WHEREAS it is provided by Ordinance 37 Victoriae, No. 14, that the Governor may, from time to time, frame, vary, or alter rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance for the preservation of good order within all ports or harbours or any port or harbour, to be observed by all persons whatsoever, but so that such rules and regulations shall come into force on the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of all other powers by me in this behalf enabling, do hereby frame and enact the regulations set out hereunder:—

1. The following regulations shall apply to the Port of Perth.

2. No boat shall be moored or anchored or kept or left moored or anchored or unattended opposite or near that part of the Crawley Beach which extends from Pelican Point to the Perth City Baths, unless such boat is and remains at least one chain below low water mark.

3. If it is necessary to bring any boat nearer to the said beach than is mentioned in the preceding regulation, for the purpose of passengers or any of the crew embarking or disembarking, the purpose shall be effected as speedily as possible, and the boat shall then be immediately removed to and kept at a distance of at least one chain below low water mark.

4. If any person shall, by act or omission, be guilty of any contravention of these regulations or be party or privy to any such contravention, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 3942/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may, by Order in Council, transfer to one Ward of a District any portion of another Ward; and whereas it is desirable to transfer part of the territory of the North Ward to the West Ward of the Swan Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby transfer all that territory described in the Schedule hereto from the North Ward to the West Ward of the Swan Road District.

To come into force on the 1st day of January, 1922.

*Transfer of Territory from the North to the West Ward.*

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," the Governor may make regulations prescribing all such matters and things as the Act requires or permits to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to the provisions or objects of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919": And whereas under Section 4 of the said Act standards for fruit cases shall be such as are for the time being prescribed by regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," aforesaid, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth make the following regulations.

Fruit cases shall be in conformity with the measurements and capacities set out hereunder; provided that the dimensions of such cases may be varied to the extent of not more than six per cent. (*i.e.*, three per cent. under or three per cent. above) on the total cubic capacity of each of such cases.
