Warren, Bridgetown, and Upper Blackwood Road Districts.

Alteration of Boundaries, and Re-division into Wards of the Bridgetown Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 6122/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Administrator may, by Order in Council, sever any portion of a Road District therefrom and annex it to an existing Road District, and may redivide a District into Wards; and whereas it is desirable-

(1) To sever a portion of the Warren Road District

and annex it to the Bridgetown Road District.
(2) To sever a portion of the Warren Road District and annex it to the Upper Blackwood Road District.

(3) To redivide the Bridgetown Road District into Wards:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby

Sever that portion of the Warren Toad District, as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Bridgetown Road District.

(3) Redivide the Bridgetown Road District into six Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in Schedule "C" hereto.

To come into force on and from the 1st October, 1922.

Transfer of Territory from the Warren Road District.
All that piece of land bounded on the Northward by part of the present boundaries of the Bridgetown and Upper Blackwood Road Districts from the South-West corner of Nelson Location 1369 to the North-West corner of Location 8548

On the Eastward by lines commencing at the North-West corner of said Location 8548 and extending Southward along its West and part of its South boundary to the production North of the West boundary of Location 6139 and along said production and West boundary, part of the North and the West boundary of Location 8550 and the latter's production South to the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 3757/93 and along part of the North, the West, and part of the South boundary of said Pastoral Lease, the West boundary of Location 3537 and its production South to the North boundary of Location 3682, and along part of its North and its West boundary part of the North, the West, and the South boundary of Location 2882, and along part of the North boundary of Location 2889, the North, the East, and the South boundary of Location 2889, part of the North, the East, a South, a West, and a South boundary of Location 2426, a South and an East boundary of Location 2889 to its South-East corner.
