WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th day of September, 1911, the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion

of the Conditional Purchase Lease therein mentioned, was resumed under the provisions of Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the purpose of a Townsite: And whereas it is desirable to limit the area of the proposed Townsite, and portion of the land as described in the schedule to the recited Proclamation, and the Schedule hereto, is no longer required for the purpose: Now therefore I, Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke and cancel that portion of the said recited proclamation relating to the land described in the Schedule hereto to the intent that such land, being the land described in the Schedule to this Proclamation, may revest in the Lessee by whom the Conditional Purchase Lease is held.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to appoint, under the provisions of the above Act, the Conservator of Forests and the Under Secretary for Lands as a Board to control and manage Class "A" Reserves 17519, 7691, and 7692, in the Nelson District, for the purpose of National Parks, and also to approve of the following By-laws in connection with same:—

1. The term "Permission" throughout these By-laws means permission in writing from the Board or its Agent first obtained.

2. Except as provided hereafter, no person shall fell, cut, injure, or destroy any tree, shrub, or plant on these reserves, or cut or remove without permission any dead wood or timber lying on these reserves.

3. No person shall set fire to the bush on these reserves nor light any fire without clearing, or seeing that there is already cleared, a sufficient break to prevent the fire spreading.

4. No person shall post, stick, stamp, or affix in any way any notice or advertisements of any kind on the trees on these reserves without permission.

5. Any person offending against any provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, such sum as may be awarded not exceeding £20.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPAL TRAMWAYS AND
ELECTRIC LIGHTING ACT, 1903, AND THE
TRAMWAYS ACT, 1885.

Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board.

WHEREAS under "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903," and "The Tramways Act of 1885," it is provided that Regulations and By-laws may be made for various matters in connection with the control and management of Tramways constructed under the provisions of such Acts, the Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Board doth hereby make the following Regulations and By-laws:—

1. No person shall travel by or leave any car without tendering the proper toll or fare to the conductor.
2. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor the toll or fare legally demandable.
3. No person shall use or attempt to use any check ticket received from a conductor (whether for cash fare or in exchange for concession tickets) except upon the car whereon the same has been issued to such person by a tramway employee.
4. Each passenger shall, when required, show his ticket (if any) to the conductor or inspector and deliver up the same if demanded, undefaced and legible; in default of which such passenger shall pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by him, whether the same has been already paid or not.
5. No person except a passenger, intending passenger, or member of the staff, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hang on by or to any part of any car.
6. No person shall enter a tram car after being informed by the conductor that the same is full, and no person after such entry shall refuse to leave when requested by the conductor.
7. No person shall enter, mount, or leave or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car in motion.
8. No person (other than a servant of the Board in the execution of his duty) shall travel on the steps of any car, or stand or sit on the roof thereon, or on the rail of the platform of any car or elsewhere thereon except within the interior of the car or the open compartments, and no person shall block the main entrance nor stand on the conductor's or motorman's platform.
9. No person shall obstruct or prevent or attempt to obstruct or prevent a passenger from getting in or out of any car except when in motion.
10. No person shall place personal or other luggage (including workmen's tools) in the interior or open compartments of any car, in such position as to obstruct the space intended for passengers or the passages of the car; nor, without the permission of the conductor first obtained, on the front or motorman's platform, nor on the conductor's platform, nor on the roof of any car; notwithstanding, however, any permission given in respect thereof, the Board shall not be held responsible for any loss of or damage to any luggage or tools so placed or left on any car.
11. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any car or in or against any premises of the Board, and any conductor may prevent the commission thereof by removing the person committing or attempting to commit the same.
12. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car such person may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
13. No person shall expectorate in, upon, or against any car, and no person shall smoke inside the centre closed portion of any car unless such portion of car is marked or placarded as a smoking car, or otherwise wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
14. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car.
15. No passenger or other person while travelling in or upon any car shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, without the written authority of the Board being first obtained.
16. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner in any car or premises belonging to the Board.
17. No person, unless authorised by the Board, shall post or stick any placard or bill within or on any of the tramway property or premises.
18. No person shall tear or damage any lining or blind, or break or mark any window, or remove or deface any number plate or notice, or extinguish or interfere with any lamp of or in any car, or otherwise damage any car or other property belonging to or in the control of the Board. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall, in addition to his liability to the penalty prescribed by these By-laws and Regulations, be liable to pay the amount of damage done.
19. No person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any reason be offensive to passengers, or whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of a conductor of a car soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter or remain in the interior or open compartments of any car, and if found in such position shall leave same upon the fare if previously paid being returned.
20. No person who has an infectious disorder or who may reasonably be supposed to have any such infectious disorder shall enter or remain in any car, and no person shall aid or assist or attempt to have carried any person suffering from such disorder.
21. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or upon any car except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal taken into or upon any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed from the car by the person in charge of such dog or other animal upon the request from the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
22. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms or explosives of any kind.
23. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Board having charge of a car, and the expression "inspector" shall include any officer or servant of the Board for the time being acting as an inspector, and such servants are hereby empowered to demand and take the name and address of any person committing a breach of any of these By-laws or Regulations.
24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Board in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car, building, or tramway of the Board.
25. No person (other than a servant of the Board) shall ring or otherwise interfere with the signal bells of any car.
26. No person shall wilfully impede, hinder, or obstruct or attempt to impede, hinder, or obstruct the progress of any car.
27. No person shall drive any vehicle or ride any animal on any road in any manner so as to wilfully prevent any person from passing him, or by negligence or misbehaviour prevent, hinder, or interrupt the free passage of any tramcar or vehicle.
28. (a.) No person shall alight from or board any tram, except from that side of the tram which is on the left side in which it is proceeding or intending to proceed.
(b.) No person shall interfere with any gate, bar, or other contrivance to prevent the public from alighting or boarding on the wrong side of such tram.
(c.) Any person contravening these Regulations shall be held responsible for any damage incurred thereby, in addition to any penalty prescribed for a breach of these Regulations.

