#### The Factories and Shops Act, 1920. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, { TO WIT. F. A. NEWL-Governor. NEWDEGATE, [L.S.]

WHEREAS it is provided by Subsection (2) of Section 102 of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that, subject to the said Act, the day on which all shops

affected by the said section shall close at one o'clock shall be Saturday, but that the Governor may by Pro-clamation at any time and from time to time on the petition (according to the form in the Sixth Schedule to the said Act) of the majority of the keepers of such shops in any district substitute in that district for shops in any district substitute in that district for Saturday any other week-day: And whereas a petition in due form has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Plan-tagenet Shop District, praying that Thursday may be substituted in that district for Saturday, as the day on which such shops shall close at one o'clock, and it is desirable to accede to the uncover of meth petizion. desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby substi-tute Thursday for Saturday in the Plantagenet Shop District accordingly, and do declare that subject to the reid Act the dery on which all such charge a facencial said Act, the day on which all such shops as aforesaid shall close at one o'clock in the afternoon in the said district shall be Thursday.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this ninth day of March, 1921, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued :-

#### The Land Act, 1898.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 4089/20.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or

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other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 385 for public purposes at Wonnerup should be placed under the control of the Sussex Road Board for public purposes as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Sussex Road Board for public purposes as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919. Determination of Prices. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Commissioners by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the price of the necessary commodity mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodity within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided in all other proclaimed areas.

## THE SCHEDULE.

#### Methylated Spirits.

Whole sale - -

Bottled, six to the gallon-11s. 3d. per doz. bottles. Bottled, twelve to the gallon-6s. 11/2d. per doz. bottles.

In bulk-4s. 3d. per gallon.

Retail-

Bottled, six to the gallon-1s. 2d. per bettle.

Bottled, twelve to the gallon-71/2d. per bottle.

The said wholesale and retail prices include the price of the bottle or container.

When packed for despatch to country centres or outside the Metropolitan Area a packing charge of 9d. per doz, bottles may be added to the wholesale price of the six to the gallon bettles, and 6d. per doz. to the wholesale price of the twelve to the gallon bottles.

The above-mentioned prices, wholesale and retail, have been fixed with due regard to the cost of transport within the Metropolitan Area; within other proclaimed areas the equivalent of any additional cost actually incurred in transportation beyond the Metropolitan Area may be added to the above-mentioned prices,
