Vermin Boards Act, 1909. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agric. No. 3779/10.

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Vermin Boards Act, 1909," the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purpose of the said Act and specify the boundaries of, and assign a name to such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Esperance Road Board District a Vermin District under the said Act, to be known as the Esperance Vermin District.

Vermin Boards Act, 1909, ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of all persons who are exempt from the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904," employed in the Department of the North-West should be vested in the several officers whose names or offices are set out in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore, His Excellency 'he Governor in Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby ordains and declares that the power of making minor appointments to all positions which are exempt from "The Public Service Act, 1904," in the Department of the North-West and each of the Sub-Departments mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be vested, and the same is hereby vested in the officer or each of the officers mentioned opposite thereto in the second column of the said schedule, and in the person for the time being acting in the place of any such officer, with effect from 1st November, 1920.

Fruit Cases Act, 1919. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Agri. No. 6707/15.
WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all such matters and things as the Act requires or permits to be prescribed or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to the provisions or objects of the said "Fruit Cases Act, 1919": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," aforesaid, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth make the following Regulations.

FRUIT CASES ACT, 1919. Regulations.

- 2. The Regulations prescribing the standards for fruit cases under Section 4 of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," and published in the Government Gazette on the sixth day of January, 1922, shall hereafter be read as Regulation No. 1 of the Regulations made under the aforesaid Act.
- 3. Before any second-hand fruit case is again used for containing fruit, under the provisions of Section 8 (b) of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," all brands appearing on such case shall be removed and the case shall be steamed or dipped in boiling water at the registered factory, and such steaming or dipping shall be under the supervision of an Inspector.
- 4. Before any second-hand fruit case, treated as aforesaid, is forwarded from the registered factory to a fruit-grower or seller, such case shall be legibly branded on one end thereof in stencilled letters, with the words "Steamed" or "Dipped" (according to one of the methods of treatment adopted as required by Regulation 3) and also branded with the name of the registered factory where such steaming or dipping was effected. The stencilled letters so used shall not be less than onehalf an inch in height.
- 5. Any second-hand fruit case treated as aforesaid and received at the registered factory with fruit contained therein shall not be again used for the carriage of fruit or forwarded to a grower or seller of fruit unless such case is again steamed or dipped in boiling water under the supervision of an Inspector.
- 6. Every fruit brand to be used under the provisions of "The Fruit Cases Act, 1919," shall, if approved, be duly registered at the Department of Agriculture upon payment to the Director of Agriculture of a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence, and the application for such registration shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto.
- 7. All prescribed cases imported into the State containing bananas or pine-apples shall be steamed or dipped in boiling water and branded as directed by an Inspector before being again used.
- 8. Every application for registration as a Factory Buyer under Section 9 of the Act shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereunder, and shall be addressed to the Director of Agriculture, and every such application shall be accompanied by a registration fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," for the control and regulation of camping on Reserve No. 17391, situated at South Nedlands, and generally known as Dalkeith Estate:-

- 1. Camping is permitted on Reserve No. 17391 (fore-shore) situated at South Nedlands, on the following rules and regulations being complied with:-
- 2. Permits to erect camps must be obtained from the Camp Controller, whose decision as to the site to be occupied will be final.

Permits will be issued only on payment in advance of the following fees:-

And for each succeeding week or part of a week on the above scale.

- 3. Campers are prohibited from bringing any domestic animals such as horses, cows, goats, or fowls into camp.
- 4. Campers must at all times be decently clad, quiet and orderly, and in no circumstances will they be permitted to sub-let their camps. In the event of any campers desiring to leave their camping area before the expiry of their permit, others desiring to occupy the camp must first obtain a permit from the Camp. Controller.
- Campers must keep their camping areas free from rubbish, and in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.
- All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences on individual camping areas be permitted.
- 7. The presence of green timber and foliage on any camping permit in a damaged condition will be held to be evidence that the camping permit holder has done the damage, unless the permit holder has pointed out the damage on taking over the area.
- 8. Camping permits are issued only on the distinct understanding that they are revocable by the Camp Controller at any time for breaches of any of the rules and regulations. All camp permits will be reviewed at least once a month, and extensions of permits may be refused at the discretion of the Camp Controller.
- 9. Casual visitors to the reserve and beaches will not be charged any fees, but they are hereby prohibited from invading the area covered by camping permits.
- 10. No fires must be lighted on the reserves except in places approved by the Camp Controller.
