THE DENTAL ACT, 1894.

New Rules and Amended Rules.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Dental Act, 1894," "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," and "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920," the Dental Board may make rules, and may amend, repeal, and add to any such rules: Now, therefore, the Dental Board doth hereby add to and amend the rules made under the said Act by adding new rules to be numbered 25a, 25b, and 30c, and amending Rule 29, Section "d," Rule 30b, and the Fourth Schedule, as follows:—

New Rule.

25a. "Every person applying for registration under Section 3, Subsection (c), of 'The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1920,' and whose articles of apprenticeship were registered by the Board after the first day of February, 1923, shall pass such examination as the Board may, from time to time, by rules, prescribe. Until otherwise determined, such examination shall be in the following subjects:—

First Year:

Anatomy of the Head and Neck.
Chemistry as recognised by the Dental Board.
Metallurgy.

Second Year:

Physiology.
Dental Anatomy.
Dental Mechanics I.

Third Year:

Dental Materia Medica and Therapeutics.
Dental Surgery and Pathology I.
Bacteriology and Pathology.

Fourth Year:

Orthodontia.
Dental Surgery and Pathology II.
Dental Mechanics II.
Practical Dentistry.

(a.) Operative Dentistry to comprise gold amalgam, or other fillings; the candidate may also be asked to perform or answer questions in regard to any other operations in ordinary practice.

(b.) Mechanical Dentistry specimen pieces of the various classes of mechanical work, including crown and bridge work, must be constructed under the supervision of the Examiner."

N.B.—The candidate will be required in the practical examination to use his own material and small instruments; the larger, such as lathe, vulcaniser, engine and chair will be provided by the Board.

Orthodontia. Angle.
Materia Medica and Therapeutics. Buckley.
Dental Surgery and Pathology. Black, Vols. 1 and 2.

Physiology. Bainbridge and Menzies.

The examination to be held twice yearly, viz., in the third week of March and November respectively. Application in writing to be made to the Registrar, and the examination fee paid not later than the last day of the preceding month. The above rules to come into operation on the 2nd day of February, 1923.

New Rule.

25b. "Students must attend seventy-five per cent. of the Lectures recognised by the Dental Board, otherwise they will not be eligible to sit for the examination prescribed in Rule 25 and 25 (a)."

Amendment to Rule 29—Section "d."

29. Section "d":—"or the examination for the Matriculation Certificate of the University of Western Australia in six subjects, with English, another language, Mathematics and Physics as compulsory subjects."

The above amendment to come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1925.

Amendment to Rule 30 (b).

30 (b).—"An apprentice registered prior to the second day of February, 1923, shall be entitled to be examined in the subjects comprising Group one of the Examination prescribed in Rule 25 after the expiry of eighteen months from the registration of his articles, in which case one-third of the examination fee, viz., £2 2s., shall be payable under the first group, and the remaining two-thirds of the examination fee, viz., £4 4s., shall be payable under the second group."

New Rule.

30 (c).—"An apprentice registered on or after the second day of February, 1923, shall be entitled to be examined in the prescribed subjects each year at a fee of two guineas."

Addition to Fourth Schedule.

Fee for every examination under Rule 25a—£2 2s.

By-laws.

WHEREAS by "The Architects' Act, 1921" (hereinafter called "the Act"), the Architects' Board thereby constituted is empowered, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make and prescribe such By-laws as the Board may see meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned; and whereas it is desirable to make such By-laws under the Act: Now, therefore, the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the said Act, by and with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make and prescribe the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

In the construction of these By-laws, Section 2 of the Act shall apply.

Election.

1. The next election of two members in place of two members who shall retire from the Board, as specified in Section 5, Subsection 4, of the Act, shall be held at the Annual Meeting of the Board on the third Monday in the month of July, 1923, and every election thereafter shall be held on the third Monday in the month of July in each and every succeeding year.

Every election to fill any vacancy on the Board caused by the death, resignation, or otherwise, of an elected member as specified in Section 5, Subsection 5, of the Act, shall be held as soon as practicable after such vacancy occurs and within not more than 28 days or less

than 21 days after notice of such vacancy has been advertised, as the Board may direct.

Any member elected or appointed to fill any vacancy caused by death, resignation, or otherwise shall hold office so long only as his predecessor would have done.

The Governor in Council may fill any vacancy occurring by retirement, death, or otherwise of any appointed member.

