaries, names, and number of members as defined and allocated in Schedule "C" hereto.

To come into force on the 1st day of February, 1921. Also the financial adjustment in regard to rates owing on the territory so transferred to be:—that all rates (including arrears) to belong to the Corrigin Board and be recovered by them, and rates levied by the Pingelly Board from the 1st July, 1921, to belong to them.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 671/20. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary require-

ments of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Stormwater Drainage.

Proposed extension from Mt. Lawley main, along West Parade and Railway Parade to Almondbury Road, as indicated in red on Pian W.S., S., & D.D. No. 3780. This Order in Council shall take effect from the 3rd day of February, 1921.

Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 10 of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuffs and necessary commodities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs and necessary commodities within the Metropolitan Area and other proclaimed Areas.

The maximum price, for net cash in seven days, at which Bran and Pollard may be sold or supplied wholesale at mill door or on rail, at mill siding, within all proclaimed areas where Flour Mills are operating, shall be:—

£11 per ton of 2,000 lbs. (2s. 6d. may be added to this price when booked for more than seven days.)

When sold by wholesalers other than flour millers in lots of half ton or over, the maximum price shall be that chargeable at flour mills plus 5 per cent., delivery free, within a radius of one mile from wholesaler's store.

When sold by retailers in bag lots 2s. 7d. per bushel, or lesser quantities 2s. 9d. per bushel, shall be the maximum prices, delivered free.

Within all proclaimed areas other than where Flour

Within all proclaimed areas other than where Flour Mills are operating the actual cost of transportation from place of purchase to place of sale may be added to the above-mentioned prices.
