WHEREAS by Section 161 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is provided that in any area specified by the Governor by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, one moiety of the expense incurred in paving footways shall be repaid to the Board by the owners of all rateable lands abutting on any such footway or part thereof, apportioned according to the frontage of such lands abutting on the footway or part thereof, and may be recovered from such owners by the Board in any Court of competent jurisdiction; and whereas it is desirable to specify an area in the Claremont Road District as an area for the purpose of the said Section 161: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby specify the area situated within the Claremont Road District and set forth hereunder as an area within the meaning and for the purpose of Section 161 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919":—

Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 79/22.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1921," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, declare that any kinds of machinery shall cease to be machinery subject to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that from and after the date hereunder mentioned, the following machinery shall cease to be machinery subject to the said Act, viz.:—

Electrical Motors used exclusively by agriculturists, pastoralists, orchardists, and dairymen, and used for irrigating or dairying purposes only, in pursuit of the owner's calling, upon which no labour other than that of the owner is employed, and which are not deemed by an Inspector to be dangerous.

This Order shall come into operation and take effect from the 1st day of September, 1922.

WHEREAS Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, did, on the 13th day of October, 1897, issue Her Royal Proclamation establishing a Branch of Our Royal Mint at Perth in Western Australia:

And whereas by the Melbourne Mint Proclamation, 1900, and the Sydney Mint Proclamation, 1900, similar provision was made for establishing Branch Mints at Melbourne in Victoria and at Sydney in New South Wales:

And whereas by the Australian Branch Mints Proclamation, 1916, the Deputy Masters of the Branch Mints established under the above-recited Proclamations were authorised, during the continuance of the then war and of a period of one year thereafter, to make payment for gold bullion brought to the Branch Mints in manner provided by regulations made under proviso (d) of sub-section (i) of Article 5 of each of the said Proclamations:

And whereas it is expedient that the said authority should be continued until the 31st day of August, 1924:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The Australian Branch Mints Proclamation, 1916, shall have effect as though the words "during the period ending on the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four" were substituted for the words "during the continuance of the present war and a period of one year thereafter."

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Australian Branch Mints (Amendment) Proclamation, 1922.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the Thirteenth year of Our Reign.

WHEAT MARKETING ACT, 1921.