2. Clauses 2, 3, 4, and 10 in the First Schedule shall apply to the nomination of candidates to fill vacancies caused by annual retirement or otherwise. The notice to nominate shall be in the form given in Schedule "A" to these By-laws, and the nomination paper in the form of Schedule "B" to these By-laws.

3. Clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 of the First Schedule shall apply to voting for and electing members of the Board. The voting paper and directions to vote shall be in the form given in Schedule "C" to these By-laws.

4. All voting papers shall be opened by the Chairman on the day of election and examined by all the members of the Board then present. A majority of votes shall decide.

5. If a sufficient number of candidates be not nominated for election, or elected to any vacancy or vacancies, the Board shall appoint the requisite number of Architects to fill the vacancy or vacancies.

6. The non-receipt of any voting paper by any architect entitled to vote within the time aforesaid, or at all, shall not in any manner invalidate or affect the election.

Meetings.

7. The Second Schedule of the Act shall be read and construed in conjunction with these By-laws.

8. The General Meeting of Architects shall be held on the last Monday in the month of July in each year, at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m., in Perth, at such place as the Board may determine.

9. The Annual Meeting of the Board shall be held at the office of the Board on the third Monday in the month of July, at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m.

10. At the Annual General Meeting the members of the Board then present shall elect one of the members of the Board to be Chairman of the Board for the ensuing year.

11. At the Annual General Meeting any architect then present may bring up any matter for general discussion or for subsequent consideration by the Board, but the Board shall not be bound by any resolution passed by architects at such meeting.

12. Ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held at the office of the Board on the third Monday in every month at the hour of 8 o'clock p.m., or at such other place, date, and time the Board may determine.

13. Special meetings of the Board shall be called by the Registrar whenever requested by the Chairman or any five members.

14. No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done, or authorised by any meeting, shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of such intended rescission or amendment be given in the notices convening the meeting at which such rescission or amendment is proposed, and unless such rescission or amendment be ratified at the next meeting of the Board.

15. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar, and such minutes, when signed by the Chairman, shall be binding and complete evidence, for all purposes and before all Courts, of the proceedings of such meetings.

16. The arrangement for the order of business at each ordinary meeting shall be as follows:—

- (a) Reading the minutes of the previous meeting.
- (b) Confirmation or otherwise of same.
- (c) Registration of Architects.
- (d) Ordinary business, including postponed and adjourned matters.
- (e) Special business.
- (f) Reading of correspondence and reports of Committees.
- (g) Letters and business arising therefrom.
- (h) Production of Bank pass-book.
- (i) Accounts for payment.
- (j) Registrar's statement.
- (k) Notices of motion.
- (l) Any other business which may properly be brought before the Board.

17. The accidental omission to give due notice of a meeting as hereinbefore provided to one or more members of the Board, or the non-receipt thereof, shall in no manner affect or prejudice anything done or agreed to at such meeting.

18. The Board may from time to time appoint, for any special purpose, from its members a Committee of three, including the Chairman who shall preside, and may by resolution at any time dissolve any Committee so appointed.

The Registrar.

19. The Registrar shall—

- (a) hold office subject to these By-laws and during the pleasure of the Board;
- (b) receive such remuneration as the Board may determine, payable from the funds of the Board;
- (c) be in attendance at his office, at such hours and days as the Board from time to time may direct;
- (d) consult the Chairman on any business requiring attention between the various meetings of the Board, and be responsible for the safe custody of the seal and all documents and property belonging to the Board;
- (e) present to the Board a monthly statement showing receipts and expenditure for the past month, and prepare and present to the Board a yearly balance-sheet in the month of January in each year, in accordance with Section 33 of the Act;

- (f) prepare a copy of the Register for publication in the *Gazette* annually;
- (g) receive and be responsible for all moneys payable to the Board, and shall bank the same within 24 hours of the receipt thereof;
- (h) discharge such other duties as the Board may from time to time direct.

Annual Subscription.

20. Subject to Section 18 of this Act, every registered architect shall pay an annual subscription of two guineas to the funds of the Board, payable on the first day in the month of February in every year.

Registration.

21. Every person applying for registration as an Architect shall apply in his own writing, and make and forward to the Registrar an application according to the form of Schedule "D" to these By-laws, and as prescribed in Section 15 of the Act, together with a registration fee of two guineas and one year's subscription, both of which shall be returned to the applicant if the application is refused.

