WESTERN AUSTRALIA, ( By His Excellency Sir Francis Alex-TO WIT. ) ander Newdegate, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of F. A. NEWDEGATE, Governor. in and over the State of Western L.S.] the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is provided by Ordinance 37 Victoria, No. 14, that the Governor may from time to time frame, vary, or alter rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance for the preservation of good order within all ports or harbours or any port or harbour, to be observed by all persons whatsoever, but so that such rules and regulations shall come into force on the publication of the same in the Government Gazette: Now therefore 1, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Execu-tive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of all other powers by me in this behalf enabling, do hereby frame and enact the regulations set out hereunder:-

1. The following regulations shall be observed in connection with the shipping of cattle at any port in Western Australia, except Bunbury and Fremantle.

A suitable race shall be used along which the cattle shall be driven on board ship, but in the case of any animal which it is not practicable to drive on board owing to its wildness or for any other reason, such animal may be slung by means of belly slings or boxes, but not otherwise.

3. The animals shall be carried in pens.

The stanchions of each pen shall be securely fastened to the deck by means of iron sockets or otherwise, and the materials used in the construction of the pens shall be of a substantial character, and of suffi-cient strength to withstand the action of the weather, and to resist the weight of the animals thrown against them.

The floor of each pen shall, in order to prevent slipping, be fitted with suitable battens or other footholds.

6. Animals while on board a vessel shall be protected against injury or unnecessary suffering from undue exposure to the weather.

7. All parts of the vessel on which animals are carried shall be sufficiently and suitably ventilated. All such parts if below deek shall, in addition to any ven-tilation obtained by means of the hatchways, be pro-vided with sufficient and suitable ventilators for the removal of foul air and for the admission of a proper supply of fresh air to all the animals carried.

8. When the cattle are to be carried on a voyage which under ordinary conditions would take more than 18 hours, there shall be provided on the ship a sufficiency of food for the animals to the satisfaction of the Har-bour Master, and there shall also be provided to his satisfaction suitable protection for the food so that such food shall not be unduly exposed to the weather, and the ship shall not be taken out of the port unless this regulation has been accurated. this regulation has been complied with.

The Harbour Master may take such measures as 9 shall be reasonably necessary to prevent any infraction of these regulations and the shipping of any cattle otherwise than in conformity with these regulations.

10. For the purpose of seeing that all or any of these regulations are carried out, the Water Police, in uniform, shall have access to any vessel at any hour of the day and night, and shall be allowed and authorised to ask any reasonable questions of the master of the vessel, or of any officer thereof, and any information required shall, in all cases, be furnished.

11. Any contravention or attempted contravention of these regulations by the act or omission of any person shall render such person liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare (inter alia) what length of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when use or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, declare and proclaim as follows:

That nets which do not exceed in length 100 fathoms (200 yards) and the size of mesh or any part thereof is not less than  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted and ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall when used or intended to be used for lawful fishing in the waters defined in the Schedule hereto be lawful nets, and that it shall not be lawful to use in such water any net (other than a prawn net, defined in a separate Proclamation) not in conformity with these conditions.

#### Schedule.

The waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers upwards (or Easterly) of a line drawn from the South-Western extremity of Point Resolution to Point Walter Jetty, to a line drawn from the Jetty at Mill Point to the Harbour and Light Department's Jetty at Mount Eliza, and to the Lower Canning Bridge.

#### Regulations under Part V.

1. In any proceeding for the purpose of

 (a) classifying licensed premises, or
 (b) declaring that licenses shall cease to be in force,

under section eighty of "The Licensing Act, 1911," sufficient notice shall be deemed to have been given to all persons who may be directly affected by the determination of the Licensing Court in such proceeding if one week's notice of the date, time, and place of the sitting of the Court for the purposes aforesaid is served on each liceusee of licensed premises which may be affected by the decision of the Court and also published in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper circulating in the licensing district.

2. Notice of a sitting of the Court for the purpose of classifying licensed premises may be combined in one document with notice of a sitting for the purpose of declaring that licenses shall cease to be in force.

3. No proceeding shall be deemed to be invalid merely on the ground that notice has not been given as prescribed in these regulations.

#### AWARD.

1. Scope .- The award shall apply to all persons employed in the fruit-growing industry, including pruners, pickers, packers, case-makers, plowmen, horse-drivers, cellarmen, and all other workers employed in the said industry not covered by any existing award.

2. Area .- The award shall apply to the South-West Land Division.

3. Term.—The term of the award shall be for three years, with the right to apply after twelve months for alteration or revision.

Spraying: Workers engaged spraying or swabbing using sulphuric acid to be paid 1s. 6d. per day or part of day in excess of rates prescribed for general workers with minimum payment of 30s. and maximum of 60s. in any one season. Spraying with lime sulphur, 1s. per day extra.

5. Stablemen's Leave.-Stablemen shall be entitled to one working day off per month and one week's holiday on full pay each year.

6. *Hours.*—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work.

7. Starting and Finishing Time.—On the first five days of the week 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., and 7 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided that by mutual arrangement the forty-eight hours may be worked on the first five working days of the week.

8. Overtime.—For all time on duty before starting or after finishing time, or after 8% hours worked on any of the first five days of the week, or after 4% hours on Saturday, payment in addition to the weekly wage shall be made at the rate of time and a-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter; provided that for work performed on the afternoon of Saturday time and a-quarter shall be paid in addition to the weekly wage, and not less than one half-day's work shall be paid at this rate.

9. Sunday Time.—For all time of duty on Sunday (with exceptions hereinafter mentioned) payment in addition to the weekly rates shall be double time. Under four hours to count as half-a-day; over four hours, a full day. The exceptions are stablemen and drivers attending horses. 10. Drivers feeding Horses on Sundays.—Drivers attending to horses on Sunday shall be paid, in addition to the weekly wage, 2s. for one horse and 6d. for each additional horse.

11. Payment for Holidays.—For all time on duty on holidays mentioned in the next clause payment shall be made, in addition to the weekly wage, at the rate of ordinary time, stablemen excepted.

12. Holidays.—The following days shall be observed as holidays:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Royal Show Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. Provided that for each holiday occurring on Monday to Friday inclusive the week's work shall be reduced by S<sup>\*</sup><sub>4</sub> hours. Provided that when Christmas Day and New Year's Day occur on Sunday, the holiday shall be observed on the next working day. Provided further that outside a radius of 30 miles from Perth Post Office the nearest local Show Day shall be substituted for the Royal Show Day.

13. Record Book.—The employer shall keep and enter up or cause to be kept and entered up a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this award applies, and the time worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker. Such book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the union or some other person authorised in writing by the president of the union at all reasonable times.

14. *Higher Duties.*—A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this award than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

15. Engagement.—One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement except in the case of a casual hand: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties, or if after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to receiving such notice. Provided also that (except for the reasons mentioned in the first proviso of this clause) the engagement shall not be terminated by any notice expiring within a week of the Christmas or Easter holidays if it is intended to re-engage the employee immediately or very shortly after holidays mentioned. Employers must state when engaging employees whether they are casual or permanent. Any employee after twelve weeks' consecutive employment shall be deemed a permanent hand.

16. *Reduction.*—This award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this award is receiving a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

17. Lodging Allowance.—Where an employer boards an employee, he shall be entitled to charge 27s. per week for such accommodation.

Under-rate Workers .--- A worker who is unable to 18. earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the workers' union. If within seven days after being notified of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magisgive such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause. Provided always, that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.
