the State of Western Australia and
its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 8 of "The Prisons Act, 1903-18," the Governor may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare any gaol to be discontinued and closed, and direct the removal of the prisoners confined therein to some other prison to be named in the Proclamation: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of all powers in this behalf enabling, do hereby declare the Gaol at Albany to be discontinued and closed as from the 31st day of May, 1922; and doth further direct the removal day of May, 1922; and doth further direct the removal of any prisoners confined therein to the Police Gaol at Albany, and I do, with the advice and consent aforesaid, direct that the Gaol so closed shall be a Police Gaol within the meaning of the said Prisons Act, 1903-18.

By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters clare, inter and, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Capel River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters of the Capel River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever, from the 1st day of June, 1922, until the 30th day of September, 1922.

# The Eisheries Act, 1905-21. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from—

(a) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;

(b) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;

(c) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—
That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of June, 1922, until the 30th day of September, 1922.

That Clauses 62 to 71, inclusive, of By-law No. 39 are hereby repealed, and the following clauses shall be read in lieu thereof:—

### Verandahs.

- 62. No person shall erect any verandah over any public footway within the limits of the City of Perth without having first obtained the consent of the Council, to be signified by the issue of a license in the form of Schedule 5 hereto.
- 63. Any person desiring to obtain the consent of the Council to the erection of such a verandah shall deposit with the Building Surveyor a plan, elevation, section, and specification, showing in detail the proposed construction of such verandah, and the manner in which it is proposed to secure it to the building to which it is proposed to be attached.
- 64. No such verandah shall hereafter be erected unless it conform, save as hereinafter provided, to one of the two plans numbered 1 or 2 (P.W.D., W.A., 21983) which have been settled and approved by the Council and deposited in the Office of the City Building Surveyor: Provided that the strength of the materials used in the construction of any such verandah may, subject to the approval of the Building Surveyor, be varied according to circumstances: Provided further, that all verandahs which may be erected hereafter over any footpath lying within a circle having a radius of one mile from the Perth Town Hall, or abutting on any street along which

- a tramway service is provided, shall conform to Standard Plan No. 1.
- 65. The minimum height of any verandah hereafter erected shall be eleven feet from the top of the kerb to the underside of the signboard. In the case of sloping ground the height shall be measured at the centre of the frontage. Provided that if the frontage shall exceed 20 feet, a break shall be made if so directed by the Building Surveyor.
- 66. All verandahs in a street shall be erected of a uniform height and width. Subject to the last preceding section, the standard height and width of verandahs in each street shall be fixed by the Council.
- 67. In the construction of every such verandah the following conditions shall be complied with:—
  - (a) The roof shall be covered with 24 gauge galvanised corrugated iron. The gutters shall be lined with galvanised plain iron not lighter than 24 gauge and shall be of a capacity sufficient to carry off all rain or storm water. Such capacity shall in no case be less than 27 square inches.
  - (b) Down pipes shall be of 24 gauge galvanised iron with a minimum area of 9 square inches. The inlets from the gutters to the down pipes shall be at least twice the area of the down pipes and shall be funnel-shaped. Special provision shall be made for the head of the down pipes, and the lower lengths of such down pipes shall be of 18 gauge at least, and the portion thereof carrying water under the footpath shall be of wrought iron.
  - (c) The ceiling shall be of ceilite plain galvanised iron or other approved non-inflammable materials securely fixed to the wood joists, which shall be 4in. x 2in. spaced not more than two feet, centres running parallel with the footpath and secured to the steel framing. All ceilings to be flat and level.
  - (d) The hanging bolts are to be 1% in, diameter, attached to the framing as shown and securely bolted to the building and provided with a union screw, all quite plain.
- 68. The fascia or signboard of every such verandah is to be framed as shown and covered with 24 gauge galvanised iron neatly fitted over the framing, and a flashing of 5lbs. lead must be fixed over the top as shown.
- 69. Whenever a proposed verandah will abut on to an existing verandah, it shall be so finished as to prevent rain from falling between such verandahs. Provided that when the existing verandah is shorter than the frontage of the building to which it is attached, the person erecting the new verandah shall make the necessary extension to the existing one.
- 70. Whenever the end of a verandah abuts on to the end of a right-of-way, street, or public place, the sign-board shall be returned along such end to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.
- 71. No writing, printing, or trade notice of any description shall be exhibited on any portion of the verandah, except on the outer face of the signboard, and/or upon signboards under the ceiling of the verandah securely and rigidly fixed to the framework of the ceiling at right angles to the building line and having a maximum depth of 12 inches and at a distance of 12 feet between one and another.