22. Every applicant for registration shall supply, in writing to the Board, all such information and evidence as the Board or the Registrar, as the case may be, may from time to time require; and shall, when and as often as required, attend in person before the Board, and answer verbally or in writing all such questions as may be put to him.

23. Every person whose application for registration has been approved by the Board shall receive a certificate in the form of Schedule "E" to these By-laws.

The Examination.

24. Every person desirous of qualifying for registration under Section 14, Subsections (c) and (d), of the Act, shall pass such examination as the Board may from time to time by rules prescribe.

Until otherwise determined, such examination shall be as hereunder set out.

25. (a) Every candidate shall, at least sixty days before the first day fixed for the examination, give written notice to the Board of his intention to present himself at such examination, and shall at the same time pay the fee stipulated for such examination. He shall also produce and deposit a certificate that he has duly passed the examination for the Junior Certificate of the University of Western Australia, a modern language (other than English), and geometrical drawing being included in the subjects passed at such examination. Candidates who obtained the Junior Certificate prior to the 31st day of January, 1923, will be exempted from a pass in these two special subjects.

(b) Four months before the first day fixed for the examination, two alternative subjects for a design problem will be announced by the Board. Candidates will have the option of selecting either of these subjects. The problem selected by the candidate must be worked up by him at leisure and shall consist of plans, elevations, sections, a sketch perspective, a sheet of details, and full-size mouldings illustrating construction and architectural treatment as for a contract, drawn to a larger scale, and a shaded drawing from the round of some feature in the design. These drawings must be lodged at the office of the Registrar, addressed to the Board, two weeks before the first day fixed for the examination.

(c) Candidates will be required to deposit with the Registrar two weeks before the first day fixed for the examination, any drawings, sketches, or written articles which they have prepared during the period of their studies, together with any evidence they may produce of having attended classes at the University, Technical School, or other educational institutions.

(d) Candidates shall furnish a certificate of proof of having satisfactorily completed a course of study or training in architectural subjects, or such articles or indentures in accordance with any agreement, as specified in Section 14, Subsections (c) and (d), of the Act; such certificates of proof shall be lodged with the Registrar two weeks before the first day fixed for the examination.

26. The subjects of the prescribed examination shall be:—

- (I.) (a) *Shaded ornament*: Drawing from a cast of an architectural feature of a building in any medium.
- (b) *Architectural drawing*: From a given plan and elevation of a building to make to a larger scale a finished, tinted, and shaded drawing in any medium.
- (c) *Angular perspective*: Drawing in pencil line from given plan and elevations of a building.
- (d) *Criticism of design*: To show by sketches and description the architectural faults in a given architectural design.

The foregoing four subjects are required in order to obtain the Art Certificate, Architectural Section, of the University of Western Australia, and any candidate who can produce such Certificate will be exempted from further examination in these subjects.

(II.) *Building construction*: Properties and use of building materials in all trades, including their decay, preservation, quality and strength, and their application in building. Lighting in roofs of buildings for workshops, art galleries, studios, and halls; special foundations and underpinning; shoring and scaffolding; fireproof construction; timber roofs, structural iron and steel work.

(III.) *Mechanics applied to Building Construction*. Stresses and strains, diagrams, graphic methods.

(IV.) *Land surveying* by triangulation, and taking levels.

(V.) *Measurement of work and material* in various trades, and estimates of cost. Specifications.

(VI.) *Professional practice*: Relations between architect and employer, contractor, and clerk of works; laws and by-laws relating to buildings; building contracts; rights of building owners. Valuations, dilapidations, re-instatements.

(VII.) *Sanitary Science and Hygiene*: Sanitary plumbing, drainage, sanitation and sewerage disposal; ventilation; sites and aspects; soils and subsoils; heating and hot-water engineering; water supply; gas and electricity as applied to buildings.

(VIII.) *History of Architecture*: The historic development of the orders and styles or periods of architecture and architectural ornament under the following headings:—

(a) *Classic*: Questions confined to a few leading examples—

- (i) *Grecian*: Principal buildings in Athens.
- (ii) *Roman*: Pantheon, Coliseum, Theatre of Marcellus, Basilica of Maxentius.
- (iii) *Byzantine and Romanesque*.

(b) *Mediæval*: Questions to cover the following periods:—

- (i) *English*: From 1066 to end of 16th Century.
- (ii) *French*: Questions on one or more of following examples: Cathedrals of Caen, Amiens, Rheims, Chartres, Rouen, Notre Dame in Paris.

