WHEREAS by Section 122, Subsection (1), of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that no building shall be erected within any Municipal District unless and until plans and specifications thereof have been submitted by the owner or occupier to, and have been approved, in relation to ventilation, lighting, and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the local authority; and whereas under Subsection (2) of Section 122, the Governor may from time to time declare by proclamation that Subsection 1 of the said section shall apply in any other district or in any portion of any other district, and may at any time revoke any such proclamation, and while such declaration remains in force Subsection 1 of the said section shall apply in any such district or portion of such district as if it were a Municipal District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that Subsection 1 of Section 122 shall apply to Claremont Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 3297/16.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council create Stormwater Districts and define the boundaries of such districts: And whereas it is desirable to create a new Stormwater District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby create a Stormwater District to be known as the Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 5, by deleting the area hereunder described and shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D. No. 4105 from the Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 1:—

Schedule.

Commencing at a point on the South-West corner of Lot 53, Victoria Avenue, and proceeding in a Northerly direction along the West boundary of the said Lot 53 across Queenslea Drive to the South-East corner of Lot 71; thence Westerly and Northerly along the East side of Queenslea Drive to Lot 85; thence Easterly along the East boundary of the said Lot 85 to the South-East corner of Lot 2, Queenslea Drive; thence Northerly along the East boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, Queenslea Drive, across Fremantle Road and along the West boundary of Lot 2, Fremantle Road; thence Easterly along the North boundaries of Lots 2 and 1 and across Lots 79 and 78, Fremantle Road, to the West boundary of

Lot 77; thence Northerly along the West boundary of Lot 77, across Diver Street, and along the West boundary of Lot 1 of 92 for a distance of 269 links; thence North-Easterly across Lots 92, 93, and 94 to the West boundary of Lot 95; thence Northerly along the West boundary of the said Lot 95 to Gugeri Street; thence Easterly along the South side of Gugeri Street to Bay View Terrace; thence Southerly along the West side of Bay View Terrace to a point opposite the North boundary of Lot 5, Bay View Terrace; thence Easterly across Bay View Terrace and along the said boundary of Lot 5 and the North boundary of Lot 14 and across Leura Avenue; thence Northerly along the East side of Leura Avenue to the North boundary of Lot 19; thence Easterly along North boundaries of Lots 19 and 1, Mary Street, and across Mary Street; thence Northerly along the East side of Mary Street to the North boundary of Lot 27; thence Easterly along the North boundaries of Lots 27 and 17, Langsford Street, and across Langsford Street; thence Northerly along the East side of Langsford Street a distance of about 200 feet to the North-West corner of Lot 17; thence Easterly along the North boundaries of said Lot 17 and Lot 18 to Vaocluse Street; thence Southerly along the West side of Vaocluse Street to Fremantle Road, across Fremantle Road to the North-West corner of Lot 56, Fremantle Road; thence Southerly along the West boundary of the said Lot 56 to the North-West corner of Lot 43, Bernard Street; thence Easterly along the North boundary of Lot 43; thence Southerly along the East boundary of the said Lot 43 and across Bernard Street to a point on the Southern alignment of Bernard Street; thence Easterly along Bernard Street to Goldsworthy Road; thence Southerly along the West side of Goldsworthy Road to a point opposite the North boundary of Lot 19; thence Easterly across Goldsworthy Road and along the North boundary of the said Lot 19 to right-of-way; thence Southerly along right-of-way to and across Princess Road to a point opposite said right-of-way; thence Westerly along the South side of Princess Road to and across Goldsworthy Road; thence Southerly along the West side of Goldsworthy Road to the North-East corner of Lot 2, Goldsworthy Road; thence Westerly along the North boundary of the said Lot 2 to right-of-way; thence Southerly along right-of-way to Lot 1; thence Westerly along the North boundary of the said Lot 1 to its North-West corner; thence Southerly along the West boundary of the said Lot 1 to and across Agett Street to the intersection of Lots 5 and 6, Agett Street; thence Westerly along the South side of Agett Street to the North-West corner of Lot 18, Agett Street; thence Southerly along the West boundary of the said Lot 18 to its South-West corner; thence Easterly along the North boundary of Lot 17, Warwick Street, to its North-East corner; thence Southerly along the East boundaries of Lots 17 and 16, Warwick Street; thence Westerly along the South boundary of Lot 16 to the intersection of Lots 13 and 14, Victoria Avenue; thence Southerly along the West boundary of Lot 13 to Victoria Avenue; thence in a Westerly direction along the North alignment of Victoria Avenue, across Warwick Street, Chester Road, Bay View Terrace, and Victoria Parade to the point of commencement, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D. A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 36, for the general management of the Municipal Baths at Mount's Bay Road, Crawley; the conduct of the visitors thereat, and for fixing the charge to be made for the use thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of the City of Perth order that By-law No. 36 be repealed, and that the following be substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. *Hours of Admission.*

