WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse TO WIT. McMillan, Knight, Lieutenant-Gover-R. F. MCMILLAN, nor and Administrator in and over Lieutenant-Governor the State of Western Australia and and Administrator. its Dependencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13,'' it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatso-ever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other

power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows :-

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three years as from the 16th day of August, 1922.

Bibra Lake (the whole), situate within the boundaries of the Fremantle District Road Board, and some six miles South-East of the town of Fremantle.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The Courts of Session Act, 1921," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, constitute any Magisterial District, or two or more Districts together, a Sessions Division for the purpose of this Act, and may further declare the name by which any such Division shall be known: And whereas by Section 6 of the said Act the Governor may by Proclamation establish, for any Division named Court: And whereas by Section 17 of the said Act the Governor may by Proclamation appoint the place within the Division where the sittings of the Court of that Division shall be held, and fix the times at which periodical sittings of the Court shall be held: Now therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, do hereby issue this my Proclamation constituting the Magisterial District, or two or more Districts shown in column 2 of the schedule hereto, as the Sessions Divisions for the purpose of this Act, and I further declare the names set out in column 1 of the said schedule to be the names by which such Divisions shall be respectively known. I do further establish, for each such Division, a Court of Session as appearing in column 3 of the said schedule, and do also assign to each Court the name shown in such column thereto; and I further appoint the places mentioned in Column 4 of the said schedule as the places at which the sittings of the Court of each Division respectively shall be held, and I fix the time as mentioned in column 5 of the said schedule as the time, at which periodical sittings of the said Court shall be held.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations governing the admission of Cadet Draftsmen and Computers in the Department of Mines.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ADMISSION OF CADET DRAFTSMEN AND COMPUTERS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF MINES.

Conditions.

1. An applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He shall also produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

Qualifications.

2. An applicant shall produce evidence of having passed-

- (a) The Junior Certificate Examination of the Uni-versity of Western Australia in English, Mathematics, and any other three subjects; or
- (b) The Leaving Certificate Examination of the University of Western Australia in English, Mathematies, and Physics; or
- (c) Such other examinations as shall in the opinion of the Inspecting Surveyor be equivalent thereto.
- (d) He shall also submit a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examinations.

3. Applications will be invited by the Public Service Commissioner by advertisement, and in the event of more applications being received than the number of vacancies, a competitive examination may be held by the Decars, a competitive examination may be held by the De-partment in plotting, plan drawing, and trigonometrical computations, as a guide towards the selection of the most suitable candidates.

Probation.

4. Every cadet shall in the first instance be appointed on probation for a period of six months. Before the exshall report to the Commissioner on the manner in which the probationer has performed his duties and upon his general conduct. Upon receipt of such report the Com-missioner will confirm or annul the cadetship, or extend the period of probation for a further period not exceeding six months.

Remuneration.

Term of Service and Qualifying Examinations.

6. A cadet will be required to serve for a term of four years during which time he will be instructed in drafting, plotting from field notes, and computations recessary to qualify for examinations prescribed by Section 8.

7. When he has completed one-half of the prescribed term of service, if in the opinion of the permanent head of the Department his progress and general conduct have on the Deen satisfactory, his services may be dispensed with, on the approval of the Public Service Commissioner.

8. On the completion of his term of service he will be required to present himself at a qualifying examin-ation, which shall embrace the following subjects:—

(a) Drawing, plan drawing, enlarging and reducing, use of scales and protractors, plotting by co-ordinates, plotting from surveyor's field books, stump writing and printing, colouring, drawing for reproduction.

- (b) Computing, examination of surveyor's diagrams and original plans and adjustments of discrepancies in surveys, computation of co-ordinates and areas of rectilinear figures and of figures bounded by circular arcs, computations of observations for azimuth, latitude, and time.
- (c) Use of planimeter and calculating machine.

9. All cadets will be examined in their knowledge of the Land Act, Mining Act, Land Transfer Act, Roads Act, Public Works Act, and Regulations thereunder, so far as they affect the work of the Survey and Drafting Branch of the Department of Mines in addition to the General Regulations for the guidance of Surveyors, un-der "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1909," and the De-partmental Rules and Directions. The examination prescribed in Section 8 shall be conducted by a board ap-pointed by the Public Service Commissioner.

10. When cadets cannot obtain the necessary instruction at the evening classes of the University of Western Australia, the Technical School, or other approved institution, they will be allowed such leave of absence as may be necessary to attend day lectures in approved subjects at the University of Western Australia at such times as the by-laws of the University may provide, but such leave of absence during working hours shall be without pay, unless the Department can conveniently arrange for the cadet to make up the time.

11. Should a cadet fail to pass in the qualifying ex-amination, his term of service may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, be extended for a further

Permanent appointment.

A cadet who has satisfactorily completed his eadetship and obtained his certificate of qualification shall (should he be so required) serve in the Public Serin accordance with the Public Service Commissioner's classification of the work upon which he is engaged, but at not less than at the rate of £204 per annum.

13. If the cadet is under 21 years of age when he obtains his certificate of qualification, the Commissioner may extend his cadetship, and fix the salary to be paid until he reaches that age.

Public Service Act and Regulations.

14. During the whole term of his cadetship and any extension thereto, a cadet shall be subject to the Public Service Act and Regulations relating to the permanent staff, as far as applicable. His service qualifying him for long service leave, however, will not count until after the completion of his cadetship.

Bond.

15. An agreement and bond, with approved sureties, in a form to be prescribed, to be executed for the due performance of all the terms herein specified.
