TOBACCOES AND CIGARETTES.

NOTICE is hereby given that at a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 17th day of February, 1921, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

THE PRICES REGULATION ACT, 1919.

Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," and as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether wholesale or retail, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of landing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodities within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Met. W.S. 44/21.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Proposed 3in. dia. C.I. pipe in Oakover Street, with valves and all apparatus, commencing from Marmion Street, thence Northerly a distance of 20 chains to Lot 327, as shown on Plan W.S.D. No. 3843.

FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST ACT, 1902.

C.S.O. 25/21.

WHEREAS by Section 22 of "The Fremantle Harbour Trust Act, 1902," the Governor is empowered from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, to alter the boundaries of the Harbour which is subject to the control of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners: And whereas it is desirable to alter the said boundaries and to establish the boundaries hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, Sir Francis Alexander Newdegate, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, the Governor of Western Australia, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and notify that the boundaries of the said Harbour shall on and after the publication of this notification in the *Government Gazette* be as follows, that is to say:—

That portion of the said Harbour which shall be known as the Inner Harbour shall be bounded as follows:—

By a line starting from the intersection of the North side of Lukin Road and the prolongation Northwards of the fence on the West side of Railway Reserve, North Fremantle, and extending Southerly along the fence on Western boundary of Railway Reserve and along Railway Bridge; thence along Railway fence to Western abutment of overhead Bridge; then following the North-Western foot of embankment of approach to overhead bridge to a point opposite 92 feet North-Easterly from South-East corner of Shed J; then South-Eastward to angle in Railway fence; thence South-Westerly along said fence to the Eastern side of Cliff Street; thence Southwards along said side of street for a distance of about two chains; thence Westward crossing Cliff Street, following along the South-Eastern boundary fence of the Fremantle Harbour Works Depot to its South-Western corner; thence South about four chains; thence on a bearing of 106deg. 30min. for about 11 chains; thence South to the sea-coast and generally Westerly along same and the Southern side of the South Mole to its Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the Western extremity of the North Mole; thence Easterly and North-Easterly along the North side of the said North Mole and the sea-coast to its intersection with the prolongation North-Westerly of the South-Western boundary fence of the North Fremantle Store site; thence South-Easterly along the said prolongation and fence to the South-East corner of North Fremantle Store site fence; thence along said fence, on South-Easterly side, to its intersection with the prolongation of the North side of Lukin Road; thence along said prolongation and North side of Lukin Road to the starting point, as the said boundary is delineated in Plan deposited in the Public Works Department No. 18538.

That portion of the said Harbour which shall be called the Outer Harbour shall be:

Bounded by a line starting from the sand patch on the mainland approximately three and three-quarters (3¾) miles North of Arthur Head, known as "The Winding Sheet," and extending North of Westerly to the white buoy on Kingston Spit; thence Westerly to Duck Rock beacon; thence Southerly to Bathurst Point, Rottneest Island, and along the Eastern and Southern shore of Rottneest Island in a generally Southerly direction to Parker Point; thence South-Westerly to Entrance Point, Garden Island; thence Easterly, Southerly and Westerly passing along the Northern, Eastern, and Southern shores of the said island to South-West Head; thence Southerly to John Point on the mainland; thence Easterly and Northerly along the sea-coast of the mainland and the Southern side of the South Mole to the latter's Western extremity; thence West-North-Westerly to the Western ex-

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following amended Rules under "The Dentists Act, 1894," "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," made by the Dental Board of Western Australia.

RULES.

WHEREAS by "The Dentists Act, 1894" (hereinafter called the principal Act), the Dental Board there-by constituted is empowered, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make and prescribe such rules as the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned: And whereas the Board has made and prescribed certain rules: And whereas it is desirable to make and prescribe new Rules under the principal Act and under the amending Acts (63 Victoria, 23, and No. 51 of 1920): Now, therefore, the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the said Acts, does hereby, by and with the approval of the Governor in Council, make and prescribe the following Rules:—

Interpretation.

