KNOW ye that We do by these Our Letters Patent, issued in Our name by Our Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, appoint you to be Commissioners to inquire into and report upon the incidence of Commonwealth taxation, and into and upon any amendments which are necessary or desirable, with a view to placing the system of taxation upon a sound and equitable basis, having regard generally to the public interest and particularly to—

1. The equitable distribution of the burdens of taxation;
2. The harmonisation of Commonwealth and State taxation;
3. The giving to primary producers of special consideration as regards the assessment of income tax, particularly in relation to losses resulting from adverse weather conditions; and
4. The simplification of the duties of taxpayers in relation to returns and in relation to objections and appeals;

And We appoint you, the said William Warren Kerr, C.B.E., to be Chairman:

And We require you to report as soon as possible to Our Governor in and over the said State of Western Australia, the result of your inquiries into the matters entrusted to you by these Our Letters Patent, which We declare to be a Royal Commission to which "The Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902," applies.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Vermin Act, 1918."

L. JONES,

REGULATIONS.

1. If and whenever the Minister or a Vermin Board or a Road Board desires to lay poison under Section 126 of the Act, he or it shall specially charge an inspector, or in the case of a Road Board a road board officer, with the duty of laying such poison and making periodical inspections in respect thereof under these regulations, and as often as a vacancy occurs in the office of such inspector or officer it shall be filled by a new appointment.

The expression "the inspector" in these rules means inspector or officer so appointed.

2. Any person laying poison under the said section may by writing under his hand appoint some other person to act in his behalf under these regulations, but he shall be responsible for the acts and defaults of such other person.

3. No poison shall be laid on any road unless at the time notice shall be put up and displayed by the inspector or person laying the poison in conspicuous places not more than one mile apart at the commencement of and along the length of road where such poison is laid, stating the fact that the poison is laid and specifying the length of road along which it is laid; and such notices shall be kept so displayed until the poison has been removed or has become innocuous.

4. All poison which is so laid on any road shall be covered by the inspector or person laying it by not less than one quarter of an inch of loose earth.

5. No poison shall be laid on or in any holding (not being a road) unless and until notices stating the date when it is proposed to commence laying such poison have been—

- (a) placed and conspicuously displayed by the inspector or person intending to lay the poison at or near each gate or entry to such holding; and
- (b) given by such inspector or person (not being the owner or occupier of the holding), to the owner or occupier of the holding.

6. No poison shall be laid in any such holding before the date mentioned as the date of commencement in such notice or at any time whilst such notices are not conspicuously displayed at each gate or entry of the holding.

7. All notices under these regulations shall be in letters not less than two inches in length.

8. In these regulations "road" includes any road within the meaning of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and also a stock route.

9. Any contravention on the part of any person, whether by act or omission, of these regulations shall render such person liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

10. These regulations shall be read and construed with the Vermin Act Regulations, 1919.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1920.

Between the Coastal Dairymen's Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and
The Metropolitan Retail Dairymen's Industrial Union of Employers; and Perth and District Milk Producers' Association Industrial Union of Employers, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Scope of Award.*—(a.) This award shall apply to employers engaged in the production of milk within the area covered by this award for sale and retail delivery within the metropolitan area, and to employers engaged in the retail delivery of milk within the said metropolitan area, and to workers employed by such employers in connection therewith.

(b.) For the purpose of this award the metropolitan area shall mean the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2. *Hours.*—The week's work shall consist of fifty hours actual work exclusive of holidays and meal hours.

3. *Overtime.*—All time worked in excess of the usual working hours in any one day, except in any week in which a public holiday shall occur, or beyond fifty hours in the week, shall be paid for as overtime at the rate of time and a-half.

4. *Holidays.*—The worker shall be allowed a half-holiday on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, New Year's Day, Eight Hours' Day, and every Sunday, and on some day during each week as shall be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

Should the worker be called upon to work more than five hours on any of the aforesaid days he shall, in addition to his weekly wage, be paid at the rate of two shillings per hour or fraction of an hour for all time worked beyond such five hours.

In addition to the aforesaid holidays, the worker shall be entitled to seven consecutive days holiday per annum on full pay, or shall be paid *pro rata* if the employment terminates before the year is completed.

5. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of pay for a milk carter or a yardman (other than a junior worker) shall be four pounds five shillings per week, without board and lodging, and shall be paid in cash.

Foremen or leading hands shall be paid one shilling per day extra for seven days per week.

In establishments where a yardman is employed, one junior worker may be employed to assist in yardman's work.

A "junior worker" shall mean a worker under the age of nineteen years employed as assistant yardman. The minimum wage payable to junior workers shall be determined in accordance with the following scale:—

Junior worker up to 17 years—£2 2s. 6d. per week.

Junior worker up to 18 years—£2 13s. per week.

Junior worker up to 19 years—£3 3s. per week.

No junior worker shall be employed upon a retail delivery cart.

6. *Board and Lodging.*—Unless it be impracticable for a worker to secure other suitable accommodation within half-a-mile of his employer's premises, he shall not board or lodge with his employer.

In case the worker shall lodge with his employer, no charge shall be made in respect of such lodging unless the employer shall provide a suitable room and bedding, and in no case shall the charge for such lodging exceed five shillings per week.

7. *Record Book.*—Each employer shall keep a time and wages book, which shall show the name of each

worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the total hours and the amount of overtime worked, the wages paid and the worker's signature for same. The employer and worker shall both be responsible for the posting of the book. The said book shall be available for inspection by a representative of the Union at least once in each month during working hours, and shall be entered up at least once a week.

8. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. *Area.*—This award shall apply over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division.

10. *Term.*—This award shall continue in force for a period of one year from its date.

In witness whereof this award has been signed by the President of the Court, and the Seal of the Court has been hereto affixed, this sixth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.
