WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare (inter alia) what length of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net:
Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, declare and proclaim as follows:

That with respect to fishing nets known as Garfish Nets, for catching fish of the species set out in the First Schedule hereto, to be used in all tidal waters open to net-fishing at Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) from the 31st day of March to the 31st day of October in each year, a net with the length of net and size of mesh as set out in the Second Schedule hereto shall be a lawful net.

First Schedule.

Garfish only.

Second Schedule.

Total length of net not exceeding 150 fathoms. Length of bunt not more than one-third of the total length of the net.

Mesh of bunt not less than 11/2 inches.

Length of wing not less than the length of the bunt, nor less than one-third of the total length of net.

Mesh of wing not less than 2 inches.