From 1st September to 31st May the Baths shall be open daily (except Sundays) from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m., and on Sundays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

2. *Costume.*

(a) Every person using the Baths shall at all times, when not dressed in ordinary apparel, wear a neck-to-knee bathing costume, and in the case of persons apparently above the age of 12 years such costume shall consist of drawers and a tunic covering the same to below the middle.

(b) The Superintendent may require any person contravening this clause to resume his ordinary dress forthwith.

Failure to comply with the Superintendent's request shall be an offence under this By-law.

(c) No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

3. *Admission and Entrance Tickets.*

(a) No person shall enter the Baths save through the gates or turn-stiles set apart for entrance purposes.

(b) No person (save the officers or workmen of the Council) shall enter the Baths except upon payment of the charge herein prescribed.

4. *Charges for Admission.*

The following shall be the sums to be paid for admission to and the use of the Baths, and the requisites supplied therein:—

Use of Costume, child	0	3

Cash charges for admission are payable at the entrance to the Baths.

5. *Control of Premises.*

(a) Every person using the Baths shall obey all reasonable directions of the Superintendent with regard to such use.

(b) No person shall obstruct, interfere with, or hinder the Superintendent in the performance of any duty in the Baths.

6. *Costumes, Towels, etc.*

(a) Every person using the Baths and hiring a costume and/or towel from the Council shall, on leaving the Baths, deliver the said costume and/or towel to the Superintendent or other official of the Council.

Every person using his or her own costume and/or towel shall, on leaving the Baths, produce such bathing costume and/or towel to the Superintendent or other official of the Council for inspection.

(b) Every person who notifies the Superintendent or other official of the Council that he desires to enter the Baths as an onlooker shall be handed a ticket by the Superintendent or other official of the Council, and on such person leaving the Baths such ticket shall be handed to the Superintendent or other officer of the Council.

7. *Offences.*

(a) No person shall enter or be in the Baths while in an intoxicated condition.

(b) No person shall at any time, while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease enter or use the Baths or any part of the Baths premises.

(c) No person in charge of any dog shall allow such dog to enter any part of the Bath premises.

(d) No person shall bring or deposit any filth or rubbish into a dressing box or shed or into any part of the Baths.

(e) No person shall eat in or take into a dressing box any food, fruit, etc., of any kind whatsoever.

(f) No person shall disfigure or write in or upon any dressing box or shed or any part of the Baths.

(g) No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, disorderly or riotous manner, swear nor use any indecent, obscene, or abusive language, nor gamble nor misconduct him or herself in any part of the Bath premises.

(h) No person shall smoke in any part of the Bath buildings.

(i) No person shall climb up to or on any partition or roof or any other portion of the Bath buildings.

(j) No person shall, in the Bath rooms or elsewhere in the Baths premises, wastefully use the water nor leave any taps running.

(k) No person shall spit or expectorate in the Baths or on any of the platforms or in any of the dressing boxes or commit any nuisance on or in any part of the Baths or the Baths premises.

(l) No person resorting to the Baths shall wilfully damage any part of the Baths premises, furniture or fittings, nor carelessly or negligently injure or improperly use or interfere with any taps, valves, or other fittings or appliances.