WHEREAS by "The Land Act, 1898," Reserve 9469, Meekatharra Common, was by virtue of an Order in Council, dated the 19th day of July, 1911, placed under the control of the Meekatharra Road Board, as a Board of Management, with powers delegated to such Board to make, repeal, or alter By-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties as provided by such Order, for the breach of any such By-law: Now, therefore, the Meekatharra Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the said Order in Council and by virtue of powers conferred by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

- (1) All stock running on the Common, otherwise than in accordance with these By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock and impounded.
- (2) No person shall depasture any animal on the Common without having first obtained a license to do so from the Meckatharra Road Board, in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws.
- (3) Every person desiring to depasture any animal on the Common shall apply for a license to the Board, and shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list in writing of the number and kinds of animals required to be depastured, with full description, brands, numbers, or other distinguishing marks thereon, so that every animal may be readily identified, and shall obtain a license from the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf. Such license shall set forth the number and description of animals licensed to depasture on the Common, in accordance with these Bylaws. While the Board will exercise every care, in the event of any person applying for a license, to obtain an accurate description of the stock being registered, the Board accepts no responsibility if the said stock is subse-

quently impounded and sold through the failure of the owner furnishing such accurate description or through misrepresentation.

- (4) With the exception of stock owned by bonâ fide travellers, travelling teamsters, and drovers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Common free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and the following charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and July in each year, in respect of all stock running or depasturing thereon:—
  - All "great cattle" as defined by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (excepting camels), Ten shillings per head per annum.
  - All "small cattle," Two-pence per head per week or part of week.

For every camel, Thirty shillings per head per annum.

- (5) Any genuine prospector may, on application to the Secretary or the Chairman of the Board, obtain permission to run not more than two head of horses or cattle free of charge.
- (6) No camel shall depasture on the Common, without the written permission of the Chairman or two members of the Board, if claim for free pasturage is made under By-law 5 as above.
- (7) Stock under nine months of age shall be exempt from tax if running with the mother.
- (8) Any person running stock on the Common may, with the permission of the Secretary in writing, change such stock from time to time, provided that he does not at any time exceed the number for which he shall have paid Commonage fees.
- (9) Bonâ fide travellers or teamsters, on notifying the Secretary of date of arrival, shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels on the Common for the space of four clear days free of charge; such stock after being on the Common for that time, must make a trip of at least fourteen miles from where they unloaded before being entitled to another term free. Should that period be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per week or portion of week.
- (10) No stock shall be mustered or removed from the Common without the written permission of the Secretary of the Board or Commonage Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand or earmark stock running or depasturing on the Common, unless in the presence of the Ranger.
- (11) All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the railways, shall be allowed to cross the Common except conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with "The Drovers Act."
- (12) No entire horse, jack donkey, or bull over the age of nine months shall be allowed on the Common without the owner thereof obtaining written permission from the Secretary of the Road Board, and in addition to the renalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner, if known, any such entire horse, jack donkey, or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).
- (13) Stray stock proved to be accidentally on the Common, the owner shall not be liable to pay Commonage Fees, but such stock shall be impounded.
- (14) The Secretary or Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the Common, from the owner or person in charge of such stock. Any person refusing to give such particulars when so demanded shall be deemed to commit a breach of these By-laws.
- (15) The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the Common under the provisions of these By-laws. The Ranger or any person appointed by the Secretary under the direction of the Board

shall have power at any time to muster all stock on the Common and, for the purpose of ascertaining brands or marks, may yard same in crush and may tar brand such

(16) Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause, or allow to be introduced or depastured on the Common any diseased animal or animals, or allow the same to depasture on the Common, shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws and shall, on conviction, be liable to a

penalty as hereinafter provided.

- (17) Householders being ratepayers to the Board shall be permitted to depasture four head of great stock or six goats free of charge, but such stock shall be duly registered at the office of the Board.
- (18) Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce his liceuse upon being requested to do so by any member or officer of the Board or any police constable.
- Chairman, (19) The Secretary, Commonage Ranger or other authorised person may, if in his opinion any animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Common and, if he thinks fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased, all expenses and costs incurred in connection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid by the owner. If the owner cannot be found, and the animal is suffering from a disease which will endanger other stock coming in contact, the Chairman, Secretary, or Ranger shall lay a complaint before a Justice of the Peace, and if the said Justice is satisfied that the animal is a danger to other stock he may order the destruction of the said animal forthwith.
- (20) The Secretary or Commonage Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid or the recovery of any fine or penalty, or for any breach of the within By-laws or any of them, and such legal proceedings shall be commenced by a complaint made by the Secretary or Commonage Ranger, and all proceedings shall be in conformity with "The Justices Act, 1902," and its amendments, unless such proceedings are repugnant to the within By-laws or any of them.
- (21) Immediately a muster of the Common is started, all stock running on the Common that have not been previously registered shall only be registered if the owner pays in addition to the registration fees the proportional cost and expenses of the muster of said stock
- (22) All stock registered to depasture on the Common are registered subject to all conditions mentioned in these
- (23) The Road Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed person of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- (24) All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Road Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.
- (25) Any person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and on conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and to £2 per day for a continuance breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate; in default, imprisonment.

For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Meekatharra Road Board By-laws governing the Common, "Officers" shall mean the Chairman, Secretary, or any member of the Board, or any employee whether permaneut or temporarily employed by the Board.

These By-laws were approved by the Meekatharra Road Board at a meeting held the twenty-fourth day of January, 1922, and shall take effect from date of publication in the Government Gazette.

All previous existing By-laws relating to Common are hereby repealed.