Section 2 of the principal Act shall be read and construed together with the Rules.

PART I.—ELECTION.

1. The next election of members of the Board, under Section 5 of the principal Act, shall be held on the first Tuesday in the month of December, 1921, and every election thereafter shall be held on the first Tuesday in the month of December in each and every succeeding third year thereafter.

Every election to fill any vacancy in the Board, as provided by Section 5 of the principal Act, shall be held as soon as practicable after such vacancy occurs, and within not more than 28 days nor less than 21 days after notice of such vacancy has been advertised, as the Board may direct.

2. Every person desiring and being qualified to become a member of the Board shall, not less than fourteen days before the date of an election, forward to the Registrar written notice of his intention to seek election, countersigned by at least two persons entitled to vote, such notice to be in the hands of the Registrar by twelve o'clock (noon).

3. If there are no more candidates than the number of vacancies, such candidates shall be declared elected.

4. If there are more candidates than the number of vacancies the Registrar shall, at least ten days before the day of the election, post to each person entitled to vote a ballot paper containing the names of all candidates in the form given in the first schedule, and shall initial each of such papers.

5. The names of any candidate for whom a voter desires to vote shall be left intact, and the remaining names scored through with a pen or pencil. If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting paper a greater or less number of names than the number of members to be elected, the vote given

on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the President. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in an envelope to be furnished to him by the Registrar, with the printed name and address of the Registrar thereon, and shall stamp and post the same, or deliver the same, so that it shall be received by the Registrar not later than 12 o'clock (noon) on the day fixed for holding such election.

6. Cancelled.

7. All ballot papers shall be opened by the President, at the office of the Board, at 12 o'clock (noon) on the day of election, in the presence of any person entitled to vote that may attend at such time and place, and the candidates receiving the largest number of votes shall be declared elected.

In case of an equality of votes between any one or more candidates, the President shall give a casting vote or votes.

8. The six members of the Board elected at a triennial election shall take office on the first day of January following their election, and shall go out of office on the first day of January following the date of the next triennial election.

9. If a sufficient number of candidates be not nominated for election, or elected to fill any vacancy or vacancies, the President shall report such fact to the Governor in Council.

10. The names of the successful candidates shall be published in the *Government Gazette* as soon as practicable.

11. The omission by the Registrar to send or post to, or the non-receipt of any ballot paper by any person entitled to vote within the time aforesaid or at all, shall not in any manner invalidate or affect the election.

PART II.—MEETINGS.

12. Ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held at the office of the Board on the first Friday in every month, at the hour of 5.15 p.m., or at such other place, date, and time as the Board may determine.

13. Special meetings shall be called by the Registrar whenever requested by the President, or any two members, provided that three clear days' notice of every such meeting shall be given by the Registrar to the members of the Board.

14. If a quorum of members be not present within fifteen minutes of the time for which the meeting is convened, it may be adjourned to such time and place as any one or more members present may determine.

15. At all meetings of the Board voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot shall be called by any member present, when the voting shall be by ballot.

16. No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done, or authorised by any meeting, shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of such intended rescission or amendment be given in the notices convening the meeting at which such rescission or amendment is proposed, and unless such rescission or amendment be ratified at the next meeting of the Board.

17. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar, and such minutes, when signed by the Chairman of the same or any subsequent meeting, shall be binding and conclusive evidence for all purposes, and before all Courts, of the proceedings at such meeting.

18. If, at or within five minutes of the time appointed for any meeting, the President be not present, the members may elect a Chairman at such meeting, or until the President shall be present.

19. The arrangement of the order for business for each ordinary meeting shall be as follows:—

- Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.
- Confirmation or otherwise of same.
- Registration of dentists.
- Ordinary business, including postponed and adjourned matters.
- Special business.
- Reading of correspondence and reports of committees.
- Letters and business arising therefrom.
- Production of bank pass-book.
- Accounts for payment.
- Registrar's statement.
- Notices of motion.
- Any other business that may be properly brought before the Board.

