WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare the close season for any particular native game, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more districts thereof to be defined in any such Proclamation: And whereas the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration any defined locality: And whereas it is desirable to exercise the powers hereinbefore mentioned, in the manner hereinafter set out: Now there-

fore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the close season throughout the State for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be as set out in the second column thereof, opposite the name of such kind of game: And I do further, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim and declare that the portions of the State defined in the third column of the Schedule hereto shall be districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the close season for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule shall be as set out in the second column of such Schedule, opposite the name of such kind of game, and that such close season shall be operative in the district mentioned in the third column of such Schedule, opposite the statement of such close season and not elsewhere.

The Proclamations dated 31st October, 1917, 27th September, 1919, and 2nd December, 1920, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of 9th November, 1917, 3rd October, 1919, and 10th December, 1920, respectively, are hereby revoked.

Kind of Native Game.	Statement of Close Season.	District within which Close Season operates.
Wild Ducks of all species	From the beginning of June to 5 o'clock in the morning of the 23rd December, in every year	District A.—The whole of the State with the exception of that portion within the boundaries of the East Murchison Goldfield and the Kimberley Division as defined in "The Land Act, 1898," other than that portion described in District B.
Wild Ducks of all species	From midnight, 31st December, to midnight, 31st May, in every year	District B.—Broome—Bounded on the North by the 17° South Latitude on the East by 124° East Longitude; on the South by the 19° South Latitude and on the West by the sea coast.

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919/20.

Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuffs mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail prices that may be charged for such foodstuffs within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Students will be admitted to classes in accordance with the following Regulations:—

1. *Class Fees:*

(a) Students under 21 years of age at the date of entry during the school year, who take subjects involving class attendance of not less than four hours per week, may be granted free tuition.

Students receiving free tuition will be charged laboratory fees of 10s. per term in Chemistry, Assaying, Physics, and in such other classes as may be determined by the Hon. the Minister for Mines.

Students in receipt of free tuition shall pay a registration fee of 5s. for the school year.

(b) Other students will be required to pay class fees.

(c) All fees are payable in advance.

2. *Conditions of Entry:*

The following may be admitted to all classes for one year:—

(a) Students over 14 holding a pass-out Certificate from the Continuation Classes, or an 8th Class Certificate.

(b) Students over 15 years who have passed through the 7th Class in a State School or its equivalent.

(c) In Science classes students over 17 years of age who show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction will be admitted.

(d) In miscellaneous classes, students over 16 years of age who show that they are capable of profiting by the instruction will be admitted.

3. Students who complete a year's work satisfactorily may have their right of free tuition renewed for another year.

4. Where it is considered necessary, the Director may insist upon a student taking a subsidiary or allied subject in addition to that for which he has applied.

5. Returned soldiers and children of fallen and incapacitated soldiers and winners of Government scholarships and bursaries will be exempt from payment of fees.

6. The following will be exempt from the registration fee for the ensuing year:—

(a) Students who comply with the regulations and pass the class examinations.

(b) Students who have qualified for an 8th Class State School Certificate or a Continuation Class Pass-out Certificate or have passed in English and Arithmetic at the Continuation Classes.

7. The right to free tuition, and with it the registration and laboratory fees, may be forfeited for irregular attendance, unsatisfactory progress, or misconduct on the part of the student.

8. For Chemistry, Assaying, Physics, and such other classes as may be determined, each student may be required to deposit an amount of £1 to cover breakages. Should this amount prove insufficient, further deposits may be required. Refunds, equal to the unused balance of the deposits, will be made to students at the end of the school year.

9. Students may be required to bring their own apparatus and material for class-work.

10. In the enrolment of students preference may be given to those whose occupations indicate that the class-work will be of special value to them.

11. A student may be refused admission to a class—

(a) If the number of other students is insufficient.

(b) If the class is full.

(c) If application is made after the first month of the school year.

(d) If, in the opinion of the Director, the student is not fitted for the work of the class.

(e) If the student does not comply with the regulations.

12. The school year will consist of three terms, each of 12 weeks.

13. Students who make 75 per cent. of the possible attendances for the year will be qualified to sit for the annual examinations. Exemption allowing a smaller attendance may be granted in special circumstances.

14. Class Certificates will be issued on the results of the examinations.

15. Students who are first in order of merit, and obtain a credit pass in any subject at the annual examinations, will be granted free tuition for one year in the next grade of that subject, or if there is no further grade, in a subject approved by the Director.

- (f) Composition fee for attendance in three or more courses, two of which involve laboratory work, £16 16s. per annum.

(ii) *Faculties of Science and Engineering*—

- (a) For single first year courses not including laboratory or field work, £1 5s. per term per course.
- (b) For single first year courses including laboratory or field work, £1 15s. per term per course.
- (c) For single second, third, fourth, and fifth year courses not including laboratory or field work, £1 10s. per term per course.
- (d) For single second, third, fourth, and fifth year courses including laboratory or field work, £2 5s. per term per course.
- (e) Alternatively—Composition fee for all the courses prescribed for any one year if taken in one session, £16 16s. per annum.

(iii) *All Faculties*—

For short courses such fees as may be determined from time to time by the Senate, on the recommendation of the Professorial Board.

2. *Bursaries.*—The Senate shall have power in any year to award bursaries of a total value not exceeding twenty per cent. of the revenue derived from fees received under this Statute during the preceding year, and for 1922 of a total value not exceeding £500.

## FORESTS ACT, 1918.

*Forest Regulations.*

Forests Department,

F.D. 1505/20. Perth, 23rd November, 1921.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Forests Act, 1918," and on the recommendation of the Acting Conservator of Forests, to approve of the following amendment to the Second Schedule to the Forest Regulations, 1920, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th October, 1921:—

Under the heading "Royalties payable under Permits"—

(1.) A proviso is inserted after the words and figures "From permits within 1-20 miles inclusive from main line siding to port, £0 0s. 3.7d. per cubic foot. Hewn jarrah and karri sleepers double the above rates," as follows:—

Provided that part payment of the abovementioned royalties on all timber sawn or hewn by permit holders between the 1st day of November, 1921, and the 31st day of January, 1922, may be accepted at the following rates:—

Jarrah and karri logs in the round, £0 0s. 0.6d. per cubic foot;

Hewn jarrah and karri sleepers measured in the square, £0 0s. 1.2d. per cubic foot;

and the balance of such royalty shall be payable on the 15th day of February, 1922, unless this regulation shall be amended in whole or in part prior to that date.

(2.) After the words "hewn jarrah or karri sleepers" the words "measured in the square" are inserted.

(3.) The words "provided that if payment is made within the month within which accounts are rendered, a discount of 15 per centum will be allowed," are transposed to follow the words "Royalty on mallet bark, 10s. per ton."

(4.) Under the heading "Inspection Fees" the words "For all sawn and hewn timber inspected by an officer of the Forests Department, an inspection fee of £0 0s. 1.2d. per cubic foot shall be charged and payable" are omitted, and the following words are inserted in place thereof:—

"Sawn and hewn timber for railway sleepers, £0 0s. 0.6d. per cubic foot.

Other sawn and hewn timber, £0 0s. 0.8d. per cubic foot.

Piles, poles, and beams, one-third of the royalty."

And in the second proviso the words "sawn and hewn," in line four, and the words "and for piles, poles, and beams one-third of the royalty," in lines seven and eight, are omitted.