(Answers to be illustrated by sketches.)

(c) *Renaissance*: Questions to cover the following periods:—

- (i) *English*: From 1500 to 1800.
- (ii) *French*: From 1461 to 1900.
- (iii) *Italian*: Buildings in Venice, Florence, Genoa, Vicenza, from 15th to 18th Century.

(Answers to be illustrated by sketches.)

(IX.) *Architectural Design*: A simple problem covering either a small subject or a feature of a larger one. The problem to be announced only in the examination room, and to be worked out there under supervision. On the same day, candidates will be required to draw enlarged details of this design.

(X.) *Oral*: Candidates will be examined orally in their preliminary studies and answers to examination papers.

27. The Board by the votes of two-thirds of such members as are present and voting at a meeting of the Board specially convened with notice of this object, may add to, take from, or alter above-mentioned details of examination.

28. The examination shall be conducted by examiners selected from time to time by the Committee of Architectural Education and approved by the Board. The Committee shall make all arrangements as to time and place for holding the examination.

29. Any candidate who has failed to pass the examination to the satisfaction of the Committee of Architectural Education may present himself again at any subsequent examination; save that the Committee may, in its discretion (but subject to an appeal to the Board), refuse to allow such person so to present himself. If, after payment of his fee, a candidate withdraws his name, or fails to present himself for examination, no part of the fee shall be returned to him; but the Committee may allow such fee to apply to the examination at which such candidate presents himself.

30. Any candidate who has failed to pass in some portion of an examination may present himself again for those subjects in which he has failed at the next following examination without payment of fee; should he again fail, he may present himself at the next again following examination upon payment of half fee, and should he again fail, he must then take the whole of the subjects of the examination and pay the full prescribed fee.

31. The examiners shall forthwith transmit the result of each examination to the Committee of Architectural Education, which shall thereupon forthwith transmit its report to the Board; and, upon the adoption by the Board of the report of the Committee, a Certificate in the form of Schedule "F" to these By-laws to the effect that he has passed such examination shall, unless withheld for any cause deemed reasonable by the Board, be issued to every person who has passed such examination to the satisfaction of the said Committee. Such certificate shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board, one member of the Committee, and countersigned by the Registrar. Upon issue of such certificate, the successful candidate shall, after payment of registration fee and one year's subscription, be granted a Certificate of Registration in the form of Schedule "E" to these By-laws.

32. The decision of the Board as to the result of an examination shall be final.

33. The fee to be paid by the candidate for entry to an examination shall be ten guineas.

34. Only unsuccessful candidates may, if they so desire, be informed of the number of marks they have obtained in each subject.

35. The examination shall be held in the month of June in each year on days fixed by the Board on a recommendation from the Committee of Architectural Education.

36. The presiding officer shall have discretion to expel any candidate from the examination room for fraudulent practice, and shall forthwith report the occurrence in writing to the Committee.

37. The Committee of Architectural Education may make any arrangement it may deem suitable for delegating the holding of a portion of the examination to the University and the Technical School after having received the approval of the Board to such arrangement.

38. Four members, inclusive of the Chairman of the Board, shall constitute a quorum of the Committee of Architectural Education.

39. All correspondence connected with the Committee of Architectural Education shall be conducted by the Chairman of the Board, or the Registrar.

40. All fees paid to examiners shall be fixed by the Board upon recommendation from the Committee of Architectural Education.

41. All fees received from candidates in respect of examinations shall be paid to the Board, which shall keep them in a special fund for the payment of examiners and expenses incidental to the operations of the Committee of Architectural Education. Any necessary expenditure shall be advanced out of the funds of the Board if there is not sufficient in the special fund at the time the expenditure has to be incurred.

42. The Committee of Architectural Education shall be appointed annually in the month of August.

Miscellaneous.

43. During the month of January in each year every registered architect shall file with the Registrar a memorandum under his hand setting out any change in his address.

44. The seal adopted as the common seal of the Board shall be kept in the custody of the Registrar and be deposited in the office of the Board.

45. The seal shall be affixed by the Registrar in the presence of the Chairman of the Board to every Certificate of Registration and to any writing when authorised by a resolution of the Board, and not otherwise.

46. The Registrar shall annually in the month of January publish in the Government Gazette a list of all architects whose names are then entitled to be on the Register.