20. The accidental omission to give due notice of a meeting as hereinbefore provided to one or more mem-

bers of the Board, or the non-receipt thereof, shall in no manner affect or prejudice anything done or agreed to at such meeting.

Registrar.

21. The Registrar shall—

- (1.) Be appointed by the Board and hold office subject to these rules and during the pleasure of the Board.
- (2.) Be in attendance at his office, or if there be no office, then at his residence or place of business, at such hours and days as the Board may from time to time direct.
- (3.) Consult the President on any business requiring attention between the various meetings of the Board, and be responsible for the safe custody of all documents and property belonging to the Board.
- (4.) Find security to the satisfaction of the Board in the sum of £500.
- (5.) Present to the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and prepare and present to the Board a yearly balance sheet in the month of July in every year.
- (6.) Receive and be responsible for all moneys payable to the Board, and shall bank the same within 24 hours of the receipt thereof.
- (7.) Discharge such other duties as the Board may from time to time direct.

Registration.

22. Every person applying for registration as a dentist shall apply in writing, and make and forward to the Registrar an application according to one of the forms in the Second Schedule (whichever is applicable), with necessary alterations.

23. Every applicant for registration shall supply, in writing, to the Board or to the Registrar, all such information and evidence as the Board or Registrar, as the case may be, from time to time require; and shall, when and as often as required, attend in person before the Board or the Registrar, and answer verbally or in writing all such questions as may be put to him.

24. Every person whose application for registration has been approved shall be entitled to a certificate in the form in the Third Schedule.

25. Every person applying for registration under Section 3, Subsection (c), of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," shall pass such examination as the Board may from time to time by rules prescribe.

Until otherwise determined, such examination shall be in the following subjects:—

GROUP I.

Practical Chemistry.—The use of the blowpipe. General analytical operations.—Solution, filtration, evaporation and crystallisation. The preparation and properties of chemical substances. The qualitative analysis of simple salts by wet and dry methods.

Theoretical Examination.

Papers containing a series of questions on the following subjects will be submitted, to be answered in writing:—

- (a.) Anatomy of the head and neck.
- (b.) Elementary physiology.
- (c.) Dental anatomy.
- (d.) Metallurgy and elementary chemistry.

GROUP II.

Practical Dentistry.

(a.) Operative dentistry to comprise gold amalgam or other fillings; the candidate may also be asked to perform or answer questions in regard to any other operations in ordinary practice.

(b.) Mechanical Dentistry.—Specimen pieces of the various classes of mechanical work, including crown and bridge work, must be constructed under the supervision of the examiner.

N.B.—The candidate will be required in the practical examination to use his own material and small instruments; the larger, such as lathe, vulcaniser, engine and chair, will be provided by the Board.

Theoretical Examination.

Papers containing a series of questions on the following subjects will be submitted, to be answered in writing:—

- (a.) Materia medica and therapeutics.
- (b.) Dental surgery and pathology.
- (c.) Orthodontia.

26. The certificates, diplomas, or degrees prescribed by the Board under Section 3, paragraph (a), of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," are the following, viz.:—

A Degree of Dental Surgery, Dental Science, or Dental Medicine of any University in the United Kingdom,
 The University of Harvard,
 The University of Michigan, or
 The University of Pennsylvania,

and the examinations prescribed shall be those necessary to obtain any one of the above-mentioned degrees of examination.

27. The Board may, subject to the Acts and Rules, register as a dentist any person above the age of 21 years and of good character, who is the holder of a diploma or degree in Dental Surgery of a University in a British possession or in one of the United States of America, provided the applicant furnish to the Board satisfactory evidence:—

- (1.) That he has passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to the Matriculation pass of the Melbourne University, with English, Arithmetic, and Physics as compulsory subjects; and
- (2.) That he has passed the examination of the fourth year of the Licentiate of Dental Surgery course of the Australian College of Dentistry (affiliated with the Melbourne University).

