## The Road Districts Act, 1919. <br> Black Range Road Board. <br> Redivision of District into Wards. <br> ORDER IN COUNCLL.

P.W. 1773/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919,'' the Governor may by Order in Council redivide a district into wards: And whereas it is desirable to redivide the Black Range Road District into wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby redivide the Black Range Road District into three wards with the names and boundaries as allocated and defined in Schedule "A"' hereto, and doth allocate the number' of members to represent such wards as set forth in Schedule ' $B$ '' hereto.
To date from the 25th March, 1922, in order that the first election shall take place on the second Saturday in April, at the same time and place as the ordinary annual elections are held, in accordance with the provisions of Section 27 of "The Road Districts Act, $1919^{\prime \prime}$ :-

## Black Range Road District.

## Description of Ward Boundaries.

Youanmi Ward.-Bounded by lines starting from a point situate South about 170 chains and West about 140 chains from the West corner of Youanmi Townsite; and extending North about 400 chains; thence East about 400 chains 13 links; thence South about 400 chains; thence West about 399 chains 87 links to the starting point; being the whole of the land comprised within the Youanmi Common, Reserve 17011.

## ORDER IN COUNOT!.

WHEREAS whier the prorisions of "The Bullding Societies Act, 1920,' the Governor way, from time to time, make Regutations respecting the Pees to be paid for the registman, inspection, and ropies, or extrasts, of docmments under the sald Act, and generally fo: carring the said "Bulling Societies Act, 1920,'" into effect: Now, therefore, Fis Exellener the Govemor, with the afvice and consent of the Executive Comeil, and in exprecise of the povers conferved by "The Building Societies Act, 1090 ," aforesmit, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth make the followina Regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

## Application for Registration.

1. (1) Tivery application for a certificate of registration to a Soejety shall be in Form No. 1 and shall be accompanied by two printed copies of the rules of the Society made up in book form, signed by three members and the Secretary.
(2) Dvery application for the incorporation of a Society registered under the repealed Act shall be made by a person authorised by a general meeting of the Society specially called for the purpose, and shall be according to form (subject to the alteration indicated below), and shall be accompanied by a copy of the rules of the Society embodying such alterations (if any) as are necessary in order to bring them into conformity with the Act, and a Statutory declaration by the applicant in Form 2: Provided that, for the purposes of this sub-rule, Form 1 shall be altered by substituting for the words "intended to be established" the words "registered under Ordinance 27 Vict., No. 7, and intended to be incorporated."

## Amendment of Thules.

2. An alteration of the rules of a Socicty may be either-
(c) A partial alteration consisting of the addition of a new rule or part of a rule or rules to the existing rules, or the substitution of a new rule or part of a new rule or rules for any of the existing rules or of a rescission of any of the existing rules or any part thereof, without any substitution or if more than one or all of those modes, or
(b) A complete alteration consisting of the substitution of an entire set of rules for the existing set of rules.

Partial Amendment of Rules.
3. An application for the registration of a partial alteration of inles shall be made by three members and the Secretary of the Society, and shall be in Form No. 3 and must be accompranied by--
(a) Two printed copies of the alteration signed by the applicants.
(b) One printed copy of the registered rules marked to show where the alteration occurs.
(c) A Statutory declaration by the Secretary in Form No. 4.

Complete Ansendment of Rules.
4. An application for the registration of a complete alteration of rules shall be made by three members and the Secretary of the Society and shall be in Form No. 5 and must be accompanied by the following documents :-
(a) Two printed copies of the new rules made $u_{p}$ in book form signed by the applicants.
(b) One printed copy of the registered rules:
(c) A Statutory declaration by the Secretary in Form No. 4.
Certificate of Registration of Rules.
5. The certificate of registry of an alteration of rules shall be forwarded to the applicants attached to one of the copies of the alteration.

Name of Society.
6. The last words in the name of any Socicty established and incorporated under the "Building Societies Act, 1920," shall be "Building Society," and no change of name by any Society shall be registered unless the new name ends with those words, and the Registrar may refuse to allow the insertion in the name of any Society about to be established and applying for incorporation under the said Act, or the retention in the name of any Society, which seeks to change its name of any words implying that the Society is other than a Building Society.

