The Road Districts Act, 1919. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 167 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may place under the control and management of a Road Board any building in the District (being the property of His Majesty's Government of the State), on such terms and conditions as to the Governor may seem fit: And whereas it is desirable to place under the control and management of the Meekatharra Road Board a Travellers' Shelter Shed and accessories, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor,

ing under the authority of either of them.

3. The Board may terminate its control and management at any time by giving to the said Minister or Commissioner, or any agent of either of them, three calendar months' notice of its desire so to do.

4. The Board will be responsible for any damage or deterioration which the said shed or accessories may hereafter sustain or suffer whilst under the control of the Board.