(m) No person resorting to the Baths shall in any way interfere with any person therein, nor throw or push, nor attempt to throw or push, any person into the swimming Baths, nor throw any stones or sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of or interference with any other person using the Baths.

(n) No person shall enter or attempt to enter any bath-room or dressing-room that is already occupied, without the consent of the occupier.

(o) No man, and no boy apparently above the age of seven years, shall enter, remain upon, or use any dressing-room, passage, latrine, platform, gangway, or other portion of the Baths which shall be set apart by the Council from time to time for the exclusive use of women or girls or children under the age of seven years, and no woman or girl shall enter, remain upon, or use any dressing-room, passage, latrine, platform, gangway, or other portion of the Baths which shall be set apart by the Council from time to time for the use of men.

8. *Lost Articles.*

(a) Every person resorting to the Baths who shall find any article which may have been left therein shall immediately deliver same to the Superintendent, who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book which shall by him be kept for that purpose, and on any person claiming such article and who satisfies the Superintendent that he or she is the lawful owner of the same such person shall have such article returned to him or her, and on receiving such article he or she shall sign for the same in the book before mentioned.

(b) The Superintendent shall on every Monday report to the Town Clerk regarding all articles found in the Baths and handed to him, and whether any such have been claimed and returned to the owners thereof, at the same time he shall hand to the Town Clerk any such article unclaimed, who shall hand over same to the Police.

9. *Carnivals.*

(a) The Council may in their discretion grant to any person, club, association, or organisation permission to hold and conduct swimming carnivals in the Baths for such periods, and to charge such fees for admission to same as the Council may determine, and the sums to be paid to the Council for such privileges and conditions under which such carnivals shall be conducted shall be fixed by the Council as it deems fit.

(b) During the holding of any swimming carnival the persons, club, association, or organisation conducting the same shall be responsible for seeing that good order and conduct are maintained by the competitors and spectators, and that there is no over-crowding; also that no damage is done to the building or fittings or other portions of the Baths premises.

(c) At all swimming carnivals all competitors shall wear proper and approved swimming costume.

(d) Any person, club, association, or organisation to whom the Baths are granted for the purpose of holding a swimming carnival shall, at least one week before the date of such carnival, forward to the Town Clerk a copy of the programme of the events to be competed for thereat; any item on such programme that the Mayor and Town Clerk does not approve of shall be struck out, or altered as they direct.

10. *Enforcement of By-laws.*

(a) Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(b) Every person who shall infringe any of the provisions of this By-law for the regulation of the Baths may be summarily removed therefrom by the Superintendent or any other officer of the Council.

Toodyay District Road Board.

Special By-laws *re* preparation of special roll and other matters for taking Vote of Owners in connection with Loans.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, the Toodyay Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following Special By-laws regarding the taking of a poll in respect of proposed loans:—

1. When demand shall have been duly made under Section 285 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Secretary shall forthwith prepare a roll of the names of all persons who appear to be resident owners of rateable land within the meaning of Section 285.

2. The various forms mentioned in these By-laws shall be those prescribed under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and approved of by Order in Council and published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th September, 1913, and 5th March, 1920.

3. The said roll shall be as prescribed by Form No. 40, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Road Board Office, within the usual office hours, not later than ten days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll.

4. On or before the fifth day before the closing of the poll, any resident owner—

(a) Whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered or sent through the post addressed to the Secretary, apply to have his or her name inserted therein, and shall give particulars of his or her claim.

(b) Whose name has been inserted in the roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him may, in like manner, apply to the Secretary to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(c) Whose name appears in the roll or who claims to have his or her name inserted in such roll may, in like manner, object to the name of any other person appearing in such roll as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his or her name. Any such claims or objections shall be as prescribed by Form No. 5 or to the like effect, and any objection under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

5. (a) The Board shall hold an open court (to be called a Revision Court) within the Road Board District, for the purpose of revising the roll, and such revision shall take place before the day fixed for the holding of the poll, at such time and place as the Chairman shall appoint, and the Chairman shall give notice of the holding of such court and the time and place thereof by placing such notice on some building within the Road Board District and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district.