Apprentices.

28. No person shall act as an apprentice to any dentist until he has entered into written articles of apprenticeship, which shall be produced to and registered by the Registrar within one month from the date thereof. A duplicate copy of the said articles of apprenticeship shall at the same time be lodged with the Registrar for the purpose of record.

No service by an apprentice shall be counted or available except from the date of registration of the articles of apprenticeship.

29. No articles of apprenticeship shall be registered unless and until the apprentice therein named shall have passed:—

- (a.) The Intermediate (formerly Junior Public) and School Leaving (formerly Senior Public) Examinations of the University of Melbourne, and must also have a pass in Physics.
- (b.) The Senior Public Examination of the Adelaide University, with English, Arithmetic, and Physics as compulsory subjects; or
- (c.) An examination which, in the opinion of the Board, is equivalent to that prescribed in (a).
- (d.) Or the examination for the Junior Certificate of the University of Western Australia in six subjects, with English, Mathematics, and Physics as compulsory subjects.

29a. Notwithstanding anything contained in Clause 29 of these Rules, any person who has served abroad with His Majesty's Forces during the war, or who has been absent from Australia upon war service undertaken on behalf of His Majesty's Government, shall be entitled to obtain the registration of his articles of

apprenticeship upon his furnishing evidence satisfactory to the Board as to his educational qualification, and provided that:—

- (1.) The applicant shall furnish evidence satisfactory to the Board of his intention to enter upon a dental course prior to his enlistment.
- (2.) He was resident in Western Australia for at least 12 months prior to his enlistment, and
- (3.) He makes written application to the Board in accordance with this Rule within 15 months of the date of his discharge from war service.

30. (a.) A registered apprentice, upon presenting himself for his final examination, shall be entitled to be examined under the syllabus in force at the time of the registration of his articles, provided he presents himself within two years of the completion of his articles.

(b.) A registered apprentice shall be entitled to be examined in the subjects comprising Group I. of the examination prescribed in Rule 25, after the expiry of eighteen months from the registration of his articles; in which case one-third of the examination fee, viz., £2 2s., shall be payable under the first Group, and the remaining two-thirds of the examination fee, viz., £4 4s., shall be payable under the second Group.

31. The fees specified in the Fourth Schedule shall be payable and paid to the Registrar in respect of the matters in such schedule mentioned.

Miscellaneous.

32. The Board may adopt a Seal as the Common Seal of the Board.

Such Seal shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar and deposited at the office of the Board.

Such Seal shall be affixed by the Registrar, in the presence of the President of the Board, to any writing, when authorised by a resolution of the Board, and not otherwise.

33. The Board may from time to time appoint and dismiss an examiner or examiners, and pay such remuneration as the Board thinks expedient.

34. No person who has submitted to and failed to pass any examination shall be entitled to again submit himself for examination within a period of six months; but where the candidate, failing in one practical subject, has in the opinion of the Board done well in the remaining subjects of his examination, he may be permitted re-examination in that subject within six weeks, without further charge.

35. In or after the month of February in each year, the Registrar shall publish in the *Government Gazette* a list of all dentists whose names are then entitled to be on the Register.

36. Any dentist having failed to make any annual payment prescribed by "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," may apply to the Board to have his name restored to the Register, and if the applicant pay all arrears and all fines as next mentioned, the Board may restore his name to the Register.

The fines payable shall be ten shillings for each month or part of a month elapsing from the end of the month on which the first unpaid annual fee became payable by the applicant, but in no case shall the total amount of the fines exceed ten pounds.

37. All rules heretofore in force are hereby repealed.

Regulations.

I.—*Election of Members, Deputy Members and Assessors.*

1. The State Chief Electoral Officer, or when he is prevented from acting, his substitute, appointed under "The Electoral Act," shall be the Returning Officer at the election of any Member, Deputy Member, or Assessor under the above Act, and shall be paid such fees as provided for Parliamentary Elections in the Regulations under "The Electoral Act."

