Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the

Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodity mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodity within the Bunbury, Kalgoorlie, and Metropolitan Areas, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations governing the admission of Cadets in the Department of Agriculture.

Regulations governing the admission of Cadets to the Department of Agriculture.

1. An applicant for appointment must not be more than 20 nor less than 16 years of age. He will be required to produce a Government Medical Officer's certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

2. An applicant shall produce evidence of having passed—

(a) The Junior Certificate Examination; or

(b) The Matriculation Examination,

of the University of Western Australia, in such subjects as may be prescribed by the Public Service Commissioner or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Public Service Commissioner, be equivalent thereto.

3. Applications will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement, and the candidate or candidates to be recommended for appointment will be

selected by a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner, the Director, and the Head of the Branch concerned of the Department of Agriculture.

4. Every Cadet shall in the first instance be appointed on probation for a period of six months. Before the expiration of the period of probation the Permanent Head shall report to the Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report the Commissioner will confirm, annul or extend the period of probation of the Cadetship for a further period not exceeding six months.

5. A Cadet's term of service shall be on a basis of four years, but this may be reduced on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner on account of the higher qualifications which may be possessed by any candidate. In such cases the Public Service Commissioner, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, shall decide the commencing salary.

6. The remuneration, except where otherwise provided shall be on the following scale subject to the provisions of Clauses 7 to 9:—

First year, £72; second year, £78; third year, £84; fourth year, £90. (Inclusive of all sustenance and field allowances.)

7. When a Cadet has completed one-half of the prescribed term of service, if in the opinion of the Permanent Head of the Department, his progress has not been satisfactory, his services may be dispensed with, on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

8. During his term of service a Cadet will be required to undergo such course of training and pass such examinations as may be prescribed by the Head of the Department and approved by the Public Service Commissioner.

9. Cadets will be allowed such leave of absence as may be necessary to attend day lectures in approved subjects at the University of Western Australia at such times as the by-laws of the University may provide.

10. Upon passing his final examination a Cadet shall receive a qualifying certificate approved by the Public Service Commissioner and signed by the Permanent Head of the Department concerned.

11. Should a cadet fail to obtain a qualifying certificate his term of service may be extended, with the approval of the Public Service Commissioner, for a period not exceeding two years.

12. A Cadet, after he has received his qualifying certificate shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years at a salary in accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged, but at not less than at the rate of £240 per annum.

13. If the cadet is under 21 years of age when he obtains his certificate of qualification, the Commissioner may extend his cadetship, and fix the salary to be paid until he reaches that age.

14. During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and Regulations relating to the permanent staff as far as applicable. His service qualifying him for long service leave, however, shall not count until he has been permanently appointed after the completion of his Cadetship.

15. An agreement and bond, with approved sureties, in a form to be prescribed to be executed for the due performance of all the terms herein specified.

Constitution of Health District at Yearling under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.P.H. No. 4605; Ex. Co. 3871.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Yearling Health District.

Boundaries:—All that area comprising a radius of 1½ miles from the South-Eastern corner of Reserve 12516 (etched on plan).
