WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 cf "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Administrator may, by Order in Council, constitute any portion of the State not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name here-Administrator of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the North-ampton Health District.

Mitchell Street, from Stanley Street Easterly to Joel Terrace (length about 7 chains, 6 chains being relaid from Stanley Street), including the lifting of 7 chains of existing 1½-inch diameter galvanised iron water main.

(c.) A 3-inch diameter cast-iron water main along Joel Terrace, from Lot 232, South-Westerly to Gardiner Street (length about 7 chains).

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 16 of 1922.

Between Hotel, Club, Caterers', Tea-room, and Restaur-ant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Goldfields Branch, Applicant, and Spencer Farquhar Cargill Cook, Dennis Ryan, Kathleen May White, Herbert W. Armstrong, and others, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

Hours.--Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work for barmaids and cellarmen, and forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for barmen and yardmen.

2. Spread of Shifts.—Daily spread of shifts shall mean the time which elapses from the time the worker first starts work until the time when he or she finishes work for the day. Weekly spread of shifts shall mean the aggregate number of hours contained in the daily spread of shifts for a week. The weekly spread of shifts shall not exceed sixty-six hours. The longest spread of shifts in any one day shall not be more than twelve hours. There shall not be more than one break in any shift, such break to be not less than three hours, with the exception of one day in the week, either Friday or Saturday, when a ten-hours working day is permis-sible, with two breaks of at least an hour each for meals.

3. Wages.-The minimum rate of wages payable for the respective classes of work comprised in this schedule shall be as under :---

4. Overtime. - Work done by barmaids or cellarmen

after the completion of forty-four hours in any one week, and by all other workers after the completion of forty-eight hours in any one week, or in excess of the rostered hours in any one day, shall be deemed over-time, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and ahalf; provided always, that no employer shall employ any worker, and no worker shall work for any em-ployer, for a longer period of overtime than five hours

6th January;

(2) The Racing Carnival Week in which the Kal-goorlie and Boulder Cups are contested, in any one of which weeks the maximum period of overtime shall be ten hours.

Overtime rates shall be calculated on the amounts specified in Clause 3.

5. Weekly Holiday .-- All workers shall receive one half-day off duty each week, to start at 1 p.m., on any week-day excepting Wednesday.

6. Roster.—A roster of the working hours of all workers shall be exhibited in each establishment in the kitchen or pantry, in such place as it may conveniently be seen; such roster shall set out the hours to be worked by each worker at least one week ahead, and shall be

open to inspection by the Union officials. 7. Weekly Wages.—Wages shall be paid weekly. Not less than twenty-four hours' notice shall be given by either party of intention to terminate service. 8. Meal Hour.—One clear hour in every six shall be

allowed off for each worker for meal time. 9. Payment for Public Holidays.—All work done on

Good Friday, Christmas Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rates.

10. Record Book .- The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages book wherein shall be entered the name, occupation, and in the case of juniors the age at his or her last birthday, the time he or she commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, and the wages paid to each worker each week. Such book shall be entered up from day to day and shall be initialled daily, if correct, by each worker. The employer and each worker shall be severally re-sponsible for the proper posting up of the book. The sponsible for the proper posting up of the book. The book shall be open to inspection on the employer's

premises, during working hours, by the duly authorised representative of the Union. 11. Preference of Employment.—Respondents shall give preference of employment to persons of the European races, and shall also undertake that facilities will be given to the representative of the claimant Union to interview any employees who may not be members of such Union. 12. Meals.-Meals shall be supplied to workers as

follows :- All meals as per menu used in the establishment.

Board and Lodgings .- If board is not provided 13. the worker shall be entitled to twenty shillings per week. If lodging is not provided, he or she shall be entitled to ten shillings and sixpence per week in addition to the wage hereinbefore prescribed. The em-ployer requiring a worker to sleep in shall provide suitable accommodation.

14. Annual Holidays.—After the completion of twelve months' service fourteen days' holiday on full twelve months' service fourteer days' holiday on full pay, together with board and lodging allowance as pro-vided in Clause 13, shall be granted to each worker. Such holiday shall be granted within three months of becoming due, failing which the employer shall pay double time for all work done after that date. Pro-vided that any worker who shall have served one month or over shall be entitled to a proportionate allowance in respect to the time actually served.

15. Uniform.—Employers shall provide, maintain, and pay for the cleaning and laundering of all white coats, cuffs, and collars, or other wearing apparel in the nature of uniform where the same are demanded to be worn.

16. Change Rooms.—Employers shall consider complaints made by the Union's representative with regard to adequacy or otherwise of change rooms. Employers shall make provision for suitable change and rest rooms in all new buildings.

17. Higher Duties.—Employees called upon to perform duties carrying a higher rate of pay than those for which he or she was engaged, and performing such duties for four hours or over, shall be paid the higher rate for the whole week.

18. Area.—This award shall have effect throughout the East Coolgardie Goldfield.

19. Term of Award .-- The currency of this award shall be one year.