2. (i.) Within fourteen days of these Regulations coming into force, and at least six weeks prior to the lapse by effluxion of time of any appointments made by the Governor under these Regulations, the Returning Officer shall, through the "Weekly Notice" issued by the Commissioner of Railways, invite nominations for the following positions:—

- (a.) Member of the Board.
- (b.) Deputy Member of the Board.
- (c.) Assessor for Clerical Staff (Administrative), Traffic Branch.
- (d.) Assessor for Clerical Staff (Stations, etc.), Traffic Branch.
- (e.) Assessor for Goods Agents, Station Masters, Assistant and Night Station Masters, Relief Officers, and Inspectors, Traffic Branch.
- (f.) Assessor for Chief Accountant's Staff.
- (g.) Assessor for Auditor of Receipts' Staff.
- (h.) Assessor for Comptroller of Stores' Staff.
- (i.) Assessor for Clerical Staff, Chief Mechanical Engineer's Branch.
- (j.) Assessor for Professional Staff, Chief Mechanical Engineer's Branch.
- (k.) Assessor for Workshops Staff, Chief Mechanical Engineer's Branch.
- (l.) Assessor for Running Staff, Chief Mechanical Engineer's Branch.
- (m.) Assessor for Clerical Staff, Chief Engineer of Existing Lines' Branch.
- (n.) Assessor for Inspectorial Staff, Chief Engineer of Existing Lines' Branch.
- (o.) Assessor for Professional Staff, Chief Engineer of Existing Lines' Branch.

and each notice shall set out the day appointed by the Returning Officer—not later than fourteen days from the issue of the above notice—to be the day fixed for the nomination of candidates.

(ii.) Within seven days of being notified by the Chairman of the Classification Board of any extraordinary vacancy on the Board which is subject to be filled by election by the Members of the Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers, the Returning Officer shall invite nominations for such vacancy by notification in the "Weekly Notice" issued by the Commissioner of Railways, and such notice shall set out the day appointed by the Returning Officer—not later than fourteen days from the issue of such notice—to be the date fixed for the nomination of candidates.

3. The Returning Officer shall, subject to the issue in the "Weekly Notice" of any notification of any vacancy on the Board, forthwith apply to the Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers for a list and official addresses of officers entitled to vote at the filling of the vacancy or vacancies, and such list or lists shall be furnished under the seal of the Union within seven days.

4. Every nomination shall be made in writing, addressed to the Returning Officer and signed by at least five officers eligible to vote at the Election for which the nomination is made. Every nomination shall be endorsed with the written consent of the candidate to act, if elected, and shall be delivered or forwarded to the Returning Officer so as to reach him before noon on Nomination Day. Separate nomination papers must be lodged for each vacancy.

5. Where only one nomination is received for any vacancy, the Returning Officer shall declare the candidate duly elected, and report accordingly to the Governor.

6. If more than one nomination is received for any vacancy, the Returning Officer shall:—

- (a.) Cause the names of the candidates to be published in the next issue of the "Weekly Notice" issued by the Commissioner of Railways, and
- (b.) Appoint and publish in such notification date and hour of the day—which shall not be later than fourteen days from the issue of such "Weekly Notice"—and which date and hour shall be the close of the Poll.
- (c.) Advise the General Secretary of the Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers of the date and hour fixed.

7. The Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers shall advise the Returning Officer in writing of the names of two Scrutineers appointed on behalf of the Union, such Scrutineers to have the right to be present when ballot papers are being issued, and also at the count of the votes.

8. All officers in the service of the Government Railways who are members of the Railway and Tramway Officers' Industrial Union of Workers on the date when nominations for any vacancy are called shall be entitled to vote at the Election for the position of a Member or Deputy Member of the Board; but in the case of election of Assessor for any section, members are only entitled to vote for Assessor for the section of the Department in which they are employed.

