WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Administrator to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 15339 (Gwambygine Est. Lot 76 should vest in and be held by Messrs. William Ovens, Elliot Onslow Hicks, be held by Messrs. William Ovens, Emot Onslow Fices, and Frederic James Fleay, in trust for the purpose of an Agricultural Hall Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be that the betore-mentioned lesserve shall vest in and be held by Messrs. William Ovens, Elliot Onslow Hicks, and Frederic James Fleay, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

> The Land Act, 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 1970/13. WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Man-

agement, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 17767 for Common near Merredin should be placed under the control of Merredin Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Merredin Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate. and alter by-laws for the control and management of but not more than £20 in the aggregate.