(b) The court shall consist of the Chairman or, in his absence, of a chairman appointed by the other members of the court, and of not less than one-third of the members of the Board.

6. Every such court may be adjourned, and if at any time for half an hour after the time appointed for the holding of such court, or adjourned court, a sufficient number of members to form a court is not present, the chairman or, in his absence, any member or the Secretary shall adjourn the court; but no such court shall be adjourned beyond the day before the holding of the poll.

7. (a) The Secretary shall himself or by some person on his behalf if he is prevented from so doing, attend the revision court and produce to the court the roll and lists of the persons who have sent in claims and who have been objected to.

(b) The court may order, if required, that the valuer or valuers and all collectors of rates shall also attend the said court and produce all books, papers, and documents in their possession connected with their respective offices.

(c) The officers aforesaid shall answer, on oath or otherwise, all such questions as the court may put to them touching any matters necessary for the revising of the roll.

8. (a) The revision court shall have authority to hear, receive, and examine evidence by summons under the hands of the Chairman, to require all persons as the court may think fit to appear personally before such court at a time and place to be named in such summons, and to produce all books and papers in their possession or under their control as may appear necessary for the purpose of their examination.

(b) The court shall have like powers for compelling the attendance of the witnesses summoned and their examination upon and taking of oaths and affirmations and their answering questions touching the premises as by any law in force for the time being is vested in justices exercising summary jurisdiction, and the Chairman may issue any summons at any time after he has appointed a time for holding the said court,

9. The revision court shall, in open court, determine as hereinafter provided upon the validity of all claims and objections, and every such determination shall be by the decision of the majority, and in the case of an equal division of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the court.

10. (a) The revision court shall insert in the roll under revision the names of every person who has claimed as aforesaid and has proved to the satisfaction of the court to be entitled to be inserted therein for one or more votes according to the provisions of the Act.

(b) Subject as hereinafter provided, the court shall retain on the list the names of all persons to whom no objection has been duly made, with the number of votes unaltered.

(c) The revision court shall retain on the list the name of every person who has been objected to by any person and the number of votes unaltered, unless the person so objecting appears by himself, or by some person duly authorised in writing on his behalf, in support of the objection and proves the service of the requisite notices.

(d) When the name of any person inserted in the roll or the number of any votes set against his or her name has been duly objected to and the person objected to appears by himself or by someone on his behalf in support of such objection, the court shall require proof of so much qualification of the person objected to as is embraced in the grounds of objection, and no more.

(e) In case the qualification of such person is not proved to the satisfaction of the court, the court shall expunge the name of such person from the list, or shall alter and correct the number of votes set against his or her name, as the case may require.

(f) The court shall expunge from the list the name of every person who is proved to be dead.

(g) The court shall, by means of the rate-book valuation and return, correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to such court to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or trade or occupation of any person who is included therein, or in respect to the local description of the rateable property, or the situation thereof or the rateable value thereof.

(h) But no person's name shall be inserted by the court in the roll, or be expunged therefrom, unless notice has been given as hereinbefore required.

11. (i.) The Chairman shall in open court—

(a) Write initials against every name struck out or inserted as aforesaid and against any part of the roll in which any mistake has been corrected or omission supplied.

(b) Initial every page of the roll so settled.

(c) Cause to be written at the foot or end of the list a certificate, that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.

(ii.) The Chairman and not less than two other members of the Board shall severally sign such certificate.

12. The provisions of Section 86 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply in regard to voting in absence.

Motor Vehicles.

(Amendment.)

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 29, for regulating the standing of Motor Cars in streets.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of the City of Perth order as follows:—

Clause 2 (i) is deleted, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

2. (i.) A stand for one motor car in the centre of St. George's Terrace, beginning at a point 33 feet east of the eastern side of Barrack Street.

A new clause is added to the By-law as follows:—

3. For Motor Cycle Taxi-cabs—

(i) A stand for two vehicles on the western side of William Street, beginning at a point 78 feet north of the northern side of Hay Street and extending northwards 20 feet.

