### FIRST GRADE BUTTER.

*The Prices Regulation Act, 1919.*

*Determination of Prices.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuff mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such foodstuff within the Metropolitan Area and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

### THE SCHEDULE.

*First Grade Butter.*

Metropolitan Area—

Wholesale—2s. 2d. per pound.

Retail—2s. 5d. per pound.

Within other proclaimed areas the equivalent of any additional cost actually incurred in transportation beyond the Metropolitan Area may be added to the above-mentioned prices.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the fourteenth day of April, 1921.