9. The list of voters shall be open for inspection by any person claiming the right to vote, and if any officer wishes to take objection to any names appearing on that list, or omitted from it, particulars of such objections must be communicated in writing to the Returning Officer, whose decision shall be final.

10. The voting shall be on the Optional Preferential system.

11. As soon as practicable after the nominations have been declared, the Returning Officer shall cause Ballot Papers to be printed showing in alphabetical order of surnames the names of the persons nominated. The full christian names, position held in the Department, name of Branch, and the candidate's Postal address, shall also be given on the Ballot Paper, and a copy of same shall be forwarded to every officer entitled to vote.

12. Only Ballot Papers received by the Returning Officer prior to the close of the Poll shall be admitted to the Count.

13. The Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the hour fixed for the close of the Poll, count the votes received, declare the result of the count, and report to the Governor the name of the person elected for the vacancy or vacancies.

14. Should a person be nominated for more than one position and receive the largest number of votes for two or more positions, he shall be declared elected for the first vacancy in the following order:—

Member,

Deputy Member,

and a recount shall be made by the Returning Officer of the ballot papers for the vacancy for which such officer's candidature is, in consequence of his elevation to a higher office, withdrawn. At such count the name of such candidate and the preference number against it shall be eliminated and ignored, and where his name is first preference on the ballot paper, the second preference on the ballot paper shall count as a first preference, and so on through the count with the various preferences.

15. In the event of two or more candidates receiving an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

16. In all matters not herein provided for, the provisions of the Electoral Act in connection with Parliamentary Elections shall be followed so far as they are applicable to the election of Members and Assessors of the Board.

17. The Returning Officer may appoint necessary assistants from amongst the officers of the State Electoral Department for the issue of Ballot Papers and the Count of the Votes, such officers to be paid overtime rates provided for by the Public Service Regulations if overtime work is, in the opinion of the Public Service Commissioner, necessitated by the work of elections held in connection with this Board.

18. The Returning Officer may send nominations by telegraph to any elector who cannot in the ordinary course of postage be reached in time through the post, and when an elector cannot in the ordinary course of mail arrangements reach the Returning Officer with his Vote prior to the close of the Poll, he may send his vote by telegraph.

II. Fees and Expenses.

PERTH ROAD BOARD.

Special By-laws re Preparation of Special Rolls and other matters for taking Vote of Owners in connection with Loans.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, the Perth Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following special By-laws regarding the taking of a Poll in respect of proposed loans:—

1. When demand shall have been duly made under Section 285 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Secretary shall forthwith prepare a special roll of the

names of all persons who appear to be resident owners of rateable land within the meaning of Section 285.

2. The various forms mentioned in these By-laws shall be those approved of by Order in Council on the 8th July, and published in the *Government Gazette*, 17th September, 1913.

3. The said roll shall be as prescribed by Form No. 40, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Road Board Office, within the usual office hours, not later than 10 days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll.

4. On or before the fifth day before the day appointed for the holding of the poll, any resident owner—

- (a) Whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered or sent through the post addressed to the Secretary, apply to have his name inserted therein, and shall give particulars of his claim.
- (b) Whose name has been inserted in the roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him may, in like manner, apply to the Secretary to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and shall give particulars of his claim.
- (c) Whose name appears in the roll, or who claims to have his name inserted in such roll may, in like manner, object to the name of any other person appearing in such roll as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his name.

Any such claims or objections shall be as prescribed by Forms Nos. 4, 5, 6, and 7, or to the like effect, and any objection under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

5. (a) The Board shall hold an open court to be called a Revision Court within the Road Board District, for the purpose of revising the Roll, and such revision shall take place before the day fixed for the holding of the poll at such time and place as the Chairman may appoint, and the Chairman shall give notice of the holding of such court and the time and place thereof, by placing such notice on some building within the Road Board District, and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the District.

(b) The court shall consist of the Chairman, or, in his absence, of a Chairman appointed by the other members of the Court, and of not less than one-third of the members of the Board.