METROPOLITAN WATER SUPPLY, SEWERAGE,
AND DRAINAGE ACT, 1909.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage,
and Drainage Department,
56 James Street, Perth, 9th November, 1922.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of By-laws made by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage under the provisions of "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," and published in the *Government Gazette* of 24th March, 1922, by inserting new By-laws as follows, in the order as shown numbered:—

7. Closets or urinals already in existence shall, wherever considered necessary by the Inspector, be removed where directed by the Inspector, and such removal or re-erection shall be at the cost of the owner, who shall have the work completed within one calendar month from delivery by Inspector of written notice to owner requiring this to be done, provided that the owner may appeal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

43. No person shall do or cause to be done any work in connection with the water supply of any premises or in connection with any water supply, fitting, or apparatus connected therewith, unless he shall have been duly admitted by the Minister as a "Licensed Water Supply and Sanitary Plumber" or as a "Licensed Water Supply Plumber."

52. Any licensed water supply and sanitary plumber or water supply plumber offending against any By-law or Regulation of the Minister, or who shall refuse to give any needful or proper information required by an officer of the Minister, either by himself or those employed by him, or who, within seven days from date tenders close, withdraws or varies any tender he may have lodged, or fails to complete any contract with the Minister or with a private owner within the time specified, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds, and he shall also show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled. Any person who has been removed from the list shall not be re-admitted as a licensed water supply and sanitary plumber or water supply plumber until the term of his suspension has expired or the Minister has directed his re-instatement.

Drains—Material for, etc.

69. Every person who shall construct, alter, or repair any sewer or drain shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) The pipes shall be good and sound, and shall be formed of glazed stoneware, concrete, iron, or of other suitable material approved by the Minister.
- (b) Every such sewer or drain shall be of adequate size, and no such sewer or drain shall be used for conveying sewage unless the internal diameter thereof be not less than four inches, and (when directed by the Minister) the drain shall be laid in a bed of concrete, or other equally suitable material, with a proper fall, and with water-tight socketed or other suitable joints.
- (c) Every sewer or drain shall be so constructed as not to pass under any building, except in any case where any other mode of construction is impracticable; and if in any case a sewer or drain shall be so constructed as to pass under any building, such sewer or drain shall be so laid in a direct line for the whole distance beneath such building, and of such depth that there shall be a distance equal at least to a full diameter thereof between the top of such drain at its highest point and the surface of the ground under such building. The drain pipe used in any such case shall be of cast iron, jointed with lead as is usual with water pipes, or of stoneware bedded in and surrounded with good cement concrete at least six inches thick. All drains carried through walls shall have a space of three inches left over the pipe.
- (d) Every sewer or drain which is likely to be damaged or blocked by the roots of trees shall be surrounded by concrete six inches thick, or if in the opinion of the Minister it is necessary, cast-iron sewer and drain pipes shall be substituted for earthenware pipes for such distance as the Minister may direct, or the trees adjacent to the drain or sewer shall be removed for such a distance as the Minister may direct.
- (e) Where drains are in rights-of-way or other open spaces where there is vehicular traffic, and are less than three feet in depth, or in yards where vehicles are kept, are less than two feet in depth, or when they are in any case less than one foot in depth, they shall be surrounded with concrete six inches in thickness, or the surface of the right-of-way, yard, etc., shall be covered with at least six inches of concrete or granolithic pavement.
- (f) Every such drain shall be ventilated in a manner hereinafter provided by these By-laws and Regulations.
- (g) Every inlet to any sewer or drain (not being an inlet provided in pursuance of the By-law and Regulation in that behalf as an opening for the ventilation of such drain) shall be properly trapped.
- (h) Every sewer or drain shall be laid in straight lines, and where changes of direction occur junctions shall be made with "Y" junctions of the required angle, or bend pipes, in such manner as the Minister may previously approve of. Right angle junctions shall not be used.
- (i) All pipes and house-drains shall be laid with true gradients, and the inclination of the same shall be as steep as the circumstances will permit, but shall in no case be less than 1 foot in 40 feet.

