PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Francis AlexTO WIT. ander Newdegate, Knight Commander
of the Most Distinguished Order of
St. Michael and St. George, Governor
in and over the State of Western
Australia and its Dependencies in
the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit (inter alia) all persons from-

(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture,

in any specifièd portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the date of the publication in the Government Gazette of this Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1922, inclusive: And further that any net which does not exceed 25 fathours in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Austra-lian waters except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule,

That portion of the Swan River extending in a Westerly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1922, until the 31st lay of December, 1922,

Locality Schedule.

- (a) The whole of the waters of Rottnest Island within a radius of half a mile from the line of foreshore.
 - (b) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries.
 - (e) The waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury).

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the Opossum shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State from the 1st day of January, 1922, until the 31st day of December, 1922.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from-

- (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture;
- (b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever,

in any specified portion of Western Australia waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as

from the first day of January, 1922, until the thirtieth day of April, 1922, and as from the first day of August, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922, inclusive.

- (2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1922, until the thirtieth day of April, 1922, and from the first day of November, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922, inclusive.
- (3) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1922, until the thirty-first day of March, 1922, and from the first day of October, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922,
- (4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1922, until the twenty-third day of March, 1922, and from the sixteenth day of May, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922, inclusive.
- (5) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922, inclusive; provided that subject to certain provisions (vide separate Proclamation) it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.
- (6) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the first day of July, 1922, until the thirty-first day of October, 1922, inclusive.
- (7) That all those waters mentioned in the Seventh Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the first day of January, 1922, until the thirty-first day of December, 1922, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest land lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of Island lying North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half a mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

- (a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a half miles from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.
- (b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half a mile from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock'' to a point half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock'' to a point half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:-

On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement,

Fifth Loca'ity Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

Sixth Locality Schedulc.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Seventh Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street, and the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Crown Grant under "The Land Act, 1898," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Volume 532, Folio 27, Avon Location 8500, containing 160 acres, was granted to Wm. Free, subject

to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and successors, of the right to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, trainways, railways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvements works, drainage or irrigation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to this Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former extents without making to the said grantees any former estate, without making to the said grantees any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part of the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building without compensation; and whereas it is desirable to resume the land hereinafter described (being portion of the land granted as aforesaid, not exceeding one-twentieth thereof) for the purpose of a School site: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grant as aforesaid, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grant was, on the 14th day of December, 1921, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of a School site.

AT a Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 14th day of December, 1921, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. No. 1790/11.

WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is provided that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by the said Act are required or permitted to be prescribed: And whereas it is deemed desirable to make additional Regulations under the said Act, dealing with the destruction of vermin, to wit: dingoes and rabbits: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of he Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, when the additional Regular. abling him in this behalf, make the additional Regulations following, that is to say:

Whenever under the provisions of Section 126 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," poison is laid by the Minister, Boards and owners and occupiers of holdings, or persons acting with the authority of the Minister, Boards and owners and occupiers of holdings aforesaid, for the purpose of destroying dingoes, a notice shall be put up and displayed on any roads or vacant lands where the poison is laid, by the persons laying such

poison.

The Minister, Vermin Boards, or Roads Boards may lay poison for the purpose of destroying rabbits on roads, vacant lands, or reserves, and a notice published in the Government Gazette and in a newspaper circulating in the district where such poison is laid shall be sufficient notice for the purposes of the aforesaid Act and the Regulations made thereunder.

Vermin Boards Act, 1909. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act and specify the boundaries of and assign a name to such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute as from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, the Port Hedland Road Board District a Vermin District under the said Act, to be known as the Port Hedland Vermin District.

WHEREAS it is provided under the provisions of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," that for every district there shall be a Board which shall consist of so many members as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Governor, and that until the first election of members of such Board the same shall be appointed by the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act appoint and constitute as from and after the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, a board to be known as the Port Hedland Vermin Board, to consist of five members; and doth appoint, as from the date of the constitution of the board aforesaid, George Trenmore Ossian Maepherson, Alexander Edwin Richardson, Gordon Smale Craig, Robert Moffat Edkins, and Ronald Wyborn Parker to be members of the said Board until the first election of members of the aforesaid Board shall have taken place.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 794/21.
WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works, and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operation of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.

Perth Road District (Maylands).
Water Supply Improvements.

Proposed 4-inches diameter cast-iron water main along Fifth Avenue from Beaufort Street South-Easterly to Coode Street (length about 33 chains), and proposed 3-inches diameter cast-iron water main along Coode Street from Fifth Avenue South-Westerly to Fourth Avenue (length about 5½ chains), together with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, including lifting about 23½ chains of 1½-inches diameter galvanised iron piping, as shown on Plan W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 3985.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 16th day of December, 1921.

The Prices Regulation Act, 1919-20.

Determination of Prices.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Prices Regulation Act, 1919," as amended by "The Prices Regulation Act Amendment and Continuance Act, 1920," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioners, by Order in Council, determine the maximum prices, whether retail or wholesale, which may be charged for foodstuffs and necessary commodities in any proclaimed area; and without affecting the generality of the powers conferred may determine such prices on the basis of producing, manufacturing, landed delivery, or other cost, and may declare what items may or may not be included in such cost: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Commissioners, doth hereby determine that the prices of the foodstuff mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail prices that may be charged for such foodstuff within the proclaimed areas specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and, subject as provided in the said First Schedule, in all other proclaimed areas.

BUNBURY HARBOUR BOARD.

Amendment of Regulations.

Regulation No. 199 made by the Bunbury Harbour Board on the first day of October, 1909, and subsequent amendments made to same, are hereby repealed and the following Regulation enacted in place thereof:—

Regulation No. 199.

Cleaning of Wharf Berth.—To cover the cost of cleaning up the berth or berths occupied by a vessel during its stay in port, a charge of £1 will be levied against every vessel of over 1,000 tons net register, and a charge of 10s. against every vessel of 1,000 tons net register or under. Provided that the amount of such charge may, in the discretion of the Secretary, be reduced, and provided also that in the event of such service not being performed the vessel concerned may be exempt from such charge.

This charge will only apply to cleaning up the rubbish, etc., which naturally collects on the wharf while a vessel is berthed, and does not include the removal of stages, planks, gangways, horse boxes, trams, or other gear used in the loading or unloading of a vessel, which removal must be done to the satisfaction of the Wharf Manager by the master or agents of the vessel. In the event of the work not being promptly performed and to the satisfaction of the Wharf Manager, the Board will do it at the expense of the owners of the vessel. Adopted and passed by the Bunbury Harbour Board, at a meeting of the said Board held the 2nd December, 1921.
