WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from

- (a.) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;
- (b.) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c.) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian Waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of June, 1921, until the 30th day of September, 1921.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," and as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council, determine the maximum prices, whether wholesale or retail, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of landing, manufacturing, lauded delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodities within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment Act and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council, determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed deon the basis of producing, mandateturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuffs mentioned in paragraph 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs in the areas set out in the Second Schedule hereto, and as provided by paragraph 1 (d) of the First Schedule in all other proclaimed areas; and that the prices of the foodstuffs mentioned in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs subject to subparagraph (c) thereof.

The Judge may state a case for the opinion of the Full Court on any question of law and the Full Court shall have power to decide the question submitted, and may either remit the case back to the Judge with a note of their decision or, without remitting the case, dispose of the appeal in such manner as shall be just and consistent with such decision.

6. Orders LXIV., LXV., and LXX. of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, shall, so far as applicable, apply to and in respect of these rules and proceedings thereunder.

7. (1) In these rules "order" means assessment, order, direction, decision or act.