- for 4-inch pipes or 1 foot in 60 feet for 6-inch pipes, or shall not be laid with a grade of more than 1 foot in 15 feet unless by special permission of the Minister, and approved provision shall be made for regular and efficient flushing.
- (j) In all cases where the Minister or his officers shall so direct, all pipes shall be supported on piles and timber foundations, or shall be bedded on concrete. Drops or bends in a vertical position shall have a concrete support placed thereunder as directed. The concrete for this purpose shall be of the proportions of one of cement, two of clean sand, and five of stone, broken to 1½ inch gauge, or gravel approved of by such officer.
- (k) Junction pits or manholes shall not be installed except with the special permission of the Minister.
- (l) Whenever there is a danger of the sewage backing up a house drain, all pipes shall be fitted with reflux valves, and such valves shall be of brass or gun-metal.
- (m) All pipes shall be carefully bedded on the barrel on the solid ground, and all joints shall be made with cement mortar, mixed in the proportion of one of cement and two of sand. All joints shall be completely filled with mortar and splayed off on the outside to an angle of 45 degrees. Jointing of the following description shall be carried out as circumstances require, viz.: In dry sand the joints shall be made with cement mortar as described in By-laws and Regulations. After the jointing is done the pipe shall be wiped clean of surplus mortar and left perfectly clean on the inside before another pipe is laid. In water-charged ground the pipes shall be supported, as described in Part (j) of this By-law, on concrete or timber foundations as may be directed. Every precaution shall be taken to prevent the entrance of sand or silt into the pipes. All pipe runs are to be inspected, tested, and approved before the trenches are filled in, and no drain shall be used before being passed by the Minister or his officer.
- (n) All pipes, bends, and other apparatus necessary for any such house-drain shall be submitted to the Minister for his testing, and shall be approved and passed by his Inspector before being used.

The following charges shall be made for testing and branding fittings and pipes:—

Lead Pipe per length of six feet—3in. to 4in., 2d.; 1½in. to 2½in., 1d.

Lead Traps—1½in. to 4in., 1d. each.

Galvanised Wrought Iron Pipe per length of six feet—1½in. to 2in., 1d.; 2½in. to 3in., 2d.

Metal Flush Pipes for W.Cs. and Hoppers, 1d. each.

Springs and Bends, 1d. each.

Cast Iron—6in. Soil Pipes, 3d. per 6ft. length; 4d. per 9ft. length. 6in. Soil Pipes (Specials), 3d. each. 3in. and 4in. Soil Pipes, 2d. per 6ft. lengths; 3d. per 9ft. lengths; 3in. and 4in. Soil Pipes (Specials), 2d. each.

Reflux Traps or Valves, 6d. each.

Gully and P. Traps, Grates and Inspection Shaft Covers, 1d. each.

Silt Traps, 3d. each.

Galvanised Cast-iron Mica Flap Inlets—4in., 2d. each; 2in., 1d. each.

Kitchen Sink and Lavatory Basin, 3d. each.

Flushing Cisterns, including ball valves, 6d. each. Silent Flusher of the press button or lever type, 2s. 6d. each.

Earthenware—Pedestal Pans and Slop Hoppers, 6d. each. Metallic Joints when tested separately, 6d. each. 4in., 6in., and 9in. Stoneware Pipes, Bends, and Junctions, 1d. each.

“P” and “S” Traps, yard gullies, 3d. each when tested at Department’s testing yards. When material is tested at manufacturer’s or merchant’s premises, an additional sum of three shillings (3s.) per diem will be charged as travelling expenses for the testing officer for each day or portion thereof the officer is employed at the premises of the person requiring such tests.

Brass Fittings—Fittings for all wastes, 1d. each. Bib, Stop, and Ball Cocks, 2d. each. Straight Ferrule Unions, Plumbers’ Unions, 2d. each. Straight Connections, Caps, and Linings for Water, 2d. each.

