13," it is provided the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare (inter alia) what length of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, declare and proclaim or follows: as follows:

That with respect to fishing nets known as Whiting Nets, for catching fish of the species set out in the First Schedule hereto, to be used in all tidal waters open to net-fishing at Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) from the 31st day of March to the 31st day of October in each year, a net with the length of net and size of mesh as set out in the Carried Schedule hereto here here here here to be a set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be a lawful net.

First Schedule. Whiting only. Second Schedule.

Total length of net, not exceeding 150 fathoms. Length of bunt, not more than one third of the total length of the net.

Mesh of bunt, not less than 134 inches.

Length of wing, not less than the length of the bunt nor less than one-third of the total length of the net. Mesh of wing, not less than 21/4 inches.

The Pearling Act, 1912-19.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-19," it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a pearl-shell area and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shell within or from the portion so closed, for a specific period: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of the Shark Bay Pearl-Shell Area known as South Passage Section, other than those portions held under Exclusive License, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from that portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the above-men-tioned portion of the said Pearl-Shell Area shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a period of twelve (12) menthe from the late of the rubic of the Ol months from the date of the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette.

Vermin Boards Act, 1909. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1113/20.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dedi-cate as a State Forest any Crown Land: And whereas it is desirable to dedicate the Crown Land described in the first schedule hereto as portion of a State Forest: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the area described in the first schedule hereto as an addition to a State Forest, namely, State Forest No. 4, the total boundaries of which will in future be set out in the second schedule hereto.

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919/20. Determination of Prices. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Conneil determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, that may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the necessary commodities mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale and retail prices that may be charged for such necessary commodities within the Metropolitan Area, and, subject as therein provided, in all other proclaimed areas.

The above-mentioned wholesale and retail prices have been fixed with due regard to the cost of transport within the Metropolitan Area; within other proclaimed areas the equivalent of any additional cost actually incurred in transportation beyond the metropolitan area may be added to the above-mentioned prices.

This Order in Council shall take effect as from the 5th day of December, 1921.

WHEAT MARKETING ACT, 1921.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Excentive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under "The Wheat Marketing Act, 1921,"

Regulation.

1. During such time as Section 6 of "The Wheat Marketing Act, 1921," has effect, the Minister shall by order under his hand exempt, either generally or in any particular case, from the operation of the said section:---

- (a) Sales or purchases of seed wheat by wheatgrowers to or from wheat-growers for bonâ fide use by the purchasers in their farming operations;
- (b) Sales of wheat by wheat-growers and purchases of wheat from wheat-growers, for the personal use of the purchasers and not for the purpose of trading in wheat or the products of wheat;
