M.P.H. No. 813/21; Ex. Co. No. 414. WHEREAS by Section 101 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State to be a Shop District and specify the boundaries of such district; and may abolish any district so constituted: And whereas it is desired to abolish all existing shop districts, excepting the Metropolitan Shop District, and that shop district which is comprised of the Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Brown Hill-Ivanhoe, and Hannaus Electoral Districts, as constituted by subsection 2 of Section 101 of the said Act, and to create a number of new shop districts: Now therefore I, Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation abolish all existing shop districts, except those constituted as above referred to by Section 101, subsection 2, of the said Act, and do hereby constitute new shop districts in accordance with the schedule attached hereto.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of "The Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1911" (Act No. 46 of 1911), as amended by Section 3 of "The Local Option Continuance Act, 1918" (Act No. 1 of 1918), it is enacted that on the 1st day of April, 1921, the then existing electoral districts shall become licensing districts for the purposes of that Act and of the principal Act (No. 32 of 1911): Provided that if the Governor shall for the purposes aforesaid, on or before the said 1st day of April, by proclamation, amaigamate two or more such Electoral Districts into one district, or divide any such Electoral District into two or more districts, then any Electoral District affected shall not become a Licensing District, but every district formed by such amalgamation or division shall become a Licensing District on the said 1st day of April: And whereas it is also provided by such Act that every such Licensing District as aforesaid shall bear such name asothe Governor shall from time to time determine: And whereas it is necessary in certain instances to amalgamate or divide certain Electoral Districts for the purpose of Licensing Districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice of Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers so conferred upon me, declare, order, and proclaim as follows:

- (1.) The Perth, East Perth, West Perth, and North Perth Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Perth Licensing District.
- (2.) The Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Brown Hill, Tvanhoe, and Hannans Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Kalgoorlie Licensing District.
- (3.) The Leederville and Subiaco Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Leederville-Subiaco Licensing District.
- The Fremantle, North-East Fremantle, and (4.)South Fremantle Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Fremantle Licensing District.
- (5.) The Beverley and Pingelly Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Beverley-Pingelly Licensing District.
- (6.) The Murray-Wellington and Forrest Electoral Districts are hereby amalgamated into one Licensing District, under the name of the Murray-Wellington-Forrest Licensing District.

The Kimberley Electoral District is hereby (7.)divided into three Licensing Districts, bearing the respective names and comprising the respective areas following, that is to say:

## Names and Areas.

Broome Licensing District.—So much of the Kimberlev Electoral District as is comprised in the Broome Magisterial District.

East Kimberley Licensing District .- So much of the Kimberley Electoral District as is comprised in the East Kimberley and Kimberley Goldfields Magisterial District

West Kimberley Licensing District .- So much of the Kimberley Electoral District as is comprised in the West Kimberley Magisterial District.

(8.) The Yilgarn Electoral District is hereby divided into two Licensing Districts, bearing the respective names and comprising the respective areas following, that is to say:-

### Names and Areas.

Yilgarn Licensing District.—The whole of the Yilgarn Electoral District, except so much of the area thereof as is comprised in the Phillips River Magisterial District.

Ravensthorpe -Licensing District.—So much of the Yilgarn Electoral District as is comprised in the

Phillips River Magisterial District.
(9.) Each of the Electoral Districts other than those above named shall as a Licensing District bear the name which it bears as an Electoral District, with the substi-tution of the words "Licensing District" for the words "Electoral District."

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

(a.) Laying and jointing about 1,200 feet of 10inch diameter steel water main, with all necessary timber bearers and steel straps, etc., on Road Bridge;

(b.) Laying and jointing about 2,040 feet of 10-

inch diameter east-iron water main;
(c.) Valves, specials, fire hydrants, and all necessary

apparatus;
(d.) Lifting about 3,240 feet of existing 8-inch

diameter wood stave pipe.

## THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919. Regulation.

Additional License Fee for Vehicles engaged in Heavy Traffic.

149. (1.) The annual license fee for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying any heavy substance, including stone, bricks, lime, timber, in bulk, earth, gravel, mineral, or other materials or liquid matter, the weight of the load being not less than 10cwt. per wheel, is hereby increased as follows:—

10cwt. per wheel, is hereby increased as follows:—
Two-wheeled vehicles, by £3 per wheel per annum.
Four-wheeled vehicles, by £2 10s. per wheel per annum.

- (2.) Such amounts shall be additional to the license fees prescribed by "The Traffic Act, 1919."
  - (3.) This By-law shall not apply to:
    - (a) a vehicle which is only engaged in heavy carting upon some special occasion for which the permission in writing of the Board controlling the roads on which the vehicle is used has been first had and obtained for each and every occasion.
    - (b) a vehicle used by a farmer or settler carrying cereals or orchard produce.
- (4.) Any person who shall use on any road any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic as herein defined, for which vehicle the additional license fee has not been paid in respect of a current license, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 additional to being liable for cost of any damage as may be assessed by the magistrate,

(5.) This Regulation shall have effect only in those Road Districts where the public office of the Board is situated South of the 25th parallel of South latitude.

FURTHER amendments to Traffic Regulations approved of on the 12th February, 1920, and published in the Gazette of the 13th February, 1920:—

## Regulation No. 22:

Paragraph No. 6 of Regulation No. 22 is amended by inserting the word "motor" after the word "any," in first lines of two paragraphs (a) and (b), also by adding new sub-paragraphs as follows:—

- (d) For any cart or carriage for private use, red numbers or letters and numbers on black ground.
- (e) For any cart or carriage for hire, red numbers or letters and numbers on white ground.

