W. McGregor, J. Walker, W. G. Jonassen, and T. G. Adams as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penaltics not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

To provide Restrictions as to Hawkers.

1. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, within any part of the district, without having first obtained a license from the Board.

Any person who travels and trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell, or expose, or offer for sale, within the limits aforesaid, any of the articles or things aforesaid shall be deemed to hawk the same.

3. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct, at any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed.

4. Licenses for hawkers shall be in the Form X of the schedule, and for stalls in the Form Z in the schedule.

5. Every hawker, while employed in hawking, shall produce his license upon being required by any constable or any officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his coat, barrow, basket, vehicle, or dray, a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly printed thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.
6. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to

stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 8 p.m.

and 2 a.m.
7. The following fees shall be paid for licenses to hawkers or stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if any payment be not paid when due the license shall be void:-

Hawkers' Licenses. For every hawker with hand basket or tray—1s. per month.

For every hawker with wheelbarrow or hand cart-2s. per month.

For every hawker with vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal—3s. per month.

Stall Licenses. For every stall—10s. per month.

8. Every licensed hawker and stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the Secretary or other authorised officer of the Board.

9. No person to whom a hawker's or stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license granted, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself, unless by written consent of the Secretary.

#### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUS-TRALIA,

No. 2 of 1921,

Between United Metropolitan Timber-yards Sawmills aud Woodworkers Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Timber Merchants' Association of Western Australia, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties.

#### AWARD.

- Hours.—(a) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers in the industry except those
- hereinafter specifically provided for.

  (b) The hours of labour for stablemen shall be 51 per week, including not more than three hours on Sunday.
- (c) The hours of duty for night-watchmen shall not exceed ten hours for seven days per week.
- (d) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for horse-drivers, such forty-eight hours to be exclusive of meal time and also of such time as is required for grooming, harnessing, and unharnessing horses.
- Overtime.-Overtime at the rate of time and ahalf shall be paid for all time worked after the hour of 5 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and after the hour of noon on Saturday of each

Provided that in the case of horse-drivers overtime shall not include time spent in harnessing, unharnessing, and grooming the horse, for which 6d. per day will be

allowed in addition to the wage fixed.

There shall be a few minutes give and take, on either side, in the case of horse-drivers. The above overtime rate shall not apply to night-watchmen or stablemen, who when working in excess of the prescribed hours shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 3d. per hour extra in the case of night-watchmen, and 1s. 8d. per hour extra in the case of stablemen.

- 3. Holidays.—The following holidays shall be observed and paid for:—Labour Day, New Year's Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, and Anzac Day. If a holiday falls on a Sunday, the worker shall be allowed a part of the day in lieu thereof or a day's be allowed some other day in lieu thereof or a day's pay.
- 4. Record Book.—Each employer shall keep a record of the time worked and the wages paid to each worker, including overtime. Such record shall be available, during working hours, for inspection by the secretary or other person appointed by the Union.
- 5. Under-rate Workers .- A worker who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the worker's union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and

his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause. Provided always, that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

- 6. Apprentices.—(i.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.
- (ii.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.
- (iii.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.
- (iv.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every four machinists or fraction of the first four employed by each employer or firm of employers for the twelve

months previous to engaging the apprentice.

(v.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of machinists employed on all working days of

the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of machinists employed.

(vi.) The term of apprenticeship to the machining branch of the trade shall be four years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed por-

tion of the term of apprenticeship.

(vii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(viii.) The following provisions shall apply in respect

of all apprenticeships:

(a) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (xiv.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(b) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

- (e) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he ueglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (d) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).
- (ix.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:-

During the first year's service, £1 10s. per week.

During the second year's service, £1 18s. 6d. per week.

During the third year's service, £2 9s. per week. During the fourth year's service, £2 16s. per week.

The minimum wage of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration by the Court when the wages of workers under this award are being reviewed or a new award is made.

(x.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(xi.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(xii.) The examination will be held in the month of August in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the Association and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or failing such nomination or nominations such person or persons as may be nominated for that purpose by the Court or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xiii.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(xiv.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (ix.) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(xv.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this award under the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xvi.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

Junior Labour.-Youths under the age of 19 years may be employed to perform the ordinary duties of tailers-out from woodworking machines; provided always that the number of youths employed shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one such youth to every four machinists, other than sawyers, permanently employed by the employers.

- 8. A night-watchman if called upon in the night time to do work other than that of attending to boiler fires, shall be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour for the time so occupied, in addition to the night-watchman's wage.
- Blowers.—In addition to the blowers already in-9 stalled the employer shall attach blowers to all flooring machines, moulding machines, thicknessers, and roller sand-papering machines, and to any other machine injurious to health.
- 10. Casual Labour.-Workers with week's service shall be paid 1s. in addition to the ordinary daily wage,
- 11. Mixed Functions.—Any worker carrying work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any day shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that day, provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole day.
- 12. No reduction.—This award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who is at present receiving above the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.
- 13. Term of Award.—The award shall operate for a term of three years from its date, and shall be subject to revision at the end of each period of twelve months from its date.
- Area.—The award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.
