THE PRICES REGULATION ACT, 1919.

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to revoke the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 27th May, 1921, and to authorise the following Order in Council reducing the prices of imported Bran and Pollard. The prices of local Offal remain unaltered.

Bran and Pollard. The Prices Regulation Act, 1919-1920. Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment Act and Continuance Act, 1920,' the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council, determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any pro-claimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuffs mentioned in paragraph 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs in the areas set out in the Second Schedule hereto, and as provided by paragraph 1 (d) of the First Schedule in all other proclaimed areas; and that the prices of the foodstuffs mentioned in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule shall be the maximum prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs subject to subparagraph (e) thereof.

The maximum prices at which Bran and Pollard may be sold or supplied shall be as follows:-

- 1. If the produce of mills in Western Australia-
 - (a) Wholesale—delivery at mill door or on rail at mill siding-
 - (1) In lots of half a ton or over, £11 per ton of 2,000 lbs. (2s. 6d. per ton may be added to this price when booked for more than seven days).
 - (2) In lots of less than half a ton direct to consumers, not being wholesalers or retailers, for the purpose of resale, 2s. 5d. per bushel.

 - (b) Wholesale, except as above—
 (1) In lots of half a ton or over shall be £12 2s. per ton of 2,000 lbs., delivery free at wholesaler's store (2s. 6d. per ton may be added to this price when booked for more than seven days).
 - (2) In lots of less than half a ton, 2s. 6d. per bushel.

- (c) By retailers, if in lots of one bag or more, 2s. 9d. per bushel, or lesser quantities 2s. 11d. per bushel (delivery free at retailer's shop).
- (d) Within all proclaimed areas other than those mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, the equivalent of any additional cost actually incurred in transportation of bran and pollard beyond the said areas specified in the Second Schedule may be added to the abovementioned prices.
- 2. If imported into Western Australia-
 - (a) Wholesale-in any quantities-
 - (1) Ex store, Fremantle, at the rate of £13 per ton of 2,000 lbs., and
 - (2) Ex store, Perth, at the rate of £13 7s. 6d. per ton of 2,000 lbs.
 - (b) Retail in bag lots, or broken quantities, delivery free at retailer's shop—

 (1) Fremantle, 2s. 11d. per bushel.

 (2) Perth, 3s. per bushel.

The above-mentioned wholesale and retail prices for imported Bran and Pollard have been fixed with due regard to the cost of transport within the metropolitan area; within other proclaimed areas, the equivalent of any additional cost actually incurred in transportation beyond the metropolitan area may be added to the above-mentioned prices.

THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1920. Regulations.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council may make Regulations under the provisions of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1520 : Now, therefore, MIL. Excellency the Governor in Council, acting in pursuance or such powers, and on the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations:-

Repeal of Existing Regulations.

All regulations heretofore made under the provisions of "The Factories Act, 1904," and "The Early Closing Act, 1902," and all amendments thereof, are hereby repealed; but such repeal shall not affect any proceedings taken or things lawfully done or agreed or prescribed to be done under or in pursuance of the provisions thereof.

Every factory, shop, or warehouse and every portion thereof shall contain such cubic reserved space as shall be determined by the Chief Inspector, provided always that such reserved space shall not be less than 350 cubic feet for each person employed therein (exclusive of the space occupied by goods, cases, furniture and fittings). When gas is used as an illuminant 350 cubic feet of air space shall be deducted for each light.

In the calculation of cubic space the maximum height taken shall be 14 feet.

Ventilation.

Section 63 (c).

21. Every factory, shop, or warehouse, or portion thereof shall, when required by an Inspector, be provided with means of ventilation by openings for the inlet and outlet of air in the proportion of not less than 12 square inches inlet and 12 square inches outlet openings, irrespective of window or door openings, for each person employed in such factory, shop, or warehouse, or portion thereof. Such space shall be calculated exclusive of all bars, ornamentations, or other obstruction.

The provisions of this regulation shall not, unless considered necessary by the Inspectors, apply to a factory in which there is a fireplace with chimney, and a window made to open, and in which not more than four persons are employed.

Where in any factory grinding, glazing, or polishing on a wheel or any process is carried on by which dust is generated, and is liable to be inhaled by workers to an injurious extent, and it appears to an Inspector that such inhalation could be to a great extent prevented by the use of a fan or other mechanical means, the Inspector may direct such fan or other mechanical means of a proper construction to be provided within a reasonable

Heating Appliances.

Section 63 (2).

22. Every heating appliance as described in Section 63 (2) shall be supplied with a flue at least 4 inches of the sectional shape. The heating appliances for the irons in use in tailors', dressmakers', and other similar factories shall be as approved by an Inspector.

Lavatories, Etc.

(Section 78).

- 23. In every factory, shop, or warehouse there shall be provided proper lavatory accommodation to the satisfaction of the inspector. Such accommodation shall consist of wash basins, with sufficient water supply, and fitted with trapped waste pipe or pipes connected with a drain. The basins shall not be fewer in number than one to twenty persons employed, and shall be situated under cover and be convenient of access
- 24. (a) In every factory, shop, or warehouse which is connected with any system of sewerage, there shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of employees in accordance with the following scale and conditions:-

- (d) Any closet for the use of females shall have a separate entrance behind such screen, and such entrance shall not be within 12 feet from the entrance of any closet intended for the use of males.
- (e) In every factory, shop, and warehouse, in which more than twelve males are employed, urinal accommodation shall be provided in the proportion of one stall to each 30 employees.
- 25. (a) In every factory, shop, or warehouse, which is not connected with an improved system of sewerage, there shall be provided sanitary conveniences for the use of employees in accordance with the following scale and

- (6) Windows boxed in with wood or glass may be used as a partition to separate the parts if, at the closing hour, the door of the compartment is locked, and if the key thereof is removed;
- (7) Movable shutters of not greater than 1½in. mesh wire framed in wood or iron may be used as a separation, provided they are securely locked to the approval of the inspector, and that the key thereof is removed;