6. Every such Court may be adjourned, and if at any time for half an hour after the time appointed for holding such Court, or adjourned Court, a sufficient number of members to form a Court is not present, the Chairman, or in his absence, any member or the Secretary, shall adjourn the Court, but no such Court shall be adjourned beyond the day before the holding of the poll.

7. (a) The Secretary shall himself, or by some person on his behalf if he is prevented from doing so, attend the Revision Court, and produce to the Court the roll and lists of the persons who have sent in claims and who have been objected to.

(b) The Court may order, if required, that the valuer or valuers and all collectors of rates shall also attend the said Court, and produce all books, papers, and documents in their possession connected with their respective offices.

(c) The officers aforesaid shall answer, on oath or otherwise, all such questions as the Court may put to them touching any matters necessary to be ascertained for revising the roll.

8. (a) The Revision Court shall have authority to hear, receive, and examine evidence by summons under the hands of the Chairman, to require all persons as the Court may think fit to appear personally before such Court, at a time and place to be named in such summons, and to produce all books and papers in their possession or under their control as may appear necessary for the purpose of their examination.

(b) The Court shall have like powers for compelling the attendance of the witnesses summoned and their examination upon and taking of oaths and affirmations and their answering questions touching the premises as

by any law in force for the time being is vested in Justices exercising summary jurisdiction, and the Chairman may issue any summonses at any time after he has appointed a time for holding the said Court.

9. The Revision Court shall in open Court determine as hereinafter provided upon the validity of all claims and objections, and every such determination shall be by the decision of the majority, and in case of an equal division of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the Court.

10. (a) The Revision Court shall insert in the roll under the revision the name of every person who has claimed as aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Court to be entitled to be inserted therein for one or more votes according to the provision of the Act.

(b) Subject as hereinafter provided, the Court shall retain on the roll the names of all persons to whom no objection has been duly made, with the number of votes unaltered.

(c) The Revision Court shall retain on the roll the name of every person who has been objected to by any person and the number of votes unaltered, unless the person so objecting appears by himself, or by some person duly authorised in writing on his behalf, in support of the objection, and proves the service of the requisite notices.

(d) When the name of any person inserted in the roll or the number of votes set against his name has been duly objected to and the person objected to appears by himself or by some one on his behalf in support of such objection, the Court shall require proof of so much qualification of the person objected to as is embraced in the grounds of objection and no more.

(e) In case the qualification of such person is not proved to the satisfaction of the Court, the Court shall expunge the name of such person from the roll or shall alter and correct the number of votes set against his name, as the case may require.

(f) The Court shall expunge from the roll the name of every person who is proved to be dead.

(g) The Court shall, by means of the rate-book valuation and return, correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to such Court to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or trade or occupation of any person who is included therein, or in respect of the local description of the rateable property, or the situation thereof or the rateable value thereof.

(h) But no person's name shall be inserted by the Court in the roll, or be expunged therefrom, unless notice has been given as hereinafter required.

11. (1) The Chairman shall, in open Court—

(a) Write initials against every name struck out or inserted as aforesaid, and against any part of the roll in which any mistake has been corrected, or omission supplied.

(b) Initial every page of the roll so settled.

(c) Cause to be written, at the foot or end of the roll, a certificate that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.

(2) The Chairman and not less than two other members of the Board shall severally sign such certificate.

12. Any resident owner whose name appears on the special roll and—

(a) who intends to be absent from the District on the day of the election; or

(b) resides more than five miles from a polling place; or

(c) is prevented by illness or infirmity from attending a polling place,

may at any time before the day appointed for the holding of the poll, apply personally, or in writing, to the Returning Officer for a postal voting paper. The Returning Officer shall thereupon supply the same and shall make a mark against the name of the said owner on the said roll.

12a. Voting papers shall be as prescribed by Form No. 41 and postal voting papers shall be as prescribed by Form 12.

13. Any person who has applied for and received a postal voting paper for the purpose of voting shall not be entitled to vote otherwise.
