THE GOVERNMENT TRAMWAYS ACT, 1912.

THE Commissioner of Railways, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," does hereby make the following By-laws to come into operation on the 1st day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and all By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:-

BY-LAWS.

1.—By-laws extend to all Premises and Vehicles.

These By-laws shall extend to all premises used for Tramway purposes, and to all engines, motors, cars, and vehicles used in running thereon; and the word "tramear" shall include every such car or vehicle.

2.—Passengers to pay Fares on Demand.

Every passenger, not being the holder of a pass, shall on demand by the Conductor, or any employee, pay the fare legally demandable for the journey. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

3.—Travelling without paying Fare.

Any person, not being the holder of a pass, who sha'll travel by and leave any tramear without first having paid his fare to the Conductor, or an employee, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

4.—Tickets to be shown on demand.

Every passenger on paying his fare will be furnished with a ticket and shall show his pass or ticket, when also, on demand of any such employee, either deliver up his pass or ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by the passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding. Two pounds to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

E.—Sale, Purchase, and use of Tickets.

Cash fare tickets are the property of the Commissioner, and are not transferable. Any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner who shall sell, or attempt to sell any pass or ticket, or shall use or attempt to use a transferred pass or ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6.—Defaced Tickets not accepted.

No ticket that is defaced or illegible will be accepted, and its holder will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and if he refuses to pay the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7.—Availability of Tickets.

Tickets are (unless otherwise stated thereon) available only by the tramear and for the journey on which they are issued, and any person who uses or attempts to use any ticket in contravention of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

8.—Smoking in unauthorised places.

No person shall smoke in any waiting-room or in or upon any tramear or compartment or platform thereof not set apart for the purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed by any employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

9.—Conveyance of Dogs, etc.

No person shall take into or have in his charge, in any tramcar, any bird, dog, or other animal which in the opinion of the Conductor or any employee, will cause inconvenience or be offensive to any passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

10.—Loaded Firearms not to be carried.

No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioner, take or place into or upon, or discharge from or upon any tramear any loaded firearm. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11.—Passengers' Luggage, Parcels, etc.

No person, unless authorised by the regulations of the Commissioner, shall take luggage, other than small parcels which can be carried in the hand, and which, in the opinion of the Conductor or any employee, will not cause inconvenience, or be offensive to passengers, into or upon any tramear. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

12.—Persons Intoxicated or committing a Nuisance.

No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in any tramear or be upon premises of the Commissioner, and no person shall in or upon any such tramear or premises wilfully interiere with the comfort of any person, or commit any nuisance, or gamble, or write or use any insulting, indecent, obscene, or blasphemous words. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from such transcar or premises, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13.—Injuring Tramway Property.

No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining, shutter, or blind, or break or deface any window, or remove or injure any number, plate, notice, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of, or in, any tramcar, or waiting room, or otherwise damage any fittings, tramear, or other property of the Commissioner.
Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14.—Advertisements on Tramway Property.

No person, unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner, shall post, stick, paint, write, or distribute, or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, written or distributed any placard, bill, or advertisement, or other matter within or upon any tramear, post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building, or other property or premises of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

-Persons with Infectious or Contagious Diseases.

The Commissioner may refuse to carry any person who s any infectious or contagious disease. No person has any infectious or contagious disease. who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the Commissioner, resort to or come upon any premises of the Commissioner, or travel, or attempt to travel, on any tramcar. No person who has charge of any person who has any such disease shall, without the like authority, aid or assist the person having any such disease to travel, or attempt to travel on the tramway. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from any such premises or carriage by any employee.

16.—Persons Offensive to Passengers.

No person whose dress or person might soil the dress of any passenger or the fittings of any tramear, or whose presence would, in the opinion of the Conductor or any employee, be, for any sufficient reason, offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any tramear; and any such person found in or upon any tramear who refuses, at the request of any employee, to leave the same, may be removed therefrom, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

17.—Persons entering or leaving Tramcars.

No person, except an employee or a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount upon any tramear, and any person holding or hanging by any part of a tramear, or riding upon the roof or other parties of a tramear, not intended for the conveyages. portion of a tramear not intended for the conveyance of passengers, or getting into or upon or quitting any tramear whilst in motion, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

18 .- Male persons not to enter Ladies' Waiting Rooms.

No male person shall enter any waiting-room or tramcar set apart for the accommodation of females; and any such person who shall enter such room or tramear or remain therein after being warned to leave the same, may be removed therefrom by any employee and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

19.—Lost Property.

Any person who finds any lost property in any waitingroom, or in or upon any tramcar, shall immediately hand over the same to the Officer in charge of the Lost Property Office, or to the Conductor in charge of the tram-Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

The following charges shall be collected in connection with lost property left by passengers in tram cars:

For each umbrella, parasol, walking stick, book, gloves, small package or other article held by the Officer in charge of the Lost Property for a period not exceeding two days

3d. After two days and not exceeding four days
After four days 4d. 20.—Interference with Passengers entering or alighting. Any person who shall wilfully prevent a passenger from getting in or out of any tranear, except when it is in motion, or obstruct any passenger in such ingress or egress, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

21.—Entering a full Tramcar.

Any person entering a tramcar after being informed by any employee that the same is full, or, having entered, refusing to leave at the request of such employee, may be removed from such transcar by any employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

22.—Position of Passengers when standing to be regulated by Conductor.

Any person standing in the aisle or on the platform of any tramear, and refusing to move to another posi-tion in the tramear indicated by the Conductor, when requested by the Conductor so to do, may be removed from such tramear by any employee of the Commissioner, and whether removed or not shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

23.—Communication between Passengers and Employees.

No person shall make use of the means of communication provided between the conductor and motorman without reasonable cause. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

24.—Passengers not to place Feet on Seats.

No passenger shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any waiting-room or car. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

25.—Expectorating on Premises or Trancars.

No person shall expectorate upon the floor or any other part of any transar, waiting-room, or platform.

Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

26.—Standing when Seat is Available.

No person other than an employee shall stand on any No person other than an employee shall stand on any platform or other part of a car when a seat is available; and any such person who continues to so stand after being requested by any employee to be seated, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

27.—Sales on Tramway Premises.

No person, unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner, shall sell or attempt to sell any article on any Tramway premises. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

28.—Refusing to leave Waiting Room when required.
Any person, not being an intending passenger, who

Any person, not being an intending passenger, who does not leave any waiting room when required so to do by any employee or police officer, may be removed therefrom by any such employee or police officer, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

29.—Fare Concession Certificates.

Any person who shall tender any certificate containing erroneous or misleading information and thereby obtain or attempt to obtain tickets for the purpose of enabling him to travel at concession rates, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

30.—Obstructing Progress of Tramear.

No person shall make use of any tramcar for the purpose of drawing any bicycle, tricycle, cart, or other vehicle. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two rounds.