Galvanised Sheet Iron—4in. Vent Pipe, 1d. per length of 6ft. or less; 1½in. to 2in. Pipes, 1d. per length of 3ft. or less; 6in. Offsets and Bends, 2d. each; 2in. and 4in. Offsets, 1d. each; 2in. and 4in. Bends, 1d. each; 6in. Vent Cows, 3d. each; 4in. Vent Cows, 2d. each; 1½in. and 2in. Vent Cows, 1d. each.

Urinals—Fireclay Urinals, including Flush Pipe, 2s. 6d. each.

The fittings and material which require to be approved of but not stamped are as follow:—

Baths, Wash Troughs, etc. (outlet connections must be stamped).

Lead Caps and Tacks or Lugs for Lead Pipe.

Galvanised Wire Strainers for Vent Pipes.

Wrought Iron Bolted Clips for Cast and Sheet Iron Pipes.

Galvanised Clips and Vent Stays.

Valves and Couplings for Cisterns.

All pipes and fittings shall be brought to places indicated by the Minister, and all fees shall be paid before the material is removed after testing.

Fees shall be payable on all material tested, whether rejected or passed.

Any material submitted for re-test shall be clearly marked as being so submitted, and full fees will be charged for each re-test.

100. No person whether entitled to receive water from the Minister or not shall, without the written permission of the Minister, take, carry away, or allow to be taken or carried away such water from his premises, or sell the same to any other person.

105. It shall not be lawful for any person or corporation to use any water whatsoever for street-watering purposes, unless with the written approval of the Minister first obtained.

119. (a) Water and sewerage rates shall be levied in the Metropolitan Water Sewerage District and Armadale Water District, and stormwater rates shall be levied in Metropolitan Stormwater Districts upon the net annual value of each separately assessed piece of rateable land within such districts, at the following rates, viz.:—

Water rates: not exceeding 1s. in the £ per annum.

Sewerage and stormwater rates: not exceeding

1s. 1d. and 5d., respectively, in the £ per annum.

(b) The minimum sum payable in each year as rates within the Metropolitan Water Sewerage District and Armadale Water District, and within Metropolitan Stormwater Districts, on each separately assessed piece of land, shall be such amount as shall be determined by the Minister in each year, not exceeding—

For water rate: 10s. (ten shillings).

For sewerage and stormwater rates: 7s. 6d. (seven shillings and sixpence) and 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) respectively.

(c) In the event of a dispute as to whether or not the land shall be regarded as vacant, the decision of the Minister shall be final in every case.

131. (a) Where water is required for building purposes, an application shall be lodged, in writing, on the prescribed form, and the charges shall be in accordance with the fees set forth in the schedule of prices of water in By-law 132.

(b) All fees and charges, except charges for water consumed in excess of quantity allowed in return for fee, shall be paid in advance. Charges for excess water referred to shall be payable on demand and in accordance with By-laws and Regulations relating to the sale of water by measure.

(c) When applying for a building service the applicant shall produce the plans of the building to be erected for endorsement thereon of fee paid, and also, if called upon, shall produce the specifications and contract.

(d) Charges shall be based on the cost of the building, and where there is no contract the value of the proposed building shall be fixed by the Minister.

(e) No person shall use any water for building purposes from an existing service without first making application for same and paying a building fee.

(f) If any person shall use water in connection with any work, in addition to that mentioned at the time of applying to the Minister for a building supply, without first paying the necessary additional fees, the whole supply may be cut off without prejudice to the Minister's right to proceed for breach of this By-law.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

Regulation No. 113.

The portion of Regulation No. 113 dealing with wheat for shipment is hereby amended as follows, viz:—

1. By repealing Clause No. 7 thereof and enacting the following new clause in lieu of same:—

7. *Handling Charges.*—The handling charges on wheat for shipment will be as follows:—