29. Any person offending against any of these By-laws and Regulations and refusing to give his name and address when required by the conductor so to do, or giving a false name and address, may be detained by the conductor pending arrival of a police officer.

30. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these By-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for each offence, without in any way relieving him from any other liability to which he may be subject apart from the Acts under the authority of which these By-laws and Regulations are framed; provided always, that the offending person is not twice punished for the same offence.

31. There shall be placed and kept placed, in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, a printed copy of these By-laws and Regulations.

32. These By-laws and Regulations shall come into force as soon as they have been approved and sanctioned by His Excellency the Administrator and published in the *Government Gazette*.

33. All previous Regulations and By-laws are hereby repealed from the date of publication of these Regulations and By-laws.

IN accordance with the provisions of Section 306 of "The Mining Act, 1904," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal Regulations 90 and 91 under the said Act, and to make the following Regulations in lieu thereof.

Minister for Mines.

90. Unless exemption or partial exemption from labour conditions has been granted by the Minister or Warden, every lease other than a gold mining lease on

which labour conditions are prescribed shall be efficiently worked on every working day after the expiration of thirty days from the date of the posting at the Warden's office of the *Government Gazette* containing notice of the approval thereof.

A lease granted for coal shall be efficiently worked from the like date by not less than one man for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for the first twelve months; by not less than two men for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for the second twelve months, and by not less than three men for every sixty acres, or fraction thereof, for every succeeding year.

Leases coming under the description of (c) or (e) of Regulation 80 shall be worked by not less than one man for every twelve acres, or fraction thereof, from the like date.

Every lease other than gold mining leases and leases granted for coal shall be worked on every working day from the like date by not less than two men for the first twelve months or such longer period not exceeding a further twelve months as may be approved by the Minister on the application of the lessee, and thereafter by not less than one man for every six acres, or fraction thereof; but in no case shall any lease be worked by less than two men.

90a. Unless exemption or partial exemption from labour conditions has been granted by the Minister or Warden, any area of land the subject of an application for a gold mining lease shall be efficiently worked by not less than two men on every working day after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of lodgment of the said application at the Warden's office until the application is granted or refused.

If this regulation is not complied with, it shall be a ground upon which the Governor, in the exercise of his discretion under Section 75 of the Act, may refuse to grant the lease applied for.