This amendment to come into force on and from 1st July, 1921.

Regulation No. 121a:

No person shall drive, ride, or lead on any road any wild or undomesticated animal, unless secured in such a manner that it shall not in any way endanger the public or cause alarm.

#### Regulation No. 121b:

No person shall drive on any road any vehicle having in or on it any wild animal, reptile, or bird, unless such animal, reptile, or bird is secured in such a manner that no danger can result or alarm be caused to the public.

## Regulation No. 146:

Paragraph 4 of Regulation No. 146 is amended by omitting the words "disengaged and," after the word "when," in the third and fourth lines.

#### Penalty:

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## Third Schedule:

The Third Schedule is amended by omitting the letters "W.K," and inserting in lieu thereof the letters "W.M." as the identification letters for the Wyalcatchem Road District.

Amendments to Regulations.

Education Department, Perth, 8th February, 1921.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendments to the Regulations of the Education Department.

CECIL ANDREWS,

Director of Education.

Reg. 6.—Delete Reg. 6, and substitute the following:—

6. Schools will be classified as follows:-

Class Ia.—First class schools containing at least 80 children above Class VI. and at least 30 above Class VII.

Class I.—Average attendance of over 500. II.-300 III.— 200 ,, ,, ,, IV.— 85. ,, ,, ,, ,, V.--50 ,, ,, ,, ,, VI. 20. " ,, " " VII. under 20. " ,, ,, ,,

Half-time schools will be classified on the aggregate attendance of the two schools.

Schools with average attendance between 400 and 500 previously classified in Class I. shall remain in that class until their Head Teachers can be transferred to other First Class Schools.

Reg. 8.—Delete the following words:—
"Schools containing over 400 children in classes higher than the sixth may be classed as Special Schools."

Reg. 21.—Delete the second paragraph and substitute the following:—

A teacher may be promoted to a higher grade in Class C or B when he has been placed in the first group or in the first subdivision of the second group of his grade and has completed the prescribed period of service. He may be promoted to a higher grade in Class A when he has been placed in the first group of his grade and has completed the prescribed period of service.

Reg. 20.—Add the following:-

The Board of Classifiers shall consist of the Chief Inspector, a Senior Inspector nominated by the Minister, and a Head Teacher of a Central School, elected by the teachers in a manner to be prescribed by the Minister.

Reg. 22.—Delete paragraph two and substitute the following:—

From A3 to A2.—For Head-masters: Three years' good service as Head Teacher of schools not lower than Class IV. (Service in schools of Class V. in 1920 shall count.) For Assistants:— Three years as First Assistant in a First or Second Class school, or in teaching a class above Class VI. One of the three years must have been spent as First Assistant in a school of Class Ia, or in a District High School taking the full secondary course.

Reg. 31.—After the word "Department," in the first sentence, add "through their District Inspector."

Reg. 33.—Add the following:—

The Minister, on a report from the Director of Education, may require the retirement of any teacher who has reached the age of 60 years. A teacher automatically vacates his position on reaching the age of 65 years, unless the Governor in Council has previously directed him to continue in the service.

Reg. 34.—Delete "A.—Position Quota," and substitute the following:-

## HIGH SCHOOL ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1920. Regulations.

- 1. The Committee of the High School Old Boys' Association (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) shall, by notice to be published in a newspaper, invite applications for nomination as one of the three persons to be appointed as members of the corporation known as the Governors of the High School, Perth, on the nomination of the said association, pursuant to the Act No. 6 of 1920.
- 2. An application for nomination may be to the effect of the Form A in the schedule, and shall be in writing signed by the applicant and countersigned by three financial members of the association.
- 3. At the expiration of three weeks from the publication of the notice referred to in Regulation 1, the Committee shall cause to be sent to each member of the association a nomination paper initialed by the Honorary Secretary of the association and on which the names of the candidates are written or printed; and each member of the association shall record his nomination by striking out the names of all except three of the candidates whose names are written or printed on the nomination paper, and shall return the nomination paper so that the same may be received by the Honorary Secretary of the association not later than the 9th day of April, 1921.
- 4. The three members of the association who are nominated by the greatest number of the members of the association shall be deemed to have been duly nominated for appointment, and if there is an equality in the number the President of the association shall have a casting vote.
- 5. The result of the nomination shall be ascertained at a meeting of the Committee to be duly convened and shall be published in the Gazette, and the members nominated shall be certified by the Honorary Secretary of the association to the Governor in writing to the effect of Form B in the schedule. For the purpose of a nomination for the appointment to fill the vacancy to be caused by the retirement of one of the nomination of the persons to be firstly appointed as governors as aforesaid shall extend to such one of them as, under Subsection (1) of Section 3 of the said Act, will retire on the 30th April, 1921, as a nomination for his reappointment as from that date.

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

Tentative Increase in Handling Charges.

THE Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and dated the 12th day of March, 1920, are hereby amended by the addition of the following new Regulation, viz .:-

## No. 115a.

Tentative Increase in Handling Charges.—Owing to the Waterside Workers' Federation of Australia having, under the provision of the Federal Arbitration and Conciliation Act, lodged with the Employers of waterside labour in various ports of Australia, including Fremantle, a new log of wages and working conditions to take date as from 1st January, 1921, under which the minimum rate of wages is increased from two shillings and threepence (2s. 3d.) per hour to three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per hour, an increase of 55 per cent, the rates of handling charges on all cargo as from 1st January, 1921, are hereby increased by fifty-five (55)

This excess collection will be held in suspense by the Harbour Trust Commissioners, and when the new rates are fixed as between the parties an adjustment will be made on the basis of the decision come to.