- (a.) Full service, *i.e.*, receiving and delivering, including stacking where required, Trust giving a receipt for number of bags only, per bag, 2.275d.
- (b.) On each or any additional or special handling service required, such as turning over or sorting bags for such purposes as re-sampling, re-weighing, or otherwise; or re-stacking, trucking, etc., as requested or as necessary, per bag, 1½d.
- (c.) Slinging or working bags on to elevators at railway wagons, where ship loading from wagons, and bags, not stacked, per bag, .750d.
- (d.) Conveying bags from one berth to any other berth, or from one position to any other position where railway wagons not used for the purpose, all on South or all on North side of harbour, per bag, 1½d. If the service herein described does not involve the transferring of bags beyond an adjoining berth, the special charge for the service shall be 1½d. per bag.
- (e.) Loading up and stowing in railway wagons for transfer from one position to another position on the wharves (but not including crane or elevator hire), per bag, 1½d.
- (f.) Weighing and (or) marking of weights on bags, including a list of weights, but not a receipt for weight, and not including handling to and from scale, for each time such service is performed, per bag, ¼d.
- (g.) *Weighing.*—Weighbridge weights, including tare of wagons:
 1. Four-wheeled wagons, per wagon, 1s.
 2. Bogie wagons, per wagon, 1s. 6d.

(These charges include a note of weights, where requested, but not a receipt for weight.)

On rejected wheat or wheat delivered locally and not shipped :

(a.) For each service performed, such as—

1. Handling from railway wagons to stack and *vice versa* each way, per bag, 1½d.
2. Loading up and stowing railway wagons (but not including crane or elevator hire), per bag, 1¾d.
3. Turning over, or sorting, or re-stacking, per bag, 1½d.
4. Handling in railway wagons, where bags not taken out of same, per bag, 1d.

(b.) Weighing and (or) marking, same as (f) above, per bag, ¼d.

Clause 12 is hereby repealed and the following new clause enacted in lieu thereof, viz. :—

12. *Use of elevators and conveyors loading ships.*—In all cases where the gantry loaders on the North Quay are available for use at a ship, and also where one or more of the portable elevators are available for use at a ship, at either the North Quay or any other berth, the ship must use such as are available, and, in the opinion of the Wharf Manager, applicable to her loading, and the Harbour Trust charges to be paid by the shipowner or stevedore for the use of such appliances will be computed at the rate of .818d per bag, passed over gantry loaders or portable conveyors so used, working between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 8 a.m. to 12 noon Saturday in loading vessels; this charge to include the use and rigging of all shoots used both ashore and abroad.

The ship that is first ready to use these appliances, or any of them, shall be deemed to have priority of claim to same, and in the event of any such appliances being, in the opinion of the Wharf Manager, available for use, and not used by a ship, a rate of 5s. per hour shall become chargeable against the shipowner or stevedore as though the said appliances had been used by her.

Where it is necessary in the opinion of the Wharf Manager, or required by the exigencies of the work, to rig or adjust shoots or other gear on board ships in hours other than the ordinary working hours of the Port, the charge laid down herein for the use of these shoots or other gear shall be increased by the additional amount payable to the men engaged on the work as overtime rates of pay.

Loading by Wharf Cranes.—Where a ship loads by means of slings hoisted on board by means of a crane the property of the Commissioners, the conditions governing the hiring of cranes, enacted by the Commissioners from time to time by Regulation, shall apply, and the charges when loading wheat to be paid by the shipowner or stevedore shall be computed at the rate of .701d. per bag so loaded, working between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 8 a.m. to noon Saturday, this charge to include the cost of driver and power.

Loading by Ship's Gear.—Where ship loads by means of slings hoisted on board by her own gear and power a charge will be made against the shipowner or stevedore of .375d. per bag so loaded, to defray a proportion of the cost of handling to ship's slings and slinging.

General.—Should any of the appliances referred to above be retained at a ship and not worked, a rate of 5s. per hour or portion of an hour, shall become chargeable against the shipowner or stevedore for the time during which they are held idle. The right is reserved to the Wharf Manager to remove any appliance from any ship at any time he may consider desirable.

The cost over and above the ordinary cost of day work of all labour and supervision employed by the Trust in connection with the working of or in connection with these appliances, or any of them, or methods of loading, during hours other than the ordinary working hours of the port shall also be paid to the Trust by the shipowner or stevedore, in addition to the charges already stated herein above.