90b. On approval of an application for a gold mining lease the said lease shall, unless exemption or partial exemption from labour conditions has been granted by the Minister or Warden, be worked on every working day from the date of approval by not less than two men for the first twelve months and thereafter by not less than one man for every six acres, or fraction thereof; but in no case shall any such lease be worked by less than two men.

91. Any lease which is not continuously and efficiently worked as provided in Regulations 90 or 90b, as the case may be, shall be liable to forfeiture as provided in Sections 97 and 99 and these Regulations, or the lessee may be fined any sum not exceeding five hundred pounds; but it shall not be necessary to comply with the labour conditions affecting a lease during any general exemption or during any general cessation of work caused by floods, rain, or drought, or on any public holiday.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

Award.

1. *Area.*—This award shall operate over the locality comprised within a radius of ten miles from the Kalgoorlie Post Office.

2. *Term.*—This award shall remain in force for a period of three years from its date with a right to apply to amend at the expiration of twelve months from its date.

Slaughtering Section.

3. *Hours.*—The hours of labour for all employees in or in connection with slaughterhouse, other than stockmen, shall not exceed forty-eight hours per week. One day of ten hours, and all other days not to exceed eight hours, provided that in case of emergency a second day of ten hours is permissible, but in such case a slaughterman only shall be employed on such second day in the capacity of a slaughterman.

4. *Starting time.*—In the month of October, 6 a.m.; November, December, January, and February, 5 a.m.; March and April, 6 a.m.; May, June, July, August, and September, 7 a.m. The starting and ceasing time shall mean in the case of men having charge of horses the time of entry and of leaving the stables, and in the case of other employees, at the slaughterhouse.

5. *Meals.* One hour off shall be allowed for each meal.

6. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages payable weekly in cash to each employee shall not be less than—

7. *Yarding Stock.*—All stock shall be yarded by some person other than slaughtermen into the yards where the watering takes place; provided that any employer not having sufficient work to keep his slaughterman or slaughtermen fully employed in slaughtering may employ him or them, but at the same wage, in any other capacity provided for in this award.

8. *Holidays.*—The following days shall be observed as holidays with no deduction of pay for that week, and no work shall be done (except as herein provided) by any em-

ployees:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day, Union Picnic Day, if held on a Wednesday, and Anzac Day. When Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday to be observed as Christmas Day, the day following to be Boxing Day.

9. *Record Book.*—Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept in the shop a record book containing the names of all employees employed by him, the class of work performed, and the number of each kind of beast killed by him, and the wages paid to such employee. Such book shall be open for the inspection of the secretary of the Union or such person as may be appointed to attend to same on any day during working hours.

Shop Section.

10. *Hours.*—The hours of labour for all employees engaged in or about or in connection with the business of a butcher's shop or cutting cart, smallgoods shop or factory, or in the handling of fresh killed or frozen meat shall not exceed forty-eight hours per week, worked as follows:—Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Saturday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Wednesday, 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. The hours of labour to be continuous except for a break of one hour for each meal, but an additional day of ten hours in any week may be worked in any week in which a holiday occurs, except when such holiday occurs on a Monday.

11. In case of an emergency or in cases of breakdown of a refrigerating plant which necessitates handling the meat contained in the chambers attached thereto, overtime is permissible, at the rate of payment time and a-half.

12. *Wages.* The minimum rate of wages payable weekly to shop employees shall not be less than—

13. *Holidays.*—The following holidays shall be observed, with no reduction of pay for that week:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day, Union Picnic Day (if held on a Wednesday), and Anzac Day.

14. *Record Book.*—Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his shop, or at each of them if more than one, a record containing the names of all employees employed by him, the class of work performed, the hours between which the employees have worked, the starting time and ceasing time each day, the wages paid to each employee, and the overtime if any. Such book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the Union or such other person as may be appointed to attend to same on any day during working hours. Such accredited officer may enter any shop at any reasonable hour should he have reasonable grounds to suppose that the provisions of the award are being violated, for the purpose of making inquiries.

General Clauses.

The following clauses shall apply to both sections of the industry:—

15.—*Weekly Hiring.*—The employment of constant hands shall be weekly, and a week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate engagement. Such notice shall be given on pay day or a week's wages paid in lieu thereof.

16.—*Casual Hands.*—A casual hand is a worker employed for less than one week.

