THE Broome Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Broome Common, doth hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-law for the regulation and management of the Broome Common:—

*Amendment of Clause 4—Prescribed Fees.*

All horses and cattle, including dairy cattle, shall be charged at the rate of:—

First 10 head, 3s. per head per month or part thereof as at present; for any further number in excess of 10 head up to and including 20 head, 2s. per head per month or part thereof; for any further number in excess of 20 head, 1s. per head per month or part thereof.

The reduction of fees as above for numbers in excess of 10 head and 20 head respectively to apply only when the Board is satisfied all the stock are in one ownership or interest; the Board to be final judge as to ownership or interest, as effecting reduction of rate.
