The Wyalkatchem Road District By-laws. WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any reasons in the said Act mentioned, the Wyalkatchem Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the interpretation set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.
- "Board"—The Wyalkatchem Road Board.
- "Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.
- "District"--The District under the jurisdiction of the Wyalkatchem Road Board.
- "Secretary"-The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Road Districts Act and regulations thereunder.

Meeting and Proceedings.

The Board shall meet at the Board room, Wyalkatchem, on the Saturday nearest before the full moon in every month, at the hour of 10.30 a.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business.

Standing Orders.

- (a.) Minutes.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Correspondence.
- (d.) Business arising out of correspondence.
- (e.) Secretary's report.
- (f.) Supervisor's report.
- (g.) Committee's report.
- (h.) Financial statement.
- (i.) Notices of motion.
- (j.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts,
 - (k.) Passing of accounts for payment.
 - (l.) General business.
- (m.) In the event of any member having any urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move to the suspension of the Standing Orders, and if agreed to by the Board such business shall take precedence to all others.

$Orders\ of\ Debate.$

- (a.) Any two members may require the Board's chamber to be cleared, and the chairman or other presiding chairman shall immediately give direction to have the order executed.
- (b.) Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the chairman so desires, put it into writing to the chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the chairman or other presiding chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.

- (c.) No member shall speak twice upon the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.
- (d.) The chairman or other presiding chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation where misrepresented or misunderstood.
- (e.) Any member moving a motion or an amendment shall be deemed to have spoken on that question.
- (f.) No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any other member.
- (g.) The chairman or other presiding chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his ruling, which decision shall be final unless dissented from by a definite motion to disagree with such ruling.
- (h.) One amendment shall only be discussed at the same time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon but no more.
- (i.) Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and, for all purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.
- (j.) Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make an apology to the Board's satisfaction.
- (k.) Any member using offensive or disorderly language or having been twice called to order or to withdraw or to apologise for such conduct, in refusing to do so shall be guilty of an offence.
- (1.) A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
- (m.) Any member may protest against any resolution of the Board, and notice of such protest shall in every case be entered in the minutes.

Secretary.—The secretary of the Board shall keep the books of the Board, and shall duly keep and enter, in the prescribed Minute Book, minutes of all proceedings of the Board; he shall attend all meetings of the Board (including committee meetings), issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Board or chairman thereof, and in due time, the voters' list for the district and cause them to be affixed as by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act provided, and shall make up and complete under the direction of the Board the Rate Book, and shall under the like direction prepare all annual estimates as by the said Act required; he shall also keep all books required by the said Board, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all other such acts as the Board or chairman thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Board's office during such hours as the Board shall determine, and generally see that the Board's instructions are carried into effect.

Engineer and Supervisor.—The engineer or supervisor for the time being appointed by the Board shall have the immediate care and management and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, posts, fences, drains, and culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, under the possession, power, or control of the Board, and he shall from time to time report to the Board the state, condition, and repair of same, and progress of any works going on therein or thereon or a breach of any By-laws in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, etc.

Collector.—The collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums of money due to the Board, and his receipt on the Board's official form shall be sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him, and all sums so received by the collector shall by him be paid to the secretary of the Board at least weekly.

No officer shall issue a receipt for money received by him except upon the recognised official printed receipt form of the Board.

Election of Officers.

All appointments by the Board shall be effected by voting by ballot.

Tenders to be opened.

Tenders for works shall be addressed to the chairman and delivered at the Board's office, and considered and dealt with at the next meeting of the Board unless otherwise decided by them.

Custody and use of Seal.

- (a.) The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the Board, and shall be responsible for its safe keeping.
- (b.) Attestations under the Board's Scal.—The Secretary shall not affix the common seal to any document without the express order of the Board.

Custody of Records, Journals, etc.

The custody of records, journals, and all documents whatsoever laid before the Board shall be kept in the charge of the secretary, who shall not supply any information, letter, document, or book without the written order of the Board unless authorised by the Act.

Finance Committee.

A finance committee shall consist of the chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such committee shall meet at least one hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day. All accounts, bills, and vouchers, shall be submitted to the finance committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as being correct shall be passed for payment by resolution of the Board, and paid by cheque; each such cheque shall be signed by the chairman and one member of the Board and countersigned by the secretary.

Urgent Works.

The chairman, with one member, or, in absence of the chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £10; any one member is empowered, in case of urgent necessity, to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5. All actions taken under this By-law shall be confirmed at the next meeting.

Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting any petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature of every prayer or petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Walls and Fences.

Every wall or fence to be erected which abuts on any street within the town, to wit, on a street or footpath, shall be substantially built and as follows:—

Fences.—Not less than five wires, posts and top rails, and shall be of a height not less than four feet, or shall be of pickets not less than four feet, and any fence which abuts on any lane or alley shall be a fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act.

Walls.—Not less than 12 inches in width for stone, and 9 inches brick and two feet six inches in height.

Water Supply.

- (a.) Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage for water, or machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be liable for a penalty not exceeding £10, and also shall pay the Board the sum of such damages.
- (b.) Any person who shall waste or allow to escape, foul, or pollute or taint any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
- (c.) No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any water course, pool, well, tank or reservoir, or other water within the district.
- (d) The Board may reserve or restrict the water at any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage within its district for the use of domestic or other purposes, by affixing a notice (duly signed by the Secretary) at such bore, pipe, tank, or reservoir or place of storage, and no person shall use or attempt to use the water whilst so reserved or restricted.
- (e.) Any person using or attempting to use any water for other purposes than those for which it has been reserved or restricted, unless specially authorised by the Board in writing, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable upon conviction to pay any costs for such water as may be imposed by the Board, in addition to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

Offences, Omissions, and Neglects.

Any person guilty of the following offences shall on conviction thereof pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10):—

Danaging or destroying any building, dam, pump, windmill, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fences, gates, or any other property under the control of the Board; blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road, without the permission of the Board in writing and under such conditions as may be imposed by them.

Damaging Roads.

Any person who cuts, disturbs, damages, or interferes in any way with the roads within the Board's district, without the written approval of the Board having first been obtained, shall be guilty of an offence.

Park Lands, etc.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, except as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, and may grant to any responsible person or persons the use of the ground for any specified time or date for holding sports or anusements, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences and buildings and trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed on such occasions. Any person or persons having obtained the use of the ground may make a specific charge with the Board's approval.

- trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed on such occasions. Any person or persons having obtained the use of the ground may make a specific charge with the Board's approval.

 (b.) All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any persons creating a disturbance or annoyance to the general public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.
- (c.) The Board may prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any specified days.

(d.) No person shall sell or offer for sale on any reserve, any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, nor carry on any games or boxing, or any similar shows, nor use any firearms, except with the express sanction of the Board and payment of such fees as may be demanded.

(e.) Such person or persons to whom the use of any reserve is given for any picnics, sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and the deposit of such amount as the Board may decide shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish.

(f.) No person shall injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence.

Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to do the same and charge the cost and expense against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

(b) Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, or permits, or commits any breach or neglect thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board.