17. *Apprentices.*—(i.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(ii.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice to the clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.

(iii.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(iv.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be one to every three or fraction of three fully paid workers in the slaughtering and/or retail butchering, in accordance with whether the employer carries on

either or both of these branches of the Butchering trade. Provided that the fraction of three shall not be less than one.

(v.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed.

(vi.) Apprentices may be taken to learn—

1. Slaughtering.
2. Retail Butchering.
3. Slaughtering and Retail Butchering.

(vii.) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(viii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the clerk of the Court of date of such transfer, and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(ix.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

- (1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (xv.), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed in this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid and shall give notice to the clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
- (3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said clerk of the Court. (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto.)

(x.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

The wages of any apprentice engaged under the terms of this award shall be subject to alteration at such time as the Court may determine. Provided that no such alteration shall be made except when the wages of tradesmen under this award are being reviewed.

(xi.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the clerk of the Court so to do.

(xii.) The clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(xiii.) The examination shall be held in the month of September in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the Union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies ; or failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(xiv.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(xv.) The clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in sub-clause (x.) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(xvi.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this award and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(xvii.) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

18. Under-rate Workers.—A worker, who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed, may be employed at a lesser rate which shall be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the Worker's Union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of the worker's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed, the said secretary and the worker are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the worker may apply in writing to the nearest resident or police magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The worker shall give such secretary two days' notice of his intention to apply to the magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final.

Any worker whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by an employer for such wage for the period of six months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause : Provided always that the employer shall not employ more than one such incompetent worker to every four fully paid workers or fraction of the first four.

19. Carters.—Carters of all classes and tradesmen doing carting may feed and water the horses used at the shop or slaughterhouses or in connection therewith, where no groom is kept, provided that each such carter shall perform the work in rotation, and where only one carter is employed he shall be entitled to each alternate holiday and Sunday off duty.

20. Copy of Award.—A copy of this award shall be posted in some position in each shop, factory, and slaughter-house accessible to all employees.

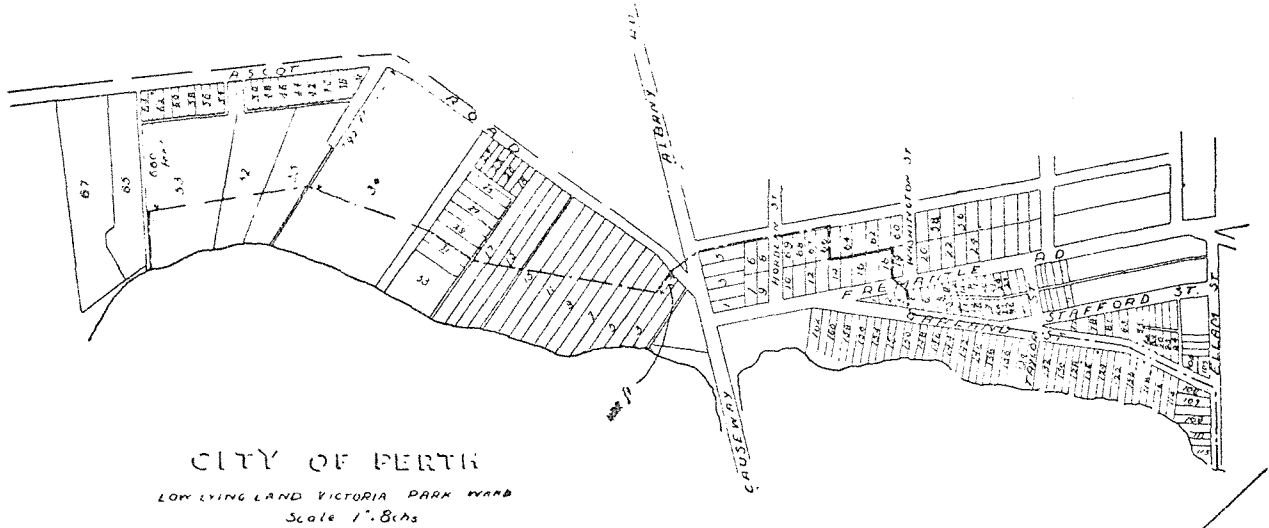
