WHEREAS under the provision of "The Hospitals Act, 1894," the Board of Management of any Public Hospital may, with the approval of the Government, make rules and Regulations for the purposes in the said Act specified, and may vary any rules and regulations so made: Now, therefore, the Board of Management of the Perth Public Hospital, pursuant to the powers by the said Act conferred, does hereby amend the Rules and Regulations heretofore in force for the management of the said Public Hospital, in the manner following:—

Rule 27.—Add—Discharges of patients from hospital shall be made daily, at an hour to be decided by resolution of the Board from time to time; except in any special case, when discharge may be arranged at a time arranged with the officer dealing with the final discharge of patients.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 14 of 1920.

Between Cleaners, Carctakers, and Lift Attendants' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Australian Mutual Provident Society; Elder, Smith, & Company, Limited; Neil McNeil; Swan River Institute; and T. Martin, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties.

AWARD.

- 1. Term.—The award shall operate for a period of twelve months from the 11th day of October, 1921.
- 2. Area.—The award shall operate over an area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.
- 3. Rates of Pay.—The minimum rates of pay shall be as follows:—

Cleaner (male)—£4 per week of 48 hours.

Cleaner (male) who is also caretaker and required to remain at night on premises of employer— £4 6s. per week of 48 hours.

Cleaner (female), including wife of cleaner who is required to remain at night on premises of employer if she also is employed in cleaning premises—1s. 6d. per hour with minimum of 25 hours per week.

Window cleaner (male)—£4 6s. per week of 48 hours. (This rate shall not apply to ordinary cleaners in a building who may be called upon by the employer to clean windows in the ordinary course of their duties.)

Lift attendant (adult)—£3 15s, per week of 48 hours.

Lift attendant (junior)-

Male:

Between 18 and 19 years—£1 15s. per week of 48 hours.

Between 19 and 20 years—£2 3s, per week of 48 hours.

Between 20 and 21 years—£2 16s. per week of 48 hours.

Female:

Between 18 and 19 years—£1 10s, per week of 48 hours.

Between 19 and 20 years—£1 13s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Between 20 and 21 years—£2 4s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

The above wages shall be payable every Friday.

No person under the age of 18 years shall be employed as a lift attendant.

The maximum number of hours per week for lift attendants shall be forty-eight, except at overtime rates.

Part time or Casual Employee: Any female employee who is employed for less than 25 hours per week shall be paid 1s. 9d. per hour with a minimum engagement of two hours.

Cleaners required to live on the premises of the employer, in addition to the above wages shall be provided free of charge with quarters, fuel, water, and light.

. Except in the case of part time or casual employees the employment shall be a weekly service.

- 4. Hours of Cleaners (including window cleaners).—Cleaners' hours shall be arranged to suit the business of the employer, but shall not begin before 6 a.m., nor continue on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday after 7 p.m., nor on Saturday after 3 p.m., except at overtime rates.
- 5. Overtime.—For all time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time, or during meal hours, or beyond a maximum of 48 hours per week, time and a half rates shall be paid. For all time worked after the usual finishing time on Saturdays, and for all work done on public holidays and Sundays, double time shall be paid.

For the purpose of this clause, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be public holidays

6. High Cleaning.—Any cleaner who is required to clean windows where it is necessary to go wholly outside the window, or climb round an outside column in order to do such cleaning, shall, if such cleaning or climbing is at a height of more than 10ft. from the ground or verandah, be paid 3d. extra for each such window: Provided that when the outside window ledge or column ledge is more than 24 inches wide, or when an efficient safety device is provided, this clause shall not apply: Provided further that nothing in this clause shall apply to cleaning from a ladder resting on the ground.

No female cleaner shall be permitted to do outside cleaning except when standing on the ground or on a balcony or verandali.

- 7. Annua' Leave.—After the conclusion of one year's service all workers employed by the week shall be granted 14 days' holiday on full pay. If the service be terminated before the completion of one year's service, one additional day's pay shall be granted for each month's service.
- 8. Tools, etc.—Workers shall be provided with all necessary tools and materials free of charge.
- 9. Record Book.—A time and wage book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each employee, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the union during the hours the employer's place of business is open: Provided that this clause shall not apply to any employer who employs only one part time or casual employee.
- 10. Aged and Infirm Employees .- Any employee who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lower rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within 24 hours after such employee shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his-or her desire that such wage shall be agreed stating his-or her desire that such wage shall be agreed upony, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such employee after 24 hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him or her to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the application of the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned. the employee shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.