Cancelling and Suspension of Registry.
7. Every request to cancel registry shall be sent to the Registrar in Form No. 6 and shall name som newspapere
circulating in or about the locality in which the registered office of the Society is situated, wherein it is desired that the cancelling of registry shall be published, and shall be accompanied by the sum requisite to defray the expense of such poblication, and by the further sum requisite for the publication of such cancelling in the Government Gazette.
8. Notice before cancelling or suspension of registry shall be in Form No. 7.
9. The cancelling of registry shall be in Form No. 8 and the suspension or renewal of suspension of registry shall be in Form No. 9.
10. The advertisement of cancelling or suspension shall be in Form No. 10.

## Registered Office.

11. Every notice of $a$ change in the situation of the chief office of a Society shall be sent to the Registrar within seven days after every such change, in duphicate, in Form No. 11.

## Application under Section 36.

12. An application for the appointment of an accountant or actuary to inspect the books of a Society may be in Form or'
13. 

## Change of Name.

13. Every Society changing its name shall give notice to the Registrar in Form No. 13 accompanied by Statutory declaration in Form No. 14. The Registrar, before issuing a certificate of registration of change of name, shall ascertain that the new name is not identical with that of any Society previously registered or so nearly resembling the some as to be calculated to deceive, and in the event of such identity or resemblance may require the Society desiring to change its name to satisfy him that such previonsly registered Society is not subsisting, or, if subsisting, that it is in course of being terminated or dissolved and consents to such registration.

## Dissolution.

14. Where a Society is to be dissolved or has been ordered to be wound up, notice of the commencement of the dissolution or winding up shall be given to the Registrar in duplicate within fourteen days from such commencement in Form No. 15 or 16, and the Registrar shall return one copy to the Society endorsed with the word "Registered," and duly authenticated.
15. Notice of the termination of every winding up under Part VI. of the Companies Act, 1893, or of the dissolution, pusuant to the rules of the Society, shall be given in duplicate to the Registrar within 14 days from the termination of such winding up or dissolution, in either Form 17 or 18 , and the Registrar shall return one copy to the Socieby, endorsed with the word" Registered" and duly authenticated.

Union of Societies or Transfer of Engagensents.
16. Where two or more Societies unite, notice shall be given to the Registrar in duplicate in Form No. 19 and the Registrar shall retum one copy to the united Society endorsed with the word "Registered " and duly authenticated.
17. Where a Society transfers its engagements to another, notice shall be given to the Registrar in duplicate in Form No. 20, and the Registrar shall return one copy to the transferee Society, endorsed with the word "Registered," and duly authenticated.

## Inspectors and Special Meetings.

18. An application for appointment of inspectors, or for calling a special meeting, shall be sent to the Registrar in duplicate in Form No. 21, and shall be accompanied by a Statutory declaration in Form No. 22 signed by three at least of the applicants.
19. The Registrar may, immediately upon receipt of the application, transmit one copy to the Colonial Secretary for his consent, or may, before such transmission, give notice of the application to the Society, and send to the Colonial Secretary any answer the Society may make.
20. The appointment of inspectors shall be in Form 23 or as near thereto as circumstances may allow.
21. The notice of special meeting shall be in Form No. 24.
22. The Chairman of the special meeting shall report to the Registrar as he may direct in Form No. 25.
23. Where a document is tendered for registry which appears to the Registrar substantially to comply with the provisions of the "Building Societies Act, 1920," the Registrar may dispense with the use of any of the forms prescribed by the regulations, but nothing in this regulation contained shall hinder the Registrar from refusing to register a document not in the prescribed forms when it shall appear to the Registrar to be unnecessarily long, or to contain extraneous matter.
24. The Registrar may also modify any such forms to suit particular cases, and may dispense with the obligation to supply a duplicate of any document where such obligation is im posed only by the regulations.

Authentication of Documents by Registrar
25. Every document under the "Building Societies Act, 1920," bearing the seal of the Registrar of Triendly Societies, shall be deemed to be duly authenticated for the purposes of the said Acts and the regulations made thereunder.

Annual Balance Sheet and Accounts.
26. The account of receipts and payments and the general statement of funds and effects, liabilities, and assets required to be delivered to the Registrar under Section 34 of the Act shall be in Form No. 26.
